

Cray Road and thence generally southwards along the middle of the said road and along the middle of Orpington Road to the boundary which divides the parish of Chislehurst from the parish of Saint Francis, Petts Wood.

"(b) All that part (coloured green on the said map) of the parish of Saint Paul's Cray which lies to the west of a continuous imaginary straight line which commences at a point on the boundary which divides the parish of Saint Paul's Cray from the parish of Fooks Cray in the middle of the Sidcup By-Pass Road opposite the northern end of Sevenoaks Way and proceeds southwards along Sevenoaks Way and Sevenoaks Road to the boundary which divides the parish of Saint Paul's Cray from the parish of Saint Mary Cray.

"(c) All that part (coloured purple on the said map) of the parish of Saint Mary Cray which lies to the north and west of an imaginary line which commences at a point on the boundary which divides the parish of Saint Mary Cray from the parish of Saint Paul's Cray in the middle of Sevenoaks Road and proceeds southwards to the centre of the bridge which carries the railway line of British Railways (Southern Region) over Sevenoaks Road and the Orpington By-Pass Road to the east of Saint Mary Cray Station and thence westwards along the middle of the said railway line to the boundary which divides the parish of Saint Mary Cray from the parish of Chislehurst."

And whereas the provisions of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme, have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Rochester.

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 16th day of August, 1956, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Church Commissioners, in pursuance of the Church Patronage Act, 1870, and of the Acts therein mentioned, have prepared the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the church and cure (hereinafter called 'the said benefice') of Bradwell in the County of Suffolk and in the diocese of Norwich.

"SCHEME.

"Whereas we are satisfied that Geoffrey Basil Wood Walker of 6, Dawson Place, London, a Fellow of the Royal College of Surgeons, and Frederick James Root of Scotsdene, Haslemere in the County of Surrey, Civil Servant, as the present Trustees of the Will of the late Reverend Robert Henry Walker are the patrons or persons entitled to present or nominate to the said benefice:

"And whereas the said Geoffrey Basil Wood Walker and Frederick James Root desire to transfer the advowson of the said benefice to the Bishop of Norwich for the time being and are consenting to this Scheme (in testimony whereof they have executed the same):

"And whereas we are satisfied that the transfer will tend to make better provision for the cure of souls:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Percy, Bishop of Norwich (in testimony whereof he has executed this Scheme), we, the said Church Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation

to the said benefice shall be transferred to the said Percy, Bishop of Norwich, and his successors in the same Bishopric and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the Bishop of Norwich for the time being."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 16th day of August, 1956, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, have prepared and humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for constituting a new parish to be taken out of the parish of Saint Gabriel, Weoley Castle, in the diocese of Birmingham.

"SCHEME.

"Whereas we, the Church Commissioners, are satisfied that the spiritual interests of the area defined in the Schedule hereto and delineated on the map hereto annexed would be best served by constituting it a new parish:

"And whereas we are satisfied that a suitable endowment therefor will be provided:

"And whereas we have not approved any consecrated church within the area as suitable to be the parish church of the new parish:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Leonard, Bishop of Birmingham (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and affixed his episcopal seal to this Scheme), we, the said Church Commissioners, do humbly recommend and propose as follows, that is to say:—

"1. Constitution.

"(a) As from the date of the licence thereto of a Minister the area defined in the Schedule hereto and delineated on the map hereto annexed shall be a separate district for spiritual purposes.

"(b) As from the date of the consecration of a church within the area approved by us, the said Church Commissioners, as suitable to be a parish church, or if the church is consecrated before such approval, the date of the approval, the said area shall become a new parish.

"(c) The name of the district (or parish as the case may be) shall be 'The District (or Parish) of Saint Michael and All Angels, Bartley Green'.

"2. Archdeaconry and Rural Deanery.

"the parish shall be in the Archdeaconry of Birmingham and in the rural deanery of King's Norton.

"THE SCHEDULE.

"The area comprising:—

"All that part (coloured pink on the map) of the parish of Saint Gabriel, Weoley Castle, which lies to the west of an imaginary line commencing on the boundary which divides the parish of Frankley from the parish of Saint Gabriel, Weoley Castle, at the point where it crosses the wall or fence forming the southeastern boundary of close numbered 1438 (on the map) and proceeding thence generally northeastwards along the said wall or fence to its end and in a straight line in continuation thereof to a point in the middle of Genners Lane and continuing thence northwestwards along the middle of Genners Lane for a distance of 13 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite the wall or fence which divides close numbered 2272 from close numbered 2289 and continuing thence first northeastwards across close numbered 2271 to, and then generally northeastwards along, the last mentioned wall or fence to its end at the western side of Moor's Lane and continuing thence in a straight
