“SCHEME.

“1. *Union of Benefices.* The benefice of Ilmington and the benefice of Stretton-on-Fosse with Ditchford shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of ‘The United Benefice of Ilmington with Stretton-on-Fosse,’ but the parishes of the said benefices shall continue in all respects distinct.

“2. *Taking effect of union.* Upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the Reverend Gerald Knight if he is then incumbent of the said benefice of Ilmington shall with his consent (which has been given to us in writing), be the first incumbent of the united benefice.

“3. *Parsonage House.* Upon the union taking effect the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Ilmington shall be the house of residence of the incumbent of the united benefice and the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Stretton-on-Fosse with Ditchford and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and the net proceeds of such sale or sales shall be placed to the credit of the Expenses Fund of the diocese of Coventry established pursuant to the 32nd Section of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

“4. *Patronage.* In every series of three successive turns of presentation or nomination to be made to the united benefice after the union has taken effect, the patron of the benefice of Ilmington shall have the first and third turns and the patron of the benefice of Stretton-on-Fosse with Ditchford shall have the second turn.

“5. *Diversion of Endowment Income.* From the date upon which the union shall take effect an annual sum of £131 being a part of the endowment income

of the united benefice payable by us, shall be carried by us to the credit of the diocesan stipends fund of the said diocese of Coventry and shall be held by us for the benefit of the said fund.”

And whereas the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, the Union of Benefices Rules, 1926 and 1930, and the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that it shall be and become effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette.

“We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, have prepared and humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for (1) constituting three new parishes to be taken out of the parishes of Saint Budeaux and Saint Pancras, Pennycross, and (2) altering the boundaries of the parishes of Saint Budeaux and Tamerton Foliot, all of which parishes are situate in the diocese of Exeter.

“SCHEME.

“Whereas we, the Church Commissioners, are satisfied (1) that the spiritual interests of the areas defined in Parts I, II and III of the subjoined Schedule and delineated on the maps annexed hereto would be best served by constituting them new parishes, and that suitable endowments therefor will be provided and (2) that it is desirable that the boundaries of the parishes of Saint Budeaux and Tamerton Foliot, should be altered in the manner described in Part IV of the said Schedule:

“And whereas there are within the areas defined in Parts I and III of the said Schedule consecrated churches known respectively as Saint Francis, Honicknowle, and Saint Chad, Whitleigh, which churches have been approved by us as suitable to be the parish churches of the new parishes which those areas are hereinafter proposed to be constituted:

“And whereas we have not approved any consecrated church within the area defined in Part II of the said Schedule as suitable to be the parish church

of the new parish which that area is hereinafter proposed to be constituted:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Robert, Bishop of Exeter (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and affixed his episcopal seal to this Scheme), we, the said Church Commissioners, do humbly recommend and propose as follows, that is to say:—

"1. Constitution of the new parish of Saint Francis, Honicknowle.

"(a) As from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council confirming this Scheme, the area defined in Part I of the subjoined Schedule and delineated on the map lettered 'A' hereto annexed shall be a new parish.

"(b) The church of Saint Francis, Honicknowle, aforesaid shall be the parish church of the new parish.

"(c) The name of the new parish shall be 'The Parish of Saint Francis, Honicknowle'.

"(d) The parish shall be in the Archdeaconry of Plymouth and in the rural deanery of Plymouth.

"2. Constitution of the new parish of Saint Aidan, Ernesettle.

"(a) As from the date of the licence thereto of a Minister the area defined in Part II of the subjoined Schedule and delineated on the map lettered 'B' hereto annexed shall be a separate district for spiritual purposes.

"(b) As from the date of the consecration of a church within the area approved by us as suitable to be the parish church or if the church is consecrated before such approval, the date of the approval, the said area shall become a new parish.

"(c) The name of the district (or parish as the case may be) shall be 'The District (or Parish) of Saint Aidan, Ernesettle'.

"(d) The parish shall be in the Archdeaconry of Plymouth and the rural deanery of Plymouth.

"3. Constitution of the new parish of Saint Chad, Whitleigh.

"(a) As from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council confirming this Scheme, the area defined in Part III of the subjoined Schedule and delineated on the map lettered 'C' hereto annexed shall be a new parish.

"(b) The church of Saint Chad, Whitleigh, aforesaid shall be the parish church of the new parish.

"(c) The name of the new parish shall be 'The Parish of Saint Chad, Whitleigh'.

"(d) The parish shall be in the Archdeaconry of Plymouth and the rural deanery of Plymouth.

"4. Alteration of Boundaries.

"As from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council confirming this Scheme the boundaries of the said parishes of Saint Budeaux and Tamerton Foliot shall be altered in the manner described in Part IV of the subjoined Schedule and delineated on the map lettered 'C' hereto annexed.

"SCHEDULE.

"Part I

"The area comprising:—

"All those contiguous parts of the parishes of Saint Budeaux and Saint Pancras, Pennycross, (coloured pink on the map lettered 'A' annexed hereto) which lie within a continuous imaginary line commencing at the point where Budshead Road crosses the boundary of Tamerton Ward and continuing thence southeastwards along the last mentioned ward boundary to a point due north of the northern end of Dumfries Avenue and continuing thence southwards to and along the middle of the last mentioned avenue and generally southwestwards along the middle of St. Peter's Road to a point opposite the eastern end of Dickens Road and continuing thence westwards to and along the middle of Dickens Road and Byron Avenue and southwestwards along the middle of Cobbett Road to its end and continuing thence in a straight line northwestwards to the eastern corner of close No. 6457 (thereby crossing Honicknowle Lane) and continuing thence generally northwestwards along the north-western and northern boundaries of the last mentioned close and along the walls or fences at the rear of the houses and premises on the southern side of Harewood Crescent and Little Dock Lane

and in a straight line in continuation thereof to the middle of the last mentioned lane and continuing thence northwestwards along the middle of the last mentioned lane to a point opposite the eastern end of Tamar Way and continuing thence first westwards and then northwestwards to and along the middle of the last mentioned way for 21 chains and continuing thence northeastwards in a straight line to the southwestern end of Hirmandale Road and continuing thence along the middle of the last mentioned road, Crownhill Road, Parade Road and Valiant Avenue to the point where the last mentioned avenue joins Anzac Avenue and continuing thence generally northwards along an un-named track or footpath to the point where Budshead Road meets Ringmore Way and continuing thence north-eastwards along the middle of Budshead Road to the point where it meets the boundary of Tamerton Ward.

"Part II

"The area comprising:—

"All that part of the parish of Saint Budeaux coloured pink on the map lettered 'B' annexed hereto) bounded on the north by the parish of Tamerton Foliot and on the remaining sides by a continuous imaginary line commencing on the boundary which divides the parish of Saint Budeaux from the parish of Tamerton Foliot at a point on the boundary of Tamerton Ward opposite the mouth of Budshead Creek and continuing thence generally southeastwards along the last mentioned boundary to a point in the middle of Budshead Road and continuing thence generally westwards along the middle of the last mentioned road to a point opposite the southern end of Biggin Hill and continuing thence in a straight line due west (thereby passing between the house and premises known as No. 60 Budshead Road and the house and premises known as No. 1 Biggin Hill) to the walls or fences at the rear of the houses or premises on the northwest side of Budshead Road and continuing thence southwestwards along the last mentioned walls or fences to their end and in a straight line in continuation thereof to the eastern boundary of close No. 4942 (thereby crossing the approach road to Agaton Fort) and continuing thence northwards along the last mentioned boundary, westwards along the northern boundary of the same close, southwards along part of the eastern boundary of close No. 3051 and westwards along the northern boundaries of closes Nos. 3643, 2942, 2040, 0942 and 0338 to a point opposite the middle of Ernesettle Lane and continuing thence first westwards to and thence northwestwards along the middle of the last mentioned lane to its end and thence northeastwards along the Devonport to Tavistock branch of British Railways (Southern Region) to the boundary which divides the parish of Saint Budeaux from the parish of Tamerton Foliot.

"Part III

"The area comprising:—

"All that part of the parish of Saint Budeaux, (coloured pink on the map lettered 'C' annexed hereto) bounded on the northwest and northeast by the parish of Tamerton Foliot and on the southeast and southwest by the boundary of Tamerton Ward not annexed in accordance with the succeeding Part of this Schedule to the parish of Tamerton Foliot.

"Part IV

"There shall be annexed to the parish of Tamerton Foliot:—

"(a) All that part of the parish of Saint Budeaux, (coloured green on the map lettered 'C' annexed hereto) bounded on the northeast and northwest by the parish of Tamerton Foliot and on the south by a continuous imaginary line commencing at a point on the boundary which divides the parish of Saint Budeaux, from the parish of Tamerton Foliot opposite the western end of the southern boundary of close No. 3354 and continuing thence eastwards to and along the last mentioned boundary and the southern boundaries of closes Nos. 4152 and 5451 and along part of the southeastern boundary of the last mentioned close to a point opposite the western end of the wall or fence which forms the southern boundary of close No. 7148 and continuing thence eastwards to and along the last mentioned boundary (thereby crossing an un-named road or track) and generally southeastwards along the southwestern boundary of closes Nos. 8650, 9043 and 9635 (thereby following the walls or fences at the rear of the

houses or premises on the northeast side of Aylesbury Crescent and Taunton Avenue) and in the same direction along the southwestern boundary of close No. 1629 and continuing thence northwards along the eastern boundary of the last mentioned close and generally northwestwards along the southeastern boundary of close No. 2736, the southwestern and southeastern boundaries of close No. 3547 to the end of the last mentioned boundary and in a straight line in continuation thereof to the boundary which divides the parish of Tamerton Foliot from the parish of Saint Budeaux.

"(b) All that part of the parish of Saint Budeaux, (coloured green on the map lettered 'C' annexed hereto) bounded on the northeast by the parish of Tamerton Foliot on the west by Tamerton Road and on the southeast by the boundary of Tamerton Ward."

And whereas the provisions of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme, have been duly complied with:

And Whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Exeter.

"SCHEME.

"1. *Union of Benefices.* The benefice of Atherington and the benefice of High Bickington shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Atherington and High Bickington,' but the parishes of the said benefices shall continue in all respects distinct.

"2. *Taking effect of union.* Upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the Reverend Arthur Jasper Plummer, if he is then incumbent of the said benefice of High Bickington, shall, with his consent (testified by his signature hereto), be the first incumbent of the united benefice.

"3. *Parsonage House.* The parsonage house belonging to the benefice of High Bickington shall be the house of residence of the incumbent of the united benefice.

"4. *Patronage.* After the union has taken effect the right of presentation to the united benefice shall be exercised by the patrons of the two benefices alternately, the patron of the benefice of Atherington having the first presentation to the united benefice to be made after the union.

"5. *Diversion of Endowment Income.*

"(1) Subject as hereinafter provided any surplus, calculated by us for the twelve months ending on the 31st March in each year of the endowment income (calculated in accordance with the Schedule hereto) of the united benefice over and above an annual sum of £842 shall, with effect from the date

upon which the union shall take effect, be paid to and be held by us, for the benefit of the diocesan stipends fund of the diocese of Exeter.

"(2) The said endowment income and the said surplus and the said annual sum of £842 shall be deemed to accrue from day to day and shall when we deem that circumstances so require be apportionable accordingly.

"6. *Archdeaconry and Rural Deanery.* The united benefice shall be in the Archdeaconry of Barnstaple and the Rural Deanery of Barnstaple.

"SCHEDULE.

"For the purpose of this Scheme the endowment income of the united benefice shall without prejudice to the power of decision vested in us by virtue of Section 18 of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, if any question shall arise, be computed in accordance with our Central Register of Benefice Income, that is to say, by including:—

"(1) all gross secured income payable by us and any other person or body, and

"(2) all gross income received from ground rents, chief rents or other fixed charges, other glebe rents and any letting of the parsonage house or a formally divided portion thereof.

"and by deducting therefrom:—

"(1) the rates payable on the parsonage house if occupied by the incumbent,

"(2) the rent and rates payable on any house occupied by the incumbent other than the parsonage house,

"(3) the annual assessment charged upon the incumbent under the Ecclesiastical Dilapidations Measures, 1923 to 1951, in respect of the benefice,

"(4) the rates payable on the glebe,

"(5) the cost of collecting glebe rents,

"(6) any tithe annuity, rentcharge or fee farm rent charged upon the glebe,

"(7) any other outgoings in respect of the glebe,

"(8) any charge upon the benefice income in favour of another benefice or any lay person,

"(9) any payment to a curate or lay worker out of the benefice income,

"(10) the annual payments in respect of capital and interest in respect of any mortgage of the benefice income,

"(11) any pension paid to a retired incumbent out of the benefice income,

"(12) any part of the benefice income diverted to the diocesan stipends fund pursuant to an Order under Section 12 of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949."

"3. *Parsonage House.* Upon the union taking effect the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Warringham with Chelsham shall be the house of residence of the incumbent of the united benefice, and the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Farleigh, together with the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds usually occupied and enjoyed therewith, shall be sold and disposed of by us at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and the net proceeds of such sale or sales shall be applied as follows, that is to say, so much of the said proceeds as we, after consulting with the Bishop for the time being of the said diocese, shall deem necessary shall be applied by us towards the cost of repairs and improvements to the residence house of the united benefice or towards the repayment of any monies advanced for that purpose and the balance (if any) of the said net proceeds shall be held by us for the endowment of the united benefice.

"5. *Diversion of endowment income.* From the date upon which the union shall take effect an annual sum of £25, being part of the endowment income of the united benefice payable by us, shall be carried by us to the credit of the diocesan stipends fund of the diocese of Southwark and shall be held by us for the benefit of the said fund.

On the 17th June, 1956 a disastrous forest fire in the Paphos Area of Cyprus trapped a considerable number of troops many of whom lost their lives or suffered severe injury as a result of the flames. Hearing that some soldiers had been burned Lieutenant SUTTON gallantly drove towards the scene along a mountain track in his Land Rover ambulance. He was caught by part of the fire which, sweeping across the track, forced him to take refuge in a small patch of shale and completely destroyed his vehicle and equipment. Undeterred by this and in spite of burns on his right arm he pressed forward on foot to the assistance of the injured men. He attempted to go for help using a stranded vehicle but was again cut off by the flames whereupon he once more returned to the injured on foot. With the help of other survivors, he got water from a spring and tried to salvage another vehicle to move his cans of water. Equipment of this vehicle was on fire, so he returned to the wounded on foot with a jerrican of water. After a second narrow escape in the fire, he continued to treat and move burned soldiers until they had all been evacuated.

Having been burned himself and lost all his medical equipment in his first contact with the fire, for five hours he moved about in the burning area succouring the wounded. He did his duty with complete disregard for his own safety and burns. His brave conduct and devotion to his duty was beyond praise.
