At the Court at *Buckingham Palace*, the 1st day of June, 1956.

PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 17th day of May, 1956, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“We, the Church Commissioners, in pursuance of the Church Patronage Act, 1870, and of the Acts therein mentioned, have prepared the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the interest hereinafter mentioned in the ownership of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the churches and cure (hereinafter called ‘the said benefice’) of Denton with Wootton in the County of Kent and in the diocese of Canterbury.

“SCHEME.

“Whereas we are satisfied that Henry Robert Yates of East Hill Hotel, East Hill, Oxted in the County of Surrey, Esquire, is entitled to exercise the alternate right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice:

“And whereas the said Henry Robert Yates desires to transfer his said interest in the advowson of the said benefice to the Archbishop of Canterbury for the time being and is consenting to this Scheme (in testimony whereof he has executed the same):

“And whereas we are satisfied that the transfer will tend to make better provision for the cure of souls:

“Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Geoffrey Francis, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury (in testimony whereof he has executed this Scheme), we, the said Church Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the said interest of the said Henry Robert Yates in the ownership of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice shall be transferred to the said Geoffrey Francis, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, and his successors in the same Archbishopric and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the Archbishop of Canterbury for the time being.”

And Whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Canterbury.

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 19th day of April, 1956, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

“We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, the Diocesan Stipends Funds Measure, 1953, and the Church Patronage Act, 1870, and the Acts mentioned therein, now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which we have prepared with the consent of the Right Reverend Harold, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich (in witness whereof he has signed the Scheme), for effecting the union of the benefice of Holbrook and the benefice of Stutton, both situate in the diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich.

“SCHEME.

“Whereas the right of patronage of and presentation to the benefice of Stutton is now vested in Gwendolen Isabel St. John of Dovehouse Piece, Stutton, Ipswich, in the County of Suffolk, Femme Sole.

“And whereas the right of patronage of and presentation to the benefice of Holbrook is now vested in the Reverend William Leonard Bertram Caley, Mervyn Gurney Talbot Rice, Esquire, John Foster Beaver, Esquire, the Reverend Francis John Taylor, and the Reverend Cyril William Johnston Bowles, hereinafter referred to as ‘the trustees of the Church Patronage Society’:

“And whereas the said Gwendolen Isabel St. John and the trustees of the Church Patronage Society have expressed their desire that upon the taking effect of any union of the said benefices of Stutton and Holbrook their rights as aforesaid shall be transferred to and become vested in the Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich for the time being:

“And whereas we are satisfied that the transfers of patronage recommended in clause 3 hereof will tend to make better provision for the cure of souls:

“Now, therefore, we do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

“1. *Union of Benefices.* The benefice of Holbrook and the benefice of Stutton shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of ‘The United Benefice of
