The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that They have made an Order under section 10 of the Finance Act, 1926, exempting the following chemicals from Key Industry Duty for a period ending with the 18th February, 1957.

Synthetic organic chemicals, analytical reagents, other fine chemicals and chemicals manufactured by fermentation processes, the following:—

Aminosulphonic acid. Ethylenediamine. Ethylenediamine hydrate.

2-Methylundecaldehyde (a dodecaldehyde).

9-Undecenaldehyde. 10-Undecenaldehyde.

The Order which comes into operation on the 10th October, 1956, is entitled the Safeguarding of Industries (Exemption) (No. 7) Order, 1956, and is published as Statutory Instruments, 1956, No. 1560.
