PRESENT.

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 11th day of October, 1956, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, and the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which we have prepared with the consent of the Right Reverend Robert, Bishop of Peterborough (in witness whereof he has signed the Scheme), for effecting the union of the benefice of Ashwell and part of the united benefice of Langham with Burley both situate in the diocese of Peterborough.

" SCHEME.

"1. *Union of Benefices*. That part of the united benefice of Langham with Burley which coincides with the area of the parish of Burley shall be severed from the said united benefice and the part so severed and the benefice of Ashwell shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Ashwell with Burley' but the parishes of Ashwell and Burley shall continue in all respects distinct; and the remaining part of the united benefice of Langham with Burley shall be known as 'The benefice of Langham' and the incumbent thereof shall have the cure of souls within the limits of the parish of Langham.

"2. *Taking effect of union*. Upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the Reverend Canon John Henry Nettleship Hill, if he is then incumbent of the united benefice of Langham with Burley, shall with his consent (testified by his signature hereto) be the incumbent of the benefice of Langham.

"3. *Patronage*. After the union has taken effect the right of presentation to the united benefice of Ashwell with Burley shall be exercised alternately by the patron of the benefice of Ashwell and by that one of the alternate patrons of the united benefice of Langham with Burley (or his successor in title) who was patron of the former benefice of Burley immediately prior to its union with the former

benefice of Langham, the last-mentioned patron having the first presentation to the united benefice of Ashwell with Burley to be made after the union, and the patronage of the separate benefice of Langham shall belong to and be exercisable by the other alternate patron of the united benefice of Langham with Burley.

"4. *Endowments*. Upon the union taking effect the endowments and property now belonging to the united benefice of Langham with Burley shall be divided and distributed as follows, that is to say, a capital sum sufficient to produce an annual income of £175 being part of a larger capital sum held by us for the said united benefice of Langham with Burley, shall be assigned and annexed to the united benefice of Ashwell with Burley and all other the endowments and property of the united benefice of Langham with Burley shall be assigned and annexed to the separate benefice of Langham."

And Whereas the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, the Union of Benefices Rules, 1926 and 1930 and the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme have been duly complied with:

And Whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that it shall be and become effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette.

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 19th day of October, 1956, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, have prepared and humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for constituting a new parish to be taken out of the parish of Eastwood in the diocese of Chelmsford.

" SCHEME.

"Whereas we, the Church Commissioners, are satisfied that the spiritual interests of the area defined in the Schedule hereto and delineated on the map hereto annexed would be best served by constituting it a new parish:

"And whereas we are satisfied that a suitable endowment therefor will be provided:

"And whereas we have not approved any consecrated church within the area as suitable to be the parish church of the new parish:
