the following Scheme for constituting a new parish to be taken out of the parishes of Wyke Regis; Saint Paul, Weymouth; Radipole and Chickerell all in the diocese of Salisbury.

"SCHEME.

"Whereas we, the Church Commissioners, are satisfied that the spiritual interests of the area defined in the subjoined Schedule and delineated on the map hereto annexed would be best served by constituting

it a new parish:

"And whereas we are satisfied that a suitable

endowment therefor will be provided:

"And whereas there is within the said area a consecrated church known as Saint Edmund of Canterbury, Weymouth, which has been approved by us, the said Church Commissioners, as suitable to be the parish church of the new parish and of which the patronage belongs to the incumbent for the time being of the benefice of Wyke Regis:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend William, Bishop of Salisbury (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and affixed his episcopal seal to this Scheme), we, the said Church Commis-sioners, do humbly recommend and propose as follows, that is to say:—

"1. Constitution:

"(a) As from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council confirming this Scheme, the area defined in the subjoined Schedule and delineated on the map hereto annexed shall be a new parish.

"(b) The church of Saint Edmund of Canterbury, Weymouth aforesaid, shall be the parish church of the parish.

"(c) The name of the parish shall be 'The Parish of Saint Edmund, Weymouth'.

"2. Archdeaconry and Rural Deanery.
"The parish shall be in the Archdeaconry of Sherborne and in the rural deanery of Weymouth.

"5. Patronage. Upon the disunion taking effect

The rights of presentation to the benefices of Worstead and Dilham shall be vested in the persons or bodies (or their successors in title) in whom the rights of presentation to those benefices were respectively vested immediately before the union of the said benefices."

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Supplementary Scheme which we have prepared with the consents of the Right Reverend Michael, Bishop of Saint Albans, and of the Reverend Henry John, being the incumbent for the time being of the benefice of Kempston (in

testimony whereof they have signed the Scheme), for varying an Order of His late Majesty King George the Sixth in Council (hereinafter called 'the Original Order') dated the 25th day of April, 1941, and published in the London Gazette on the 29th day of the same month authorising the taking down and the sale of the site and materials of the church (hereinafter called 'the said church') of Saint John situate in the parish of Kempston and in the diocese of Saint Albans. of Saint Albans.

"SUPPLEMENTARY SCHEME.

"As from the date of publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme so much of the Original Order as provides for the taking down and the sale of the site and materials of the said church and for the consistency of the pat proceeds arising therefrom shall application of the net proceeds arising therefrom shall cease to have effect and the following provisions shall be substituted therefor, that is to say:—

"1.—(1) The said church shall be appropriated to use as a warehouse or repository for commercial

use as a warehouse or repository for commercial storage purposes.

"(3) The said parochial church council shall not effect, or permit to be effected, any alterations in or additions to the fabric of the said church except with the consent of the Board and in accordance with and subject to lawful authority.

"(4) The said parochial church council shall pay or procure the payment of the whole cost of the repair and maintenance and insurance of the said church and all other expenses in connection with the provisions of this Scheme, and shall reimburse to the Board any expenditure which the Board as legal owners of the church may incur pursuant to any statutory requirement.

"(5) The Board shall not dispose of the freehold of the said church except under the authority of a Supplementary Scheme prepared by us in pursuance of the said Union of Benefices Measures and affirmed by Order of Your Majesty in Council.

The net income accruing from any letting of the said church in accordance with the preceding provisions of this Scheme shall, after payment of all expenses attendant on the said provisions, be held and applied by the said parochial church council as a fund for the improvement and maintenance of the church of the Transfiguration, Kempston."

following Scheme which we have prepared with the consent of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Geoffrey, Archbishop of Canterbury, acting in the vacancy of the See of Peterborough (in witness whereof he has signed the Scheme), for effecting the union of the benefice of Wittering and the benefice of Thornhaugh with Wansford both situate in the diocese of Peterborough.

" SCHEME.

- "1. Union of Benefices. The benefice of Wittering and the benefice of Thornhaugh with Wansford shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Wittering with Thornhaugh and Wansford', but the parishes of the said benefices shall continue in all respects distinct.
- "2. Taking effect of union. Upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette the union scheme is published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the Reverend Frank Houghtby if he is then incumbent of the said benefices of Wittering and Thornhaugh with Wansford shall with his consent (testified by his signature hereto), be the first incumbent of the united benefice and his admission thereto shall be without any form of fee of or for presentation or nomination and he shall not be required to pay any fees in respect of his collation, institution, licence or induction to the united benefice beyond such fees as he would have been liable to pay if his admission to the united benefice had been an admission solely to that one of the two benefices for the holding of which in plurality with the other a Dispensation was heretofore granted
- "3. Parsonage House. Upon the union taking effect the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Wittering shall be the house of residence of the incumbent of the united benefice.
- " 4. Patronage. In every series of three successive turns of presentation or nomination to be made to the united benefice after the union has taken effect the patron of the benefice of Wittering shall have the first and second turns and the patron of the benefice of Thornhaugh with Wansford shall have the third turn.
