TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 16th March, 1956, at 1 p.m. for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the National Loans Act, 1939, to the amount of £240,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5 000 £10 000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000 or £100,000. They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 19th March. 1956, to Saturday,

the 24th March, 1956, inclusive, and will be due 91 days after date.
3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank

of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000 and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates. different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. Notification will be sent by post on the same day as Tenders are received, to the persons whose Tenders are accepted in whole or in part, and payment in full of the amounts due in respect of such accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. (Saturday, 11.30 a.m.) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

The Import Duties (Drawback) (No. 2) Order,
The Import Duties from £2 1s. 0d. to £3 15s. 0d. 1956, which increases from £2 1s. 0d. to £3 15s. 0d. per ton, the rate of drawback allowable in respect of Customs duty paid on imported unrefined wood tar used in the manufacture of refined wood tar which is exported or shipped as stores.

The Order also reduces, from 1_0^2 tons to $1_1^{1_0}$ tons, the quantity of imported unrefined wood tar to be taken into account in calculating the amount of drawback payable in respect of each ton of the exported refined wood tar.

The Order comes into operation on the 12th March, 1956, and has been published as Statutory Instruments 1956, No. 306.
