### PRESENT.

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 26th day of October, 1956, in the words and figures following, that is to say:— "We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursu-ance of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, have pre-pared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for altering the boundaries of the parishes of Shaw cum Donnington and Saint Mark, Cold Ash, both in the diocese of Oxford Oxford.

### " SCHEME.

"Whereas we are satisfied that it is desirable that the boundaries of the said parishes should be altered in the manner hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the Right Reverend Harry Bishop of Oxford consents to the proposed arrangements (in testimony whereof he has executed this Scheme):

"Now, therefore, we, the said Church Com-missioners, humbly recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme the boundaries of the said parishes of Shaw cum Donnington and Saint Mark, Cold Ash, shall be altered in the manner described in the Schedule and delineated on the map annexed to this Scheme.

#### "THE SCHEDULE.

"The territory to be annexed to the parish of Shaw cum Donnington :-

"All that part (coloured pink on the map annexed hereto) of the parish of Saint Mark, Cold Ash, which lies to the west of an imaginary line commencing on the boundary dividing the parish of Saint Mark, Cold Ash, from the parish of Shaw cum Donnington at the southeastern corner of cum Donnington at the southeastern corner of Mousefield Copse and continues southeastwards along the middle of the footpath leading from the last mentioned Copse to the road which leads from Clayhill Brick Works to Ashmore Green and continues northeastwards along the middle of the last mentioned road to the footpath on the north-east side of Stone Copse which leads to Henwick Manor and continues southeastwards along the last mentioned footpath to the boundary dividing the parish of Saint Mark, Cold Ash, from the parish of Thatcham".

And whereas the provisions of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, relating to the preparation and sub-mission of this Scheme, have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to

ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forth-with registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Oxford.
