At the Court at *Buckingham Palace*, the 29th day of *November*, 1956.

PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 11th day of October, 1956, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, and the Diocesan Stipends Funds Measure, 1953, now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which we have prepared with the consent of the Right Reverend Cuthbert, Bishop of Coventry (in witness whereof he has signed this Scheme) for effecting the union of the benefice of Ilmington and the benefice of Stretton-on-Fosse with Ditchford both situate in the diocese of Coventry.

“SCHEME.

“1. *Union of Benefices.* The benefice of Ilmington and the benefice of Stretton-on-Fosse with Ditchford shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of ‘The United Benefice of Ilmington with Stretton-on-Fosse,’ but the parishes of the said benefices shall continue in all respects distinct.

“2. *Taking effect of union.* Upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the Reverend Gerald Knight if he is then incumbent of the said benefice of Ilmington shall with his consent (which has been given to us in writing), be the first incumbent of the united benefice.

“3. *Parsonage House.* Upon the union taking effect the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Ilmington shall be the house of residence of the incumbent of the united benefice and the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Stretton-on-Fosse with Ditchford and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and the net proceeds of such sale or sales shall be placed to the credit of the Expenses Fund of the diocese of Coventry established pursuant to the 32nd Section of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

“4. *Patronage.* In every series of three successive turns of presentation or nomination to be made to the united benefice after the union has taken effect, the patron of the benefice of Ilmington shall have the first and third turns and the patron of the benefice of Stretton-on-Fosse with Ditchford shall have the second turn.

“5. *Diversion of Endowment Income.* From the date upon which the union shall take effect an annual sum of £131 being a part of the endowment income

of the united benefice payable by us, shall be carried by us to the credit of the diocesan stipends fund of the said diocese of Coventry and shall be held by us for the benefit of the said fund.”

And whereas the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, the Union of Benefices Rules, 1926 and 1930, and the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that it shall be and become effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette.

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 7th day of November, 1956, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, have prepared and humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for (1) constituting three new parishes to be taken out of the parishes of Saint Budeaux and Saint Pancras, Pennycross, and (2) altering the boundaries of the parishes of Saint Budeaux and Tamerton Foliot, all of which parishes are situate in the diocese of Exeter.

“SCHEME.

“Whereas we, the Church Commissioners, are satisfied (1) that the spiritual interests of the areas defined in Parts I, II and III of the subjoined Schedule and delineated on the maps annexed hereto would be best served by constituting them new parishes, and that suitable endowments therefor will be provided and (2) that it is desirable that the boundaries of the parishes of Saint Budeaux and Tamerton Foliot, should be altered in the manner described in Part IV of the said Schedule:

“And whereas there are within the areas defined in Parts I and III of the said Schedule consecrated churches known respectively as Saint Francis, Honicknowle, and Saint Chad, Whitleigh, which churches have been approved by us as suitable to be the parish churches of the new parishes which those areas are hereinafter proposed to be constituted:

“And whereas we have not approved any consecrated church within the area defined in Part II of the said Schedule as suitable to be the parish church
