

by her, the Admiralty may divert a sum of not more than one-third of the gratuity which would normally be payable to the widow for the benefit of all or any of such children.

"33. Where a woman member dies in circumstances in which the child of a male member would have been granted a gratuity under Clause 31 above and leaves a child or children (as defined in Clause 10 and fulfilling the conditions of that Clause) the Admiralty may award a gratuity for the benefit of the child or children of such amount as it may determine.

"34. Subject to any exception which the Admiralty may approve, a gratuity shall not be granted to a widow who was separated from her husband at the time of his death. Should such exception be approved the grant shall be of such amount, within the scale laid down, as the Admiralty may determine.

"35. Gratuities in respect of children may be issued to the widow or mother of the child, or other person responsible for the child's maintenance, or to the child direct, as may be decided. They may where appropriate be issued in instalments, or withheld for later payment.

"36. Gratuities under this Section shall not be subject to abatement in respect of any Naval debt due from the deceased officer or seaman or marine, other than any abatement due under Clause 28.

"SECTION VII.

"Supplements to 'Attributable' pensions.

"37. A widow or child of an officer or rating or marine who is in receipt of a pension or allowance on the ground that his death was attributable to service and who would otherwise have been eligible for the grant of a pension under Sections I to V, may, subject to the conditions prescribed therein, be granted a pension as follows:—

"38. Arrears may be paid back to 1st December, 1952, or to the date from which the 'ordinary' pension would have been payable, if later.

"39. Widows receiving 'attributable' pensions whose husbands died before 31st August, 1950, are ineligible for pension supplements on the above scales. But in such cases, the Admiralty may make an award equal to the amount by which the widow is, from time to time, out of pocket through having an 'attributable' pension instead of 'ordinary' and National Insurance pensions; arrears may be paid back to 1st December, 1952, if appropriate."

Her Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 23rd November, 1956, at 1 p.m. for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the National Loans Act, 1939, to the amount of £80,000,000 for Bills due 63 days after date and to the amount of £210,000,000 for Bills due 91 days after date.
