 "(9) any payment to a curate or lay worker out of the benefice income,
 "(10) the annual payments in respect of capital and interest in respect of any mortgage of the benefice income,
 "(11) any pension paid to a retired incumbent out of the benefice income,
 "(12) any part of the benefice income diverted to the diocesan stipends fund pursuant to an Order under Section 12 of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949."

And whereas the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, the Union of Benefices Rules, 1926 and 1930, and the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that it shall be and become effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette.

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 26th day of October, 1956, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which we have prepared with the consent of the Right Reverend Alwyn, Bishop of Winchester (in witness whereof he has signed the Scheme), for authorising the taking down of the church of Saint Maurice, Winchester, except for the tower, and for the sale of the materials and site of the said church which is situate in the united parish of Saint Lawrence and Saint Maurice, Winchester, in the diocese of Winchester.

"SCHEME.

"1. So soon as conveniently may be after the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette—

"(a) the church of Saint Maurice, Winchester shall, with the exception of the tower thereof, be taken down;

"(b) such portion of the site of the said church, with the tower standing thereon, as is enclosed by red verge on the plan annexed to this Scheme shall (subject to the agreement of the Mayor, Aldermen and Citizens of the City of Winchester) be conveyed by us, the said Church Commissioners, to the said Mayor, Aldermen and Citizens of the City of Winchester as an open space in perpetuity and such conveyance shall be subject to such special conditions as to the maintenance and preservation of the tower of the said church and as to other relevant matters as may be mutually agreed between us, the said Church Commissioners, and the said Mayor, Aldermen and Citizens of the City of Winchester;

"(c) the materials and the remainder of the site of the said church, together with any ground annexed thereto and necessary for the use and enjoyment thereof shall be sold and disposed of by us, the said Church Commissioners, at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient subject to the conditions and restrictions imposed by the said Measures.

"2. The net proceeds to arise from such sales, after payment of the expenses attendant thereon and upon the taking down of the church (excepting the tower) and all other expenses incidental to these matters, shall be applied by us as follows, that is

to say, so much thereof as shall be agreed between us, the said Church Commissioners, and the Bishop of Winchester, shall be held by us, the said Church Commissioners, for the augmentation of the capital endowment of the united benefice of Saint Lawrence and Saint Maurice, Winchester, and the residue thereof shall be applied as the said Bishop shall direct towards the cost of the erection of churches in the areas of recent housing development known as Weeke and Stanmore in the vicinity of the City of Winchester, or in either of the said areas, or to the erection of a church or parsonage house in any other new housing area in the immediate vicinity of the said City.

"3. So much of the furniture and fittings of the said church of Saint Maurice, Winchester, as may be conveniently used in the parish church of Saint Lawrence, Winchester, shall, subject to the approval of the Bishop of Winchester, be transferred thereto and, subject to the foregoing, the residue of the said furniture and fittings shall be transferred to such other church or chapel or churches or chapels in the diocese of Winchester as the said Bishop may direct or shall (with the exception of the font, communion table and plate used for the purpose of the Holy Communion) be sold, and in such case the proceeds shall be added to the fund arising from the sale of the site and materials of the said church (excepting the tower) of Saint Maurice, Winchester."

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 21st day of January, 1957, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, have prepared and humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for constituting a new parish to be taken out of the parish of Clifton with Glapton in the diocese of Southwell.

"SCHEME.

"Whereas we, the Church Commissioners are satisfied that the spiritual interests of the area defined in the Schedule hereto and delineated on the map hereto annexed would be best served by constituting it a new parish:

"And whereas we are satisfied that a suitable endowment therefor will be provided:

"And whereas we have not approved any consecrated church within the area as suitable to be the parish church of the new parish:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Russell, Bishop of Southwell (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and affixed his episcopal seal to this Scheme), we, the said Church Commissioners do humbly recommend and propose as follows, that is to say:—

"1. *Constitution.*

"(a) As from the date of the licence hereto of a Minister the area defined in the Schedule hereto and delineated on the map hereto annexed shall be a separate district for spiritual purposes.

"(b) As from the date of the consecration of a church within the area approved by us, the said Church Commissioners, as suitable to be a parish church, or if the church is consecrated before such approval, the date of the approval, the said area shall become a new parish.

"(c) The name of the district (or parish as the case may be) shall be 'The District (or Parish) of Saint Francis, Clifton'.
