At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 31st day of October, 1956.

PRESENT.

The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 26th day of October, 1956 (N.P. 5175/56) in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas we deem it expedient to revise and to improve the provision for the grant of pensions to the widows and children of officers and seamen and marines in respect of service in the Royal Navy and Royal Marines, and to provide gratuities for the widows and children of officers and seamen and marines who die in the course of such service: such service:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to authorise us to award pensions and gratuities at the rates and subject to the conditions specified in the Schedule annexed hereto:

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals:

"SCHEDULE.

"SECTION I.

"Pensions for Widows and Children of Regular Naval and Marine Officers.

"1. The provisions in this section relate to the widows and children of Officers who held permanent regular commissions in the Royal Navy or Royal Marines while serving on the Active List on or after 31st August, 1950.

"They shall be effective from 1st December, 1952, and for those to whom they apply shall be in place, with effect from that date, of the corresponding provisions of earlier Orders in Council

provisions of earlier Orders in Council.

"2. Pensions at the rates set out below may be granted to the widow and children of a permanent regular officer who dies while on the Active List or after retirement, provided the officer was granted or was eligible for half pay or service retired pay, or, in the case of death while serving, would have been so eligible had he been invalided, under the provisions of sections I and II of Order in Council of the 28th July, 1949, as amended by sections I and II of Order in Council of the 30th January, 1952.

"3. Rank for the above purpose will be as set out in Clause 21 of Order in Council of the 28th July, 1949. Higher paid acting or temporary rank, and rank held during further service after retirement, will be taken into account to the same extent as for retired ray purposes. retired pay purposes.

"4. Where a permanent officer with previous service as a regular rating or other rank is invalided or dies while serving, with less than 10 years reckonable service but with 15 or more years total service, a widow's pension at the appropriate full rate may, nevertheless, be awarded at the discretion of the Admiralty. If, however, less than 15 years and more than 12 years total service has been rendered. widow's pension at the rate of £60 a year may be awarded subject to two of the last five years service having been performed in commissioned rank or as Regimental Sergeant Major, R.M.

"SECTION II

"Pensions for Widows and Children of Temporary Branch Officers, etc.

"5. The provisions in this Section relate to the widows and children of Regular seamen and marines who held temporary Branch or other commissioned status and gave full pay service on or after 31st August, 1950.

"(i) The families of officers of this category who at the time of death were either in receipt of or would have been eligible for service retired pay under special regulations may be awarded pensions as follows:—

as follows:-

" Widows

"Where the officer has completed 20 years' reckonable service (or 10 years if he is invalided or dies while serving) the pension will be £70 a year. Where he has less than that service, but 15 years' total service or more, the pension will be £60 a year.

" Children

"Children's pensions will be as for the children

of permanent regular officers.

"(ii) The families of officers of this category who at the time of death were in receipt of or would have been eligible for service pensions on the ratings' scale only, will be allowed pensions as follows:

" Widow £60 a year £20 a year Children, each or, if motherless, each ... £40 a year

"The minimum period of service required will be as for service pension, viz. normally 22 years' reckonable service, or 12 years if the officer is invalided (or dies while serving). At least two years' service as Temporary Branch Officer during the last five years of service will be necessary.

"SECTION III

"Pensions for Widows and Children of Regular Long Service Ratings and Royal Marine Other Ranks

"6. The provisions in this Section relate to the widow and children of Naval Ratings and Royal Marines who gave full pay service on normal regular engagements on or after 31st August, 1950.

(i) Regimental Sergeant Major, R.M.

"Pensions at the rates set out below may be granted to the widow and children of a Regimental Sergeant Major, R.M., who dies whilst serving or after discharge to pension, provided

"(a) he was granted or was eligible for service pension or, in the case of death whilst serving, would have been eligible by length of service had he been invalided, and "(b) he served for two years in the rank of Regimental Sergeant Major, R.M., or above during the last five years of his service.

"(ii) All other ranks and ratings.

"Pensions at the rates set out below may be granted to the widow and children of a rating or marine who dies whilst serving or after discharge to pension, provided the rating or marine had reckonable service for pension of the length stipulated.

"Rating or rank for the purpose of determining both entitlement to and the rate of pension will be the highest paid rating or rank held for two years or more during the last five years of service.

"SECTION IV

"Conditions Governing the Award of Widows' and Children's Pensions

Widows' Pensions

"7. To be eligible for pension a widow must have been married to the officer or seaman or marine before his retirement or discharge to pension, or, if he subsequently gave further service in circumstances rendering him eligible to be considered for a re-assessment of retired pay or service pension, before the termination of such further service.

"8. If the death of the officer or seamen or marine occurred within a year of his marriage it shall be for the Admiralty to determine whether the circumstances of the case warrant the withholding or re-striction of the award which would normally be

admissible.

"9. A widow's pension shall cease on her remarriage, but if she again becomes a widow her pension may be restored in whole, or in part, provided her pecuniary circumstances are, in the opinion of the Admiralty, such as to justify the restoration.

"Children's Pensions

"10. Children's pensions may be granted, subject to the conditions stated, to:—

"(a) Legitimate children of the officer or seaman or marine where the mother is, or would have been, eligible for a widow's pension.

"(b) Step-children of the officer or seaman or marine where the mother is, or would have been, eligible for a widow's pension, and who were mainly dependent on him at the time of death.

"(c) Children adopted by the officer or seaman or marine, or by his wife, before his retirement or discharge to pension (or, if he subsequently gave further service in circumstances rendering him eligible to be considered for a re-assessment of retired pay or service pension, before the termination of such further service), who were mainly dependent on him at the time of his death.

"(d) Illegitimate children of the officer or seaman or marine. or of his wife, born before his retirement or discharge to pension (or, if he subse-

retirement or discharge to pension (or, if he subsequently gave further service in circumstances rendering him eligible to be considered for a re-assessment of retired pay or service pension, before the termination of such further service), who were mainly dependent on him at the time of his death.

"11. Children's pensions will normally cease when the child attains the age of 18 years in the case of officers and Regimental Sergeant Majors, R.M., or the age of 16 years in the case of lower ranks, but may be granted or continued after those ages:—

"(a) if the child continues in receipt of full-time advantage for the analysis age receiving not more

"(a) if the child continues in receipt of full-time education, or is an apprentice receiving not more than nominal wages, or
"(b) if the child was, before attaining the normal age limit as above laid down, and still is, afflicted with some mental or bodily infirmity, and thereby rendered incapable of earning his or her own living, provided the pecuniary circumstances of the child and family are considered by the Admiralty to justify the award.

"12. Children's pensions shall be issuable to the widow or mother of the child, or other person responsible for the child's maintenance, or to the child direct, as may be decided by the Admiralty.

"Pensions of children of officers and of Regimental Serges Majors R M may be issued annually in

Sergeant Majors, R.M., may be issued annually in advance, with effect from the 1st April in each year.

"Conditions—General.

"13. A widow's or child's pension cannot be claimed as a right.

"14. A widow's or child's pension shall not be given if the service of the officer or seaman or marine was, in the opinion of the Admiralty, unsatisfactory.

15. If the death of an officer or rating or marine, or the wound, injury or disease which resulted in his death, was due wholly or in part to his own negligence or misconduct or to any cause within his control, any grant which might otherwise have been made to his widow or children may be withheld or reduced in amount at the discretion of the

or reduced in amount at the discretion of the Admiralty.

"16. If an officer retired, dismissed the Service, or called upon to retire for misconduct or inefficiency, or a rating or marine discharged for misconduct or inefficiency, was not granted any retired pay or pension in respect of his service, no award shall be made to the family. If reduced retired pay or pension was allowed, the award to the widow shall be reduced by one-half the percentage of such reduction.

"17. A pension shall not be granted or continued is unworthy nor, subject to any

"17. A pension shall not be granted or continued where the applicant is unworthy nor, subject to any exception which the Admiralty may approve, shall it be granted to a widow who was separated from her husband at the time of his death. Should an exception be approved, the grant shall be at such rate, within the scales laid down, and subject to such conditions, as the Admiralty may determine.

"18. If the applicant is granted any other pension or allowance from the public on account of the services of the deceased, whether in the Royal Navy or in the Royal Marines or in any other capacity, the amount of such other grant may be taken into consideration, and the award permissible under this Schedule may be withheld or reduced at the discretion of the Admiralty.

"19. No award under Sections I, II or III shall be payable to a widow or child who is in receipt of a pension or allowance on the ground that the death of the officer or seaman or marine concerned was due to his service in the Royal Navy or Royal

Marines. "20. In exceptional circumstances, the Admiralty may at their discretion suspend or withhold the whole or any part of a pension granted under this Schedule, and they may divert the whole or any part for the benefit of persons dependent on the

pensioner. "21. The date of commencement of pension shall be determined according to the circumstances of the case and shall normally, if application is not unduly delayed, be the date following death, or the date following the termination of allowances issuable after

"Commutation of Retired Pay under the Pensions Commutation Acts.

"22. The wife and children of an officer who commutes his retired pay wholly or partially, under the Pensions Commutation Acts of 1871 to 1882, shall not thereby be deprived of any entitlement to pension under this Schedule, but the award to the widow of an officer whose marriage took place after commutation, to a legitimate or illegitimate child born after commutation, to a step-child eligible by virtue of a marriage after commutation, or to a child adopted after commutation, shall be reduced by an amount corresponding to the proportion of retired pay commuted. pay commuted.

"SECTION V.

"Revision of 'Ordinary' Pension Scheme.

"23. The following changes shall be made in the provision for the grant of 'Ordinary' pensions and compassionate allowances to the widows and children of officers and Sergeant Majors, R.M., made in earlier Orders in Council, and all such Orders in Council shall be construed, as from 1st December, 1952, as amended accordingly:—

"(a) The pecuniary circumstances of the appli-cant or pensioner shall be ignored, except insofar

as they relate to the restoration of widows' pensions on second widowhood, or to the grant or continuance of a compassionate allowance on account of infirmity to children over the normal age limits for such awards.

"(b) Differences in age between husband and wife, and the husband's age on marriage, shall

not be taken into account.

wite, and the austral's age on marriage, shall not be taken into account.

"(c) Pension may be granted notwithstanding that the husband did not survive his marriage by at least a year, if the circumstances are considered to justify the award.

"(d) Marriage before retirement or before discharge to pension shall not be a condition where the officer or Sergeant Major, R.M., gave further service qualifying for a re-assessment of retired pay or pension, and married before the termination of such further service.

"(e) Re-employed service after 2nd September, 1939, may be reckoned, if the officer or Sergeant Major, R.M., received (or if he died during such service, would have been eligible to receive) retired pay or pension, or a re-assessed award, in respect of such service; higher rank held during the re-employment may be taken into account to the same extent as for retired pay purposes.

"(f) The rates of 'Ordinary' pensions and compassionate allowances shall be as follows:—

"Where under earlier Orders in Council the rate of widow's pension was governed by an officer's seniority or by a rank which is now obsolete, the appropriate rate on the above scale shall be determined by the relative rank groupings in the Schedule to Order in Council of the 25th June, 1925.

"(g) If an officer held after 2nd September, 1939, paid acting or temporary or substantive rank higher than that on which the widow's pension would otherwise be assessed, such higher rank may be taken into account to the same extent as for retired pay purposes.

- "(h) The term 'Compassionate allowance' as applicable to awards to children, shall be amended 'pension'
- "24. Where the officer (or Sergeant Major, R.M.) died before the 31st August, 1950, pension may be granted or re-assessed with effect from a date not earlier than the 1st December, 1952, in accordance with the appropriate regulations amended as above.
- "25. Where an officer (or Sergeant Major, R.M.) dies on or after 31st August, 1950, and his widow or children are not eligible for consideration for awards under Sections I and II as he did not give service on the Active List, or full pay service on a normal regular engagement after that date, his widow and children may be considered for awards under the regulations in force before 1st December, 1952, amended as above amended as above.

"SECTION VI.

- "Gratuities to Widows and Children.
- "26. Where a permanent regular officer, a short service officer, an extended service officer or a Temporary Branch Officer who was eligible for service retired pay dies whilst serving on full pay his widow may be granted a gratuity as follows:—
 - "(a) In cases of death white serving on the Active List between 31st August, 1950, and 31st December, 1955 (inclusive):-
 - "(i) if, had the officer been invalided, he would have been eligible for a terminal grant under Section IIII of Order in Council No. 62/P.M. of the 30th January, 1952, gratuity at the rate of £45 for each year of service on which his terminal grant would have been assessed, subject to a maximum of £900.
 - "(ii) in other cases, and as a minimum, a gratuity of £200 may be granted.
 - "(b) In cases of death while re-employed between 31st August, 1950, and 31st December, 1955 (inclusive):—
 - "(i) where the re-employed officer had retired from the Active List with full Terminal Grant-
 - "(ii) where the re-employed officer had re "(11) where the re-employed officer had retired from the Active List with only a partial Terminal Grant, or with none at all, and his re-employed service would have qualified him for a Terminal Grant; a gratuity equal to 90 per cent. of the Terminal Grant, or Additional Terminal Grant, the officer would have received if his re-employed service had been terminated by invaliding, subject to a minimum award of £200. award of £200.
 - "(c) In cases of death while serving on the Active List or while re-employed after 31st December, 1955, the amount of gratuity to be as follows:
 - "(i) Where a Terminal Grant or Additional Terminal Grant would have been payable on invaliding, ninety per cent, of the award to which the officer would have been entitled at the time of his death, subject to a minimum gratuity of £200.

- "27. Where a Temporary Branch Officer eligible for service pension on the rating's scale only, or a seaman or marine dies on or after 31st August, 1950, whilst serving on full pay on a regular engagement including a short service engagement his widow may be granted a gratuity as follows:-
 - "(a) In cases of death while serving (unless during re-employment) between 31st August, 1950, and 31st December, 1955 (inclusive):—

"(i) if, had he been invalided, he would have been eligible for service pension and a terminal grant, a gratuity of:-

- "(ii) in other cases, and as a minimum, a gratuity of £40 may be granted.
- "(b) In cases of death while re-employed between 31st August, 1950, and 31st December, 1955 (inclusive):—
 - "(i) where a re-employed pensioner would have qualified for Terminal Grant or for Terminal Grant Addition if his re-employed service had been terminated by invaliding, a widow's gratuity on the scale in (a) (i) above corresponding to the amount of such Terminal Grant or Terminal Grant Addition will be payable subject to a minimum of £40: able, subject to a minimum of £40;
 - "(ii) where no Terminal Grant or addition would have been payable, the widow's gratuity will be £40.
- "(c) In cases of death while serving after 31st December, 1955, including deaths while re-employed, the amount of gratuity to be as follows:
 - "(i) Where a Terminal Grant would have been payable on invaliding, ninety per cent. of the Terminal Grant to which the rating or other rank would have been entitled, the minimum award being £112 10s. 0d.
 - "(ii) Where an Additional Terminal Grant would have been payable on invaliding, ninety per cent. of that amount subject to a minimum award of £70.
 - "(iii) Where no Terminal Grant would have been payable, the gratuity to be £70.
- "28. Where, had the officer or seaman or marine been invalided, an adjustment would have been due from his award in respect of gratuity or other non-effective payment previously received by him, an abatement may be made on that account in assessing the gratuity payable under Clause 26 or 27.
- "29. (Rank for the purpose of assessing the gratuity payable under Clause 27 (a) (i) or (b) (i) shall be the highest paid rank held for a period of two years during the last five years of service.
- "30. In the event of the Admirabty deciding to exercise its discretion under Clause 8 or Clause 15, by withholding or restricting the amount of widow's pension, the withholding or restriction of gratuity shall also be at the discretion of the Admirabty.
- "31. Where the officer or seaman or marine did not leave a widow but a child or children (as defined in Clause 10, and fulfilling the conditions of that Clause), the Admiralty may at its discretion award a gratuity to the child or children or to any of them. The total award shall not exceed that which would have been payable to a widow and the award to any one child shall not exceed one third of that amount.
- "32. Where the officer or seaman or marine leaves a widow and in addition a child or children (as defined in Clause 10 and fulfilling the conditions of that Clause) who are not living with or supported

by her, the Admiralty may divert a sum of not more than one-third of the gratuity which would normally be payable to the widow for the benefit of all or any of such children.

- "33. Where a woman member dies in circumstances in which the child of a male member would have been granted a gratuity under Clause 31 above and leaves a child or children (as defined in Clause 10 and fulfilling the conditions of that Clause) the Admiralty may award a gratuity for the benefit of the child or children of such amount as it may determine
- "34. Subject to any exception which the Admiralty may approve, a gratuity shall not be granted to a widow who was separated from her husband at the time of his death. Should such exception be approved the grant shall be of such amount, within the scale laid down, as the Admiralty may determine determine.
- "35. Gratuities in respect of children may be issued to the widow or mother of the child, or other person responsible for the child's maintenance, or to the child direct, as may be decided. They may where appropriate be issued in instalments, or withheld for later payment.
- 36. Gratuities under this Section shall not be subject to abatement in respect of any Naval debt due from the deceased officer or seaman or marine, other than any abatement due under Clause 28.

"SECTION VII.

"Supplements to 'Attributable' pensions.

"37. A widow or child of an officer or rating or marine who is in receipt of a pension or allowance on the ground that his death was attributable to service and who would otherwise have been eligible for the grant of a pension under Sections I to V, may, subject to the conditions prescribed therein, be granted a pension as follows:

(c) if not qualified under sub-paragraph (a) or sub-paragraph (b) of this paragraph, he must satisfy the Commissioners that he is so closely connected with a country or territory within the Commonwealth either by ancestry, upbringing or residence, or by reason of national service, that an exception may properly be made in his favour.

(2) A candidate will not be eligible for appointment to a situation in the Foreign Service unless at all times since his birth he has been either a British subject or a citizen of the Irish Republic and was born of parents each of whom is or was at death a British subject or a citizen of the Irish Republic and has or had been one or the other at all times since birth:

11. Canvassing.

Any attempt on the part of candidates to enlist support for their applications through Members of

Parliament or other influential persons, except as referees to be named by them on their application forms, will disqualify them for appointment.

12. Fee.

The total fee payable by all candidates is £2. Of this £1 must be paid on application.
