Whereas by section six of an Act passed in the first year of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Sixth intituled "The Regency Act 1937" George the Sixth initialed "The Regency Act 1937" it is amongst other things enacted that in the event of Our absence or intended absence from Our United Kingdom We may in order to prevent delay or difficulty in the despatch of public business by Letters Patent under the Great Seal delegate for the period of that absence to Counsellors of State such of Our Royal functions as may be specified in the Letters Patent but subject to the exceptions provided in the Patent but subject to the exceptions provided in the

And whereas it is Our intention to be absent from Our United Kingdom for a short period from the tenth day of March instant

And whereas the persons to whom Royal functions may by virtue of the said section as amended by an Act passed in the seventh year of His late Majesty's Reign intituled "The Regency Act 1943" and by an Act passed in the second year of Our Reign intituled "The Regency Act 1953" now be delegated by Us as Counsellors of State are Our Most dearly beloved Husband, and Most faithful Counsellor Philip Duke of Edinburgh Our Most

Know ye that We do hereby by virtue of the provisions of the said Acts except from among the number of Counsellors of State during the period of Our absence Our Husband Philip Duke of Edinburgh and delegate for that period to the following Counsellors of State that is to say to Queen Elizabeth The Queen Mother Princess Margaret The Duke of Gloucester The Princess Royal and The Earl of Harewood the Royal functions hereinafter specified to be exercised jointly by not less than two of their number subject to the condition that if We signify or it appears to them

by not less than two of their number subject to the condition that if We signify or it appears to them that they should not act in any matter or for any that they should not act in any maîter or for any purpose without Our previous special approval they shall not act in that matter or for that purpose without that approval and accordingly We do by these Presents delegate to the said Counsellors of State or any two or more of them full power and authority during the period of Our said absence to summon and hold on Our behalf Our Privy Council and to signify thereat Our approval of anything for which Our approval in Council is required and further to approve and sign on Our behalf commissions for signifying the Royal Assent to Acts of Parliament except an Act touching any of the matters for which provision is made in the of the matters for which provision is made in the Act of Settlement or touching Our Royal Style and Titles and to approve and sign on Our behalf any proclamation warrant fiat submission or other document requiring Our approval or Signature which relates to the affairs of Our United Kingdom or to the affairs of any of Our Colonies or any Territories under Our protection or in which We have jurisdiction in cases where Our Government in the United Kingdom is responsible for the foreign affairs of such Colonies or Territories and to do on Our behalf anything required to be done in relation to any such proclamation warrant fiat submission or other document and further to do on Our behalf
