

imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the parish of All Saints, Branksome Park, from the parish of Saint Peter, Parkstone, meets the sea and continuing thence first northwards and then westwards along the last mentioned boundary to the point where it meets Canford Cliffs Road and continuing thence southeastwards along the eastern side of the last mentioned road to a point opposite the middle of the eastern end of Lilliput Road and continuing thence westwards to and along the middle of the last mentioned road for a distance of 28 chains (approximately) to a point opposite the northern end of the ditch or dyke which runs southwards along the centre of Luscombe Valley to the sea and continuing thence generally southwards to and along the last mentioned ditch or dyke to its end and in a straight line in continuation thereof, thereby crossing Shore Road to a point on the boundary which divides the parish of Wareham from the parish of Saint Peter, Parkstone."

And whereas the provisions of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme, have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Salisbury.

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 17th day of February, 1956, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, and the Diocesan Stipends Funds Measure, 1953, now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which we have prepared with the consent of the Right Reverend Roger, Bishop of Wakefield (in witness whereof he has signed the Scheme), for effecting the union of the benefice of Huddersfield and the benefice of Saint Paul, Huddersfield, both situate in the diocese of Wakefield.

"SCHEME.

"1. *Union of Benefices.* The benefice of Huddersfield and the benefice of Saint Paul, Huddersfield, shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Saint Peter and Saint Paul, Huddersfield', and the parishes of the said benefices shall also be united into one parish for ecclesiastical purposes.

"2. *Taking effect of union.* Upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the Reverend Canon Forbes Trevor Horan, if he is then incumbent of the said benefice of Huddersfield, shall, with his consent (testified by his signature hereto), be the first incumbent of the united benefice of Saint Peter and Saint Paul, Huddersfield.

"3. *Parish Church.* The parish church of the parish of Huddersfield shall be the parish church of the united parish of Saint Peter and Saint Paul, Huddersfield, and the Table of Fees for the said parish of Huddersfield shall, until revised or altered by proper authority, be the Table of Fees for the said united parish.

"4. *Registers.* The marriage registers current at the church of Saint Paul, Huddersfield, shall be dealt with in accordance with section 62 of the Marriage Act, 1949, and the register books (if any) of baptisms and burials and other the records and muniments deposited in the said church shall be transferred to

the parish church of the united parish of Saint Peter and Saint Paul, Huddersfield.

"5. *Parsonage House.* Upon the union taking effect the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Huddersfield shall be the house of residence of the incumbent of the united benefice of Saint Peter and Saint Paul, Huddersfield.

"6. *Patronage.* After the union has taken effect the right of presentation to the united benefice of Saint Peter and Saint Paul, Huddersfield, shall belong wholly to the patrons of the benefice of Huddersfield.

"7. *Diversion of Endowment Income.* With effect from the date upon which the union shall take effect a part of the endowment income of the united benefice of Saint Peter and Saint Paul, Huddersfield, namely an annual sum of £288 10s. 0d. now payable by us in respect of the benefice of Saint Paul, Huddersfield, shall be diverted and shall be held by us for the benefit of the diocesan stipends fund of the diocese of Wakefield."

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 17th day of February, 1956, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, have prepared and humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for constituting a new parish to be taken out of the parishes of Hadleigh and Saint Margaret, Leigh-on-Sea, and of the district of Saint James, Leigh-on-Sea, in the diocese of Chelmsford.

"SCHEME.

"Whereas we, the Church Commissioners, are satisfied that the spiritual interests of the area defined in the subjoined Schedule and delineated on the map hereto annexed would be best served by constituting it a new parish:

"And whereas we are satisfied that a suitable endowment therefor will be provided:

"And whereas we have not approved any consecrated church within the area as suitable to be the parish church of the new parish:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Falkner, Bishop of Chelmsford (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and affixed his episcopal seal to this Scheme), we, the said Church Commissioners, do humbly recommend and propose as follows, that is to say:—

"1. *Constitution:*

"(a) As from the date of the licence thereto of a Minister the area defined in the subjoined Schedule and delineated on the map hereto annexed shall be a separate district for spiritual purposes.

"(b) As from the date of the consecration of a church within the area approved by us, the said Church Commissioners, as suitable to be a parish church, or if the church is consecrated before such approval, the date of the approval, the said area shall become a new parish.

"(c) The name of the district (or parish as the case may be) shall be 'The District (or Parish) of Saint Barnabas, Hadleigh'.

"2. *Archdeaconry and Rural Deanery:*

"The parish shall be in the Archdeaconry of Southend and in the rural deanery of Canewdon and Southend.

"THE SCHEDULE.

"The area comprising:—

"All those contiguous parts (coloured pink on the map annexed hereto) of the parishes of Hadleigh and Saint Margaret, Leigh-on-Sea, and of the district of
