#### WAGES COUNCILS ACTS, 1945 TO 1948.

PIN, HOOK AND EYE, AND SNAP FASTENER  
WAGES COUNCIL (GREAT BRITAIN).

The Pin, Hook and Eye, and Snap Fastener Wages Council (Great Britain) hereby gives notice of its intention to submit to the Minister of Labour and National Service proposals for (1) increasing the statutory minimum remuneration set out in the Pin, Hook and Eye, and Snap Fastener Wages Council (Great Britain) Wages Regulation Order, 1952 (Order O.(47)), as amended by the Pin, Hook and Eye, and Snap Fastener Wages Council (Great Britain) Wages Regulation (Amendment) Order, 1955 (Order O.(54)) and (2) the revocation of Order O.(54).

Particulars of the proposals may be obtained on application to the Secretary of the Wages Council at the address given below.

The Wages Council will consider any written representation with respect to the above-mentioned proposals which may be sent to it within fourteen days from 10th July, 1956. The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of H.M. Treasury, viz.:—

#### REGULATIONS FOR THE RECRUITMENT OF PLANS ASSISTANTS IN H.M. LAND REGISTRY.

##### 1. Age.

Candidates must be at least 16 and under 18 years of age on the governing date. BUT candidates who have served in any established post to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners, or who have served on established conditions except for sick leave and pension in a post to which such a certificate would normally apply, may deduct from their actual age any time not exceeding two years which they may have spent in such service before the governing date, provided that the maximum of two years may be extended by any period of compulsory service in H.M. Forces under the National Service Acts.

For an examination held in the first six months of any year the governing date for age will be the 1st March in that year; for an examination held in the last six months of any year it will be the 1st September in that year.

##### 2. Sex.

Both boys and girls are eligible.

##### 3. Nationality.

Candidates must be British subjects. They must also satisfy one of the following conditions:—

(a) If natural-born British subjects, they must either

(i) have at least one parent who is or was at death a British subject; or

(ii) have resided in Her Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(b) If naturalised British subjects, they must have resided in Her Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(c) If not qualified under (a) or (b) of this paragraph, they must satisfy the Commissioners that they are so closely connected with Her Majesty's dominions either by ancestry, upbringing or residence, or by reason of national service, that an exception may properly be made in their favour.

##### 4. Health and Character.

Successful candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners as to their health and character.

##### 5. Examination.

The subjects of examination and the marks they will carry are as follows:—

(1) English	...	...	...	...	200
(2) Arithmetic	...	...	...	...	100

Candidates will be arranged in order of merit according to their total mark in the examination as a whole. Even if there are unfilled vacancies, no candidate will be appointed who does not reach a standard which satisfies the Civil Service Commissioners.

##### 6. Candidates trained as Teachers.

Candidates who have been trained as teachers elsewhere than in England or Wales and upon whose training public money has been spent, cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate central education authority (e.g., the Scottish Education Department, the Ministry of Education for Northern Ireland) has been notified to the Commissioners.

##### 7. Fee.

An application fee of 7s. 6d. is payable by all candidates. This must be sent with the application form, and is not returnable in any circumstances. A further fee of 12s. 6d., being the balance of the prescribed fee of £1, must be paid by each candidate on admission to the examination.

The Civil Service Commissioners further give notice that an Open Competition will be held under the above Regulations on 20th and 21st November, 1956.

Applications on the prescribed form for admission to the Competition should be received by the Secretary of the Civil Service Commission on or before 13th September, 1956. Application forms may be obtained from the Secretary at once.

##### TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT, 1947.
