SAFETY CONVENTION

THE MERCHANT SHIPPING (SAFETY CONVENTION COUNTRIES) (VARIOUS) (No. 3) ORDER, 1956.

Made - - - - - 19th December, 1956
Laid before Parliament 28th December, 1956
Coming into Operation upon the date of publication in the London Gazette dated 1st January, 1957.

At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 19th day of December, 1956.

PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by section 31 of the Merchant Shipping (Safety Convention) Act, 1949(a) (12, 13 & 14 Geo. 6. c. 43.), it is enacted that Her Majesty, if satisfied that the Government of any country has accepted the Safety Convention, may by Order in Council make a declaration to that effect:

And whereas Her Majesty is satisfied that the Governments of the countries specified in the Schedule to this Order have accepted the Safety Convention:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in pursuance of the powers vested in Her by the aforesaid section and of all other powers enabling Her in that behalf, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to order, and doth hereby order, as follows:—

1. It is hereby declared that the Governments of the countries specified in the Schedule to this Order have accepted the Safety Convention.

2. This Order may be cited as the Merchant Shipping (Safety Convention Countries) (Various) (No. 3) Order, 1956, and shall come into operation upon the date of its publication in the London Gazette.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 13th day of December, 1956 (N.C.W. 10474/55) in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas His late Majesty King George V was graciously pleased by His Order in Council of 16th December, 1925, to approve that officers of the Royal Navy should be divided into certain categories, and that eligibility to succeed to command

of Your Majesty's Ships or to exercise military command should be limited to Executive Officers:

"And Whereas by Order in Council of 28th October, 1949, His late Majesty King George VI was graciously pleased to sanction the introduction of the Branch List of Officers of the Royal Navy:

"And whereas by Order in Council of 24th February, 1938, His late Majesty King George VI was graciously pleased to approve the employment in the Royal Navy of officers serving on Short Service engagements:

"And whereas we now consider it to be no longer desirable for officers of the Royal Navy to be divided into the separate categories of Executive, Engineer, Supply and Secretariat and Electrical officers, but that a new General List should be formed:

"And whereas we consider that the present Branch List of Officers should be re-organised to form new Special Duties Lists to comprise officers promoted from rating other than those selected for promotion to the General List:

"And whereas we consider that Supplementary Lists should now be formed, as may be required, to comprise officers commissioned for specialised duties:

"And whereas we consider that the provisions for the exercise of command of Your Majesty's Ships and military command should be re-defined and broadened:

"And whereas we consider that provision should be made to enable officers of the General List to be afforded, as opportunity offers, longer careers:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend to Your Majesty that Your Majesty may be pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction the arrangements appended in the annexed Schedule, with effect from 1st January, 1957:

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence.

" SCHEDULE.

"1. With effect from 1st January, 1957, the separate categories of Executive, Engineer, Supply and Secretariat and Electrical officers of the Royal Navy to be abolished, except for Branch List and Short Service officers, and in substitution a General List to be created comprising officers specialising as Seaman, Engineer, Supply and Secretariat and Electrical specialists.

"2. All officers serving on the Active List of the Royal Navy on 1st January, 1957, in the Executive, Engineer, Supply and Secretariat and Electrical Branches, except Branch officers and officers entered on engagements for 12 years service or less to be transferred to the new General List.

"3. The ranks and titles to be held by officers of the General List in all specialisations to be as follows:—

- Admiral of the Fleet.
- Admiral.
- Vice Admiral.
- Rear Admiral.

Captain.
 Commander.
 Lieutenant Commander.
 Lieutenant.
 Sub Lieutenant.
 Acting Sub Lieutenant.
 Midshipman.
 Cadet.

"4. Certain officers of the General List specialising as Seaman officers in the rank of Commander and above who have been selected for service in appointments involving sea and operational command shall be designated as Post List officers, but shall nevertheless remain as, and be shown in the Navy List as, officers of the General List and be subject to all provisions relating to General List officers except in so far as other provision is specifically made.

"5. With effect from 1st January, 1957, officers serving on the Active List as Branch Officers (including officers promoted to the rank of Lieutenant or above otherwise than by direct promotion from the rank of Commissioned Officer to the rank of Lieutenant) to be formed into new lists entitled 'Special Duties Lists': the rank structure and conditions of service for officers of the Special Duties Lists to be laid down separately.

"6. Certain officers serving on the 1st January, 1957, in the rank of Lieutenant Commander or above in the Electrical Branch on Branch List conditions of service in respect of pay, promotion and retirement to be formed into a Special List of Electrical Officers, being shown as and holding status and command as officers of the General List, but retaining conditions of service in respect of pay, promotion and retirement as laid down for officers of the Special Duties Lists, but no further officers to be entered onto this list.

"7. With effect from 1st January, 1957, provision to be made for the formation of Supplementary lists of officers entered for specialised duties on terms of service to be laid down separately and as appropriate for each specialisation. Officers serving as Short Service officers (but not including Medical, Dental and Instructor officers and Chaplains) to be formed into new Supplementary lists with effect from 1st January, 1957.

"8. The provisions above relating to the formation of the General List, the Special Duties Lists and the Supplementary Lists shall not apply to officers who were placed on the Retired List, or the Emergency List, on or before 1st January, 1957, or who otherwise ceased full pay service on the Active List on or before 31st December, 1956, except to the extent that provision may be made to regulate re-employment on full pay service on or after 1st January, 1957.

"9. Separate lists shall continue to remain in being for the Medical, Dental, Instructor and Chaplain Branches and for the Royal Marines; the re-organisation of the Branch List shall have, however, effect for the Wardmaster Branch and for the Royal Marines as for other Branch officers of the Royal Navy, except in so far as is specifically provided to the contrary.

"10. The ages of compulsory retirement for officers of the General List of the Royal Navy shall, for officers first entered as Cadet or first commissioned as officers of the General List on or after 1st May, 1957, be as follows:—

Captain	55
Commander	53
Lieutenant-Commander	50

except that for Post List officers retirement shall be:

for Captains, on approaching the top of the Captains' List if not selected for promotion to Rear-Admiral, subject to a maximum age of 55, for Commanders at age 50.

"The regulations to govern the retirement of officers of the rank of Rear Admiral and above are under review; in the meantime existing regulations remain in force.

"11. For officers of the General List other than those governed by paragraph 10 above it shall be within the discretion of the Admiralty, as circumstances permit, either to extend the existing retiring ages wholly or partly up to the ages specified in paragraph 10, or to permit the continued employment on the Active List of individual officers up to the limit of those ages.

"12. The functions of command, which have hitherto been categorised as divided into:

Military command.
 Command.

to be categorised with effect from 1st January, 1957, as divided into:

(a) Command, which shall comprise the authority exercised by all officers and ratings over subordinates within their own specialisation or branch.

(b) Military command, which shall comprise, in addition to (a), the exercise of command of non-seagoing ships, Naval shore establishments, aircraft and boats, and the direction of any work or undertaking which requires the co-operation of different branches of the Service.

(c) Sea command, which shall comprise, in addition to (a) and (b), the exercise of command of seagoing ships of the Royal Navy.

"The exercise of sea command, military command and command by officers of the Royal Navy and Royal Marines shall be governed by regulations to be made by the Admiralty, which shall, however, include provision that all officers of the new General List, and all officers of the Special Duties and Supplementary Lists who are Seaman specialists shall be entitled to the exercise of military command, subject to such special provisions as are necessary regarding the command of aircraft.

"13. The regulations shall further include provision that sea command shall be exercised by officers of the rank of Commander and above who have been selected as officers of the Post List and by other officers of the General List, Special Duties Lists and Supplementary Lists and other lists and of the Royal Marines and of the Reserves in accordance with regulations to be prescribed by the Admiralty.

"14. Officers of the General List, Special Duties Lists and Supplementary Lists will take rank and command according to their rank and seniority: where officers of the same rank are of equal seniority, they will rank in the order:—

General List.
 Special Duties List.
 Supplementary List.

Officers of the Reserves will take rank above R.N. officers of lower rank, but below R.N. officers of the same rank, except that the Admiralty may prescribe conditions under which Reserve officers may qualify to rank and command in accordance with their seniority in rank.

"15. Where officers rank otherwise of equal seniority the order will be:—

Royal Navy.
 Royal Marines.
 Royal Naval Reserve.
 Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve.
 Royal Marine Forces Volunteer Reserve."

Her Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 7th day of December, 1956, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, and the Diocesan Stipends Funds Measure, 1953, now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which we have prepared with the consent of the Right Reverend Ivor Bishop of Guildford (in witness whereof he has signed the Scheme) for effecting the union of the benefice of Effingham with the benefice of Little Bookham both situate in the diocese of Guildford.

"SCHEME.

"1. *Union of Benefices.* The benefice of Effingham and the benefice of Little Bookham shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Effingham with Little Bookham', but the parishes

of the said benefices shall continue in all respects distinct.

" 2. Taking effect of union.

"(1) If upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette the benefice of Little Bookham shall be vacant the union shall forthwith take effect, but if it shall then be full the union shall take effect immediately upon the next vacation thereof.

"(2) If upon the union taking effect the Reverend John Walter Reynolds is the incumbent of the benefice of Effingham he shall with his consent (testified by his signature hereto), be the first incumbent of the united benefice.

" 3. Parsonage house. (a) Upon the union taking effect the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Effingham shall be the house of residence of the incumbent of the united benefice (b) Without prejudice to the exercise before the date when the union takes effect of any of the powers conferred by the Parsonages Measures, 1938 and 1947, the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Little Bookham, if at that date it so belongs, together with the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and the net proceeds of such sale or sales, shall be held by us on behalf of the united benefice as endowment capital and subject to the provisions of the Benefices (Stabilization of Incomes) Measure, 1951.

" 4. Patronage. After the union has taken effect the right of presentation to the united benefice shall be exercised by the patrons of the two benefices alternately, the patron of the benefice of Effingham having the first presentation to the united benefice to be made after the union.

" 5. Diversion of Endowment Income.

"(1) Subject as hereinafter provided any surplus, calculated by us for the twelve months ending on the 31st March in each year of the endowment income (calculated in accordance with the Schedule hereto) of the united benefice over and above an annual sum of £845 shall, with effect from the date upon which the union shall take effect, be paid to and be held by us, for the benefit of the diocesan stipends fund of the diocese of Guildford.

"(2) The said endowment income and the said surplus and the said annual sum of £845 shall be deemed to accrue from day to day and shall, when we deem that circumstances so require, be apportionable accordingly.

"(3) Any moneys due to us from the incumbent of the united benefice, or, during any vacancy in the united benefice, from the sequestrators thereof, as the case may be (hereinafter called 'the incumbent or sequestrators') upon the calculation of the said surplus shall be paid by the incumbent or sequestrators to us not later than the 30th June in each year and shall be recoverable as a debt due to us.

"(4) For the purpose of ascertaining the amounts of the said endowment income and of the said surplus, we shall have power to require production by the incumbent or sequestrators of accounts and other documents in relation thereto, and the said accounts for the twelve months to 31st March in each year (or where applicable for a part of the year ending on that date) shall be rendered annually to us within six weeks of that date in such form as we shall prescribe; and in the event of failure by the incumbent or sequestrators to produce such accounts or documents we shall have all legal remedies for enforcing production thereof.

" SCHEDULE.

"For the purpose of this Scheme the endowment income of the united benefice shall without prejudice to the power of decision vested in us by virtue of Section 18 of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, if any question shall arise, be computed in accordance with our Central Register of Benefice Income, that is to say, by including:—

"(1) all gross secured income payable by us and any other person or body, and

"(2) all gross income received from ground rents, chief rents or other fixed charges, other glebe rents and any letting of the parsonage house or a formally divided portion thereof,

"and by deducting therefrom:—

"(1) the rates payable on the parsonage house if occupied by the incumbent,

"(2) the rent and rates payable on any house occupied by the incumbent other than the parsonage house,

"(3) the annual assessment charged upon the incumbent under the Ecclesiastical Dilapidations Measures, 1923 to 1951, in respect of the benefice,

"(4) the rates payable on the glebe,

"(5) the cost of collecting glebe rents,

"(6) any tithe annuity, rentcharge or fee farm rent charged upon the glebe,

"(7) any other outgoing in respect of the glebe,

"(8) any charge upon the benefice income in favour of another benefice or any lay person,

"(9) any payment to a curate or lay worker out of the benefice income,

"(10) the annual payments in respect of capital and interest in respect of any mortgage of the benefice income,

"(11) any part of the benefice income diverted to the diocesan stipends fund pursuant to an Order under Section 12 of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949."

And whereas the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, the Union of Benefices Rules, 1926 and 1930, and the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that it shall be and become effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette.

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for altering the boundaries of the parishes of Saint Luke, West Hartlepool, Stranton, Saint Aidan, West Hartlepool and Hart, all in the diocese of Durham.

" SCHEME.

"Whereas we are satisfied that it is desirable that the boundaries of the said parishes should be altered in the manner hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the Right Reverend Maurice, Bishop of Durham, consents to the proposed arrangements (in testimony whereof he has executed this Scheme):

"Now, therefore, we, the said Church Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme the boundaries of the said parishes of Saint Luke, West Hartlepool; Stranton; Saint Aidan, West Hartlepool and Hart shall be altered in the manner described in the Schedule and delineated on the map annexed to this Scheme.

" THE SCHEDULE.

" Part I.

"The territory to be annexed to the parish of Saint Luke, West Hartlepool:

"(a) All that part of the parish of Stranton (coloured pink on the map annexed hereto) which lies generally to the northwest of an imaginary line commencing at a point on the boundary between the parishes of Saint Paul, West Hartlepool, and Stranton opposite the middle of the road which leads from Elwick Road to Tunstall Hall and proceeding thence southwestwards to and along the middle of the said road to a point opposite the middle of the footpath which leads from close number 230 into the footpath from Southbrook Farm to Dalton Piercy and thence continuing first southeastwards to and then southeastwards and southwards along the middle of the first mentioned footpath to its end and in the same straight line to the middle of the footpath

from Southbrook Farm to Dalton Piercy and thence generally westwards along the middle of the last mentioned footpath to the boundary between the parish of Hart and the parish of Stranton.

"(b) All that part of the parish of Hart (coloured green on the map annexed hereto) which lies to the southeast of an imaginary line commencing at a point on the boundary between the parishes of Stranton and Hart in the middle of Duchy Road and continuing thence northwards along the middle of the said road and in the same straight line to the middle of Elwick Road and thence eastwards along the middle of Elwick Road to a point opposite the southern end of the footpath which leads northeastwards from Elwick Road to High Throston and continuing thence northwards to and northwards and northeastwards along the middle of the said footpath to the southern boundary of close number 425 and thence generally eastwards along the southern boundaries of closes numbered 425 and 427 to their end and thence in the same straight line to the middle of Hart Lane and thence northwards along the middle of Hart Lane to a point opposite the middle of Throston Grange Lane and thence northeastwards to and along the middle of Throston Grange Lane to a point opposite the southern end of the western boundary of close number 283 and thence northwards to and along the said boundary to the boundary between the parish of Hart and the parish of Holy Trinity, Hartlepool.

" Part II.

"The territory to be annexed to the parish of Saint Aidan, West Hartlepool:

"All that part of the parish of Stranton (coloured brown on the map annexed hereto) which lies to the south of the area described in paragraph (a) of Part I of this Schedule and to the west and south of an imaginary line commencing at the point on the boundary between the parishes of Saint Aidan, West Hartlepool and Stranton in the middle of Cornwall Street opposite the end of Rugby Street proceeding thence westwards along the middle of Cornwall Street to its end and thence in the same straight line to and southwards along the middle of Shewsbury Street to its end and in the same straight line to and southwestwards along the middle of Oxford Road to its end and in the same straight line to and northwards along the middle of Catcote Road to a point opposite the middle of Masefield Road and thence westwards to and along the middle of Masefield Road to the western boundary of the County Borough of West Hartlepool and thence northeastwards, eastwards and thence northwards along the said boundary to the southern boundary of the area described in paragraph (a) of Part I of this Schedule."

And whereas the provisions of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme, have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Durham.

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 8th day of October, 1956, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, and the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which we have prepared with the consent of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Arthur Michael, Archbishop of York, (in witness whereof he has signed the Scheme) for

effecting the unions of (1) the benefice of Brompton and the Chapelry of Deighton (now part of the benefice of Northallerton) and (2) the benefice of Kirby Sigston and the remaining part of the said benefice of Northallerton, all of which benefices and parishes are situate in the diocese of York.

" SCHEME.

"1. *Union of the benefice of Brompton and the Chapelry of Deighton.*

"(1) The Chapelry of Deighton comprising all that part of the parish of the benefice of Northallerton which is included within the area of the civil parish of Deighton shall be severed from the benefice of Northallerton and the Chapelry of Deighton so severed and the benefice of Brompton shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Brompton with Deighton' and one parish for ecclesiastical purposes.

"(2) *Parish church.* The parish church of the parish of Brompton shall be the parish church of the united parish.

"(3) *Parsonage house.* The parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Brompton shall be the house of residence of the incumbent of the united benefice.

"(4) *Patronage.* After the union has taken effect the right of presentation to the united benefice shall be exercised solely by the patron of the said benefice of Brompton.

"2. *Union of the benefice of Kirby Sigston and the benefice of Northallerton.*

"(1) The benefice of Kirby Sigston and the remaining part of the aforesaid benefice of Northallerton shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Northallerton with Kirby Sigston', but the parishes of the said benefices shall continue in all respects distinct.

"(2) *Parsonage house.* The parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Northallerton shall be the house of residence of the incumbent of the united benefice.

"(3) *Provision for a curate or clerical or lay assistance.* Upon the union taking effect (a) the incumbent of the united benefice shall employ a curate or such clerical or lay assistance to assist him in performing the duties of the united benefice as the Archbishop of York may from time to time direct and (b) there shall be appropriated as a fund towards the cost of providing such assistance as aforesaid a part of the endowments of the united benefice, that is to say a capital sum sufficient to produce an annual income of £250 and being part of a larger sum at present held by us for the endowment of the said benefice of Northallerton, and the said annual income shall be paid by us to the diocesan board of finance of the said diocese as trustees to apply the same accordingly.

"(4) *Patronage.* With the consent of the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Christ and Blessed Mary the Virgin, Durham (hereinafter referred to as 'the said Dean and Chapter') being the patrons of the benefice of Northallerton, and with the consent of Her Royal Highness Princess Victoria Alexandra Alice Mary, the Princess Royal, of Harewood House, Leeds, in the County of Yorkshire and of the Right Honourable Sir Alan Frederick Lascelles of Saint James's Palace, in the County of London, the Personal Representatives of the late Henry George Charles, Earl of Harewood, being the patrons of the said benefice of Kirby Sigston (which consents have been given to us in writing), the patronage of the benefice of Kirby Sigston shall be surrendered in favour of the said Dean and Chapter, and the patronage of the united benefice of Northallerton with Kirby Sigston shall belong wholly to and be exercisable by the said Dean and Chapter.

"3. *Taking effect of unions.*

"Upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette the unions hereinbefore recommended and proposed shall forthwith take effect and the Reverend William Bent Seaton if he is then incumbent of the said benefice of Brompton shall, with his consent, (which has been given to us in writing) be the first incumbent of the united benefice of Brompton with Deighton and the Reverend Stephen Searby Thistlewood if he is then incumbent

of the said benefice of Northallerton shall, with his consent, (which has been given to us in writing) be the first incumbent of the united benefice of Northallerton with Kirby Sigston.

"4. Endowments.

"Upon the taking effect of the unions hereinbefore recommended and proposed, the endowments and property belonging to the benefice of Northallerton shall be divided and distributed as follows, that is to say:—

"(a) a capital sum sufficient to produce an annual income of £330 being part of a larger capital sum now held by us as part of the endowments of the benefice of Northallerton shall be assigned and annexed to the united benefice of Brompton with Deighton,

"(b) all the endowments and property of the said benefice of Northallerton not otherwise annexed or appropriated by provisions of this Scheme shall be assigned and annexed to the united benefice of Northallerton with Kirby Sigston."

And whereas the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, the Union of Benefices Rules, 1926 and 1930, and the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Church Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme the boundaries of the said parishes of Saint Bartholomew, Earley; Earley; Saint Luke, Reading; Christ Church, Whitley; Saint Giles, Reading; Saint Mary, Reading; Tilehurst; Saint George, Tilehurst; Holy Trinity, Reading; and the Grey Friars, Reading, shall be altered in the manner described in the Schedule and delineated on the maps annexed to this Scheme.

"THE SCHEDULE.

"1. The territory to be annexed to the parish of Saint Luke, Reading, comprising:—

"(a) All that part of the parish of Saint Bartholomew, Earley, (coloured pink on the map lettered 'A' annexed hereto) which lies to the southwest of the middle of Eastern Avenue, Wokingham Road, and London Road.
