The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 11th day of *January*, 1957 (N.P. 5828/56) in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council;

"And whereas under various Orders in Council, rates and conditions of award of retired pay, pensions, terminal grants and gratuities have been laid down for Officers, Commissioned Branch Officers, Petty Officers, Non-Commissioned Officers and Men of Your Majesty's Royal Navy and Royal Marines; for Officers and Ratings of the Women's Royal Naval Service; and for members of Queen Alexandra's Royal Naval Nursing Service;

"And whereas we are of opinion that revised service retired pay and pensions regulations should be introduced;

"We beg humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to authorise us to award retired pay, pensions, terminal grants and gratuities at the rates and subject to the conditions specified in the Schedules annexed hereto.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified Their concurrence in these proposals.

"SCHEDULE I.

"SECTION 1.

"Half Pay and Terminal Grants for Admirals of the Fleet.

"1.—(a) An Admiral of the Fleet will be eligible during periods subsequent to 31st March, 1956, for

"(a) *General List Officers, and Medical, Dental and Instructor Officers.*

which he does not receive full pay, for half pay at the rate of £2,300 a year.

"(b) An Admiral of the Fleet granted half pay on termination of full pay service after 31st December, 1955, may be awarded a terminal grant of £6,900, free of income tax, in addition to his half pay.

"An Admiral of the Fleet who has been awarded a terminal grant under this clause shall not be eligible for any further terminal grant on the conclusion of any subsequent period of full pay service.

"SECTION II.

"Service Retired Pay for Permanent Royal Navy and Royal Marine Officers.

"2. The provisions of this Section relate to officers holding permanent commissions in the Royal Navy or Royal Marines, including officers of the Shore Wireless Service and officers transferred to the Royal Navy from the Royal Naval Reserve or the Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve and officers of the former Air Branch eligible for retired pay, who retire from the Active List on or after 1st January, 1956. They do not apply to officers holding temporary or short service commissions. The rates of retired pay are effective from 1st April, 1956, but all officers retired on or after 1st January, 1956, will receive the new rates of retired pay as from 1st April, 1956.

"3. *Retirement for age or non-employment.* An officer retiring on or after attaining the age limit fixed for service in his rank and Branch, or, it having been decided that further employment is not available for him, retired compulsorily before attaining that age limit, may be granted retired pay, provided that he has completed at least 20 years' qualifying service as defined in Clauses 27 to 29 below.

"4. The rate of retired pay will be based on the officer's rank for retired pay purposes, as defined in Clauses 24 and 25, and on the length of his reckonable service as defined in Clause 30.

"5. If the officer's reckonable service is not less than the standard service period for his rank for retired pay purposes, he will be granted retired pay at the standard rate for that rank as follows:—

"Notes:

(a) Certain Royal Marine officers will retain a reserved right to be awarded, if otherwise eligible, retired pay at the rate of £625 a year even though nine years' service as Lieutenant (B.L.)/Captain (S.D. List) have not been completed.

(b) Officers promoted to the rank of Commander (Special Duties) after 1st January, 1957, will be eligible for retired pay at the rates for General List officers of equivalent rank.

"6. When the officer's reckonable service is less than the standard service period for his rank for retired pay purposes, the award of retired pay will be at the standard rate for that rank reduced by one deduction, according to the following scale, for each quarter of a year, or part of a quarter, of the deficiency

Rate of Retired Pay	Each Deduction
Above £1,200 a year	£15 a quarter
£1,200 and above £1,000 a year ...	£12 10s. a quarter
£1,000 and above £800 a year ...	£10 a quarter

"Deductions will be made successively until the number of deductions due to be made has been completed, and each deduction in turn will be of the amount appropriate to the rate remaining after the preceding deduction.

"7. Where in the interests of the service an officer was granted a permanent regular commission at an age later than that of the normal entrant, and has in consequence of his late entry not completed 20 years' qualifying service at the time of his compulsory retirement for age or non-employment, retired pay as provided in Clauses 5 and 6 may nevertheless be granted at the discretion of the Admiralty, provided he has completed at least 15 years' qualifying service.

"8. *Retirement for non-promotion.* Where it is decided that an officer shall be compulsorily retired in the interests of the Service on the ground that he has been superseded for further promotion, he may be granted retired pay as if he had retired for non-employment.

"9. *Voluntary retirement.* An officer with at least 20 years' qualifying service who is permitted to retire at his own request, may be granted retired pay computed as follows:—

"(a) If he is, at the time of retirement, within two years of the age limit fixed for service in his rank and branch, or specialisation, his retired pay will be computed as if he had retired compulsorily for non-employment.

"(b) In other cases, his retired pay will be at the rate for which he would have been eligible had he continued to serve in his rank for retired pay purposes until compulsorily retired at the age limit for that rank, less one deduction on the scale set out in Clause 6 above for each quarter of a year, or part of a quarter, by which the difference between his age on retirement and the said age limit exceeds two years, with a further deduction of 10 per cent. from the amount so calculated (NOTE: if a Captain, R.N. retires voluntarily with less than six years' service in the rank, the deductions will be made from the standard rate for an officer with less than that period of service in the rank). Instead of the ages prescribed from time to time for compulsory retirement for General List officers the ages listed below may be used for calculating the rate of retired pay to be awarded on voluntary retirement:

Admiral	60 years
Vice Admiral	59 years
Rear Admiral	57 years
Captain	52 years

*Officers entered into the R.N. before
1st May, 1957*

Commander	50 years
Lieutenant-Commander	45 years

"10. *Invaliding.* An officer who is invalided, with at least 10 years' qualifying service, will be granted retired pay as follows:—

"(a) If he has 20 or more years' qualifying service, the award will be assessed as for compulsory retirement for non-employment under Clauses 3 to 6.

"(b) If his qualifying service is less than 20 years, his retired pay will be computed as follows:—

"(i) *Officers other than Chaplains and those officers otherwise provided for in sub-clause (ii) below:*

from the award for which he would have been eligible under sub-paragraph (a) had he completed 20 years' qualifying service and then retired in the rank of Lieutenant-Commander, Royal Navy, or Captain, Royal Marines, or his existing rank, if higher, a deduction will be made of twice the amount laid down in Clause 6 for

each quarter of a year or part of a quarter by which his qualifying service falls short of 20 years.

"(ii) *Branch Officers or Special Duties Officers:* Commissioned Officer (B.L.) or Sub-Lieutenant (S.D. List) or Second Lieutenant (S.D. List), R.M.—£230 a year for 10 years' reckonable service, with additions at the rate of £4 5s. a year for each complete quarter of a year of further service. An officer who has not 10 years' reckonable service will be entitled, if he has 12 years' actual service, to invaliding pension on the ratings' scale with the special rank elements for service as an officer as set out in Clause 2 of Schedule III.

Senior Commissioned Officer (B.L.) or Lieutenant (S.D. List), R.N. or R.M.—£270 a year for 10 years' reckonable service, with additions at the rate of £4 10s. a year for each complete quarter of a year of further service.

Lieutenant (B.L.) or Lieutenant Commander (S.D. List), R.N. or Captain (S.D. List) R.M., and above—From the award for which he would have been eligible under sub-paragraph (a) above had he completed 20 years' qualifying service and then retired in his existing rank, a deduction will be made of twice the amount laid down in Clause 6 for each quarter of a year, or part of a quarter, by which his qualifying service falls short of 20 years.

"Where the circumstances leading to an officer's invaliding are due to the officer's own fault, or to causes within his control, the grant and amount of retired pay will be at the discretion of the Admiralty, but will not exceed the award for which he may be eligible under this Clause.

"11. *Retirement for incapacity, unsuitability, or inefficiency not within the officer's control.* An officer who is retired for incapacity, unsuitability or for inefficiency, not due to causes within his own control, and having at least 20 years' qualifying service, may be granted retired pay as for a compulsory retirement on account of non-employment. An officer having between 15 and 20 years' qualifying service may be granted retired pay not exceeding the rate calculated on the scale for voluntary retirement, or the invaliding rate whichever is the lower.

"12. *Retirement for causes within the officer's control.* An officer who is retired for incapacity, unsuitability or inefficiency due to causes within his own control, but not amounting to misconduct, and having at least 20 years' qualifying service may be granted an award of retired pay at such rate as the Admiralty may determine, but not in any event exceeding the retired pay rate which would have been admissible had he retired at his own request.

"13. *Retirement etc. for misconduct.*

"(a) An officer who is retired for misconduct with at least 20 years' qualifying service, may be granted retired pay at such rate as the Admiralty may determine, but not in any event exceeding 90 per cent. of the rate of retired pay which would have been admissible had he retired at his own request.

"(b) *Dismissal etc.*—An officer with at least 20 years' qualifying service who is dismissed the Service or dismissed with disgrace by sentence of Court Martial or whose name has been removed from the List of Officers or who has been deprived of retired pay following the removal of his name from the List of Retired Officers or who has been allowed to resign his commission to avoid trial by Court Martial, may be granted a compassionate allowance at Admiralty discretion, but not in any event exceeding 90 per cent. of the rate of retired pay which would have been admissible had he retired at his own request.

"14. The Admiralty may, in the exercise of their discretion under Clauses 12 and 13 grant a gratuity, or compassionate gratuity, in place of retired pay or compassionate allowance.

"15. *Special rules relating to officers promoted from the lower deck.* The following special rules will apply in the case of an officer promoted to a permanent commission while serving on a normal regular engagement, and who serves continuously until retired:—

"(a) He may be granted retired pay on compulsory retirement for age or non-employment, assessed as in Clauses 3 to 7, notwithstanding that he may have less than 20 years' reckonable service, provided that he has at least 15 years' reckonable service and at

least 22 years' service reckonable for the purpose of rating's pension calculated as in Clauses 8 to 12 of Schedule III; or

"(b) he may be granted the service pension for which he would qualify under the rules laid down in Schedule III as applicable to ratings, such award being in place of any retired pay or other award under this Section.

"16. *Chaplains.* Chaplains will not be eligible for awards under the foregoing Clauses, except as provided in sub-paragraph (d) of this Clause. Retired pay will be awarded if the chaplain has completed at least 20 years' qualifying service, or at least 15 years' qualifying service if compulsorily retired for age, or 10 years' qualifying service if invalided.

"Retired pay will be assessed as follows:—

"(a) In the case of compulsory retirement for age or non-employment:—

On completion of 22 years' reckonable service	£625 a year
Addition for each complete quarter of a year of reckonable service up to the 27th year inclusive	£8 15s. a year
Addition for each complete quarter of a year of reckonable service from the 28th to 30th year inclusive	£10 a year
Up to a maximum of	£920 a year

If a chaplain has less than 22 years' reckonable service the rate of his retired pay will be calculated by making one deduction from the rate of £625 a year, on the scale set out in Clause 6, for each quarter of a year, or part of a quarter, by which the reckonable service falls short of 22 years.

"(b) A chaplain permitted to retire at his own request will be eligible for retired pay assessed as in sub-paragraph (a) above, but unless his retirement takes place within two years before the age limit fixed for service in his Branch, the retired pay rate will be reduced by 10 per cent.

"(c) A chaplain who is invalided may be granted retired pay as follows:—

"(i) If he has 20 or more years' qualifying service, the award will be assessed as for compulsory retirement for non-employment under sub-paragraph (a) above.

"(ii) If his qualifying service is less than 20 years, his retired pay will be computed as follows:—

From the award for which he would have been eligible under sub-paragraph (c) (i) had he completed 20 years' qualifying service and then retired, a deduction will be made of twice the amount laid down in Clause 6 for each quarter of a year, or part of a quarter, by which his qualifying service falls short of 20 years.

"(d) A chaplain leaving the Service in the circumstances referred to in Clauses 11 to 14 above, may be granted an award on the basis of those Clauses

"17. *The Chaplain of the Fleet.* The Chaplain of the Fleet may be granted retired pay as follows, provided he has completed the appropriate period of qualifying service as set out in Clause 16 above:—

"(a) If he has completed 28 years' reckonable service and (unless invalided) at least two years as Chaplain of the Fleet ... £1,275 a year.

"(b) If he has less than 28 years' reckonable service, his retired pay rate will be arrived at by one deduction from the rate of £1,275 a year, on the scale set out in Clause 6 for each quarter of a year, or part of a quarter, by which his reckonable service falls short of 28 years.

SECTION III.

"Terminal Grants in Addition to Service Retired Pay.

"18. Any officer retired from the Active List on or after 1st January, 1956, and awarded retired pay under Section II of this Schedule, may be awarded a terminal grant, in addition to his retired pay, under the following conditions:—

"(a) The standard rate of grant will in all cases be three times the annual amount of the retired pay awarded.

"(b) An officer can qualify only once for a grant.

"(c) The grant will be free of income tax.

"19. A terminal grant under Clause 18 shall not be admissible in the case of an officer to whom Clause 13 (b) applies, but a tax-free compassionate

grant not exceeding three times the annual amount of the compassionate allowance may be awarded at the discretion of the Admiralty.

"SECTION IV.

"Service Gratuities for Permanent Officers.

"20. Officers other than those on the Special Duties List may on retirement on or after 1st January, 1956, if ineligible for service retired pay, be granted a gratuity as follows:—

"(a) On compulsory retirement for age or non-employment or on retirement at own request, with at least 10 years qualifying service:—

For the first 10 years' qualifying service	£1,000
For each further year's qualifying service, an addition of	£200
Subject to a maximum gratuity of £2,800.	

"Officers transferred to the Permanent List from the Reserves or from temporary service or while holding Supplementary List or Short Service or Extended Service Commissions, will not be eligible for gratuities on voluntary retirement unless they have rendered five years' service from the date of transfer to the permanent list.

"(b) On invaliding with less than the ten years' service required to qualify for retired pay, a gratuity at the rate of £150 a year, subject to a maximum of £1,350.

"(c) If retired on account of incapacity, unsuitability or inefficiency not due to causes within the officer's control:—

If with 10 or more years' qualifying service, a gratuity as in sub-paragraph (a) above.

If with less than 10 years' qualifying service, a gratuity at the discretion of the Admiralty, not exceeding the following:—

With less than 2 years' qualifying service	Nil
With 2 years' qualifying service	£75
With 3 years' qualifying service	£150
With 4 years' qualifying service	£225
With 5 years' qualifying service	£300
With 6 years' qualifying service	£375
With 7 years' qualifying service	£450
With 8 years' qualifying service	£525
With 9 years' qualifying service	£600

"(d) If retired for incapacity, unsuitability or inefficiency or other cause within his own control, but not amounting to misconduct, with at least 10 years' qualifying service, a gratuity of such amount as the Admiralty may determine, but not in any event exceeding the amount which would have been admissible under sub-paragraph (a) above had the officer retired at his own request.

"(e) If retired for misconduct, or on termination of commission for any of the reasons set out in Clause 13 (b), with at least 10 years' qualifying service, a gratuity, or a compassionate gratuity, if the Admiralty so decide and of such amount as they may determine, but not in any event exceeding 90 per cent., of the award which would have been admissible had the officer retired at his own request.

"Branch Officers or Special Duties Officers

"21. If permitted to retire at their own request with insufficient service to qualify them for retired pay, a gratuity may be granted on the following scale, subject to the completion of a minimum period of twelve years' actual service from the age of 18:—

"(i) Rating Service

For each year of reckonable service in excess of five years up to ten years	£10
For each year of reckonable service in excess of 10 years up to 14 years...	£25
For each year of reckonable service in excess of 14 years up to 17 years...	£35
For each year of reckonable service in excess of 17 years	£40

"(ii) Officer Service

For each year of reckonable service as Commissioned Officer (B.L.) R.N. or R.M. or Sub-Lieutenant (S.D. List), R.N. or Second Lieutenant (S.D. List), R.M. £75 normally, but £100 for each complete year served after completion of 12 years' total service.

For each year of reckonable service as Senior Commissioned Officer (B.L.) R.N. or R.M. or Lieutenant (S.D. List) R.N. or R.M. or above

£135

"An officer with sufficient service to qualify for an award of retired pay, or for an award of pension on the ratings' scale (with special rank increments for service as officer), will not be eligible for an alternative award of gratuity on the foregoing scale.

"Voluntary retirements with a gratuity on the scale laid down above will be allowable at the discretion of the Admiralty in exceptional circumstances only.

"22. If retired for misconduct, or on termination of commission for any of the reasons set out in Clause 13 (b), with at least twelve years' actual service from age 18, a gratuity or a compassionate gratuity may be allowed at the discretion of the Admiralty, but not in any event exceeding 90 per cent. of the award which would have been admissible under Clause 21 had the officer retired at his own request.

"(Note: Any officer who has served on a rating's engagement carrying a title to rating's gratuity on completing at least ten years' service after age 18, will have a reserved right to an award under Clauses 21 and 22 on completion of ten years' such service instead of twelve years.)

"23. If invalided with less than 10 years' qualifying service and with insufficient service to qualify for a pension on the ratings' scale, a gratuity at the rate of £115 a year for each complete year of qualifying service may be granted.

"SECTION V.

"Rank for Retired Pay Purposes.

"24. Subject to the following Clauses, the rank for retired pay purposes shall be the substantive rank held by the officer on his retirement, provided that, unless the officer is invalided, the rank had been held on the Active List for the following minimum period:—

"If the substantive rank has been held for less than the period specified, the rank for retired pay purposes shall be the highest substantive rank which (with periods spent in higher substantive rank) satisfies the condition.

"25. Service as Acting Captain, Royal Navy, up to 31st October, 1957, inclusive, may be reckoned towards the requirement of six years' service as Captain irrespective of the date of substantive promotion.

"Additions to Retired Pay for Service in Paid Acting Rank.

"26. Where an officer has for a year or more held paid acting rank above his rank for retired pay purposes, he may be granted an addition to the retired pay for which he is otherwise eligible, calculated as follows:—

"(a) For each year (subject to a maximum of three) for which the paid acting rank was held, there may be added one-third of the difference between the retired pay for which the officer is eligible and the retired pay for which he would have been eligible had his rank for retired pay purposes been one rank above his substantive rank.

"(b) Where substantive rank is not otherwise reckonable for retired pay, it may be reckoned as if it were paid acting rank for the purpose of an addition under (a) above.

"The provisions of this Clause shall cease to have effect in respect of retirements after the 31st October, 1957. An officer retiring subsequently, will, however, be eligible to receive, as a reserved right, the retired pay which he might have been given had he retired on the 31st October, 1957, for the same cause, based on his rank and service up to that date. For the purpose of this reserved right the substantive rank held on the 31st October, 1957, may be regarded as the rank for retired pay purposes, even if it had not then been held for the period specified in Clause 24 above as a necessary qualification for the retired pay of that rank, provided the appropriate period in the substantive rank is in fact subsequently completed.

"Qualifying Service for Service Retired Pay and Gratuities.

"27. The following periods may be included in assessing qualifying service for the purpose of the foregoing Clauses, subject to the conditions set out:—

"(a) Subject to Clause 31, full pay commissioned service (including mobilised or embodied service or for the purpose of training) as an officer of the Royal Navy, the Royal Marines, the Army or the Royal Air Force or of the Auxiliary and Reserve Forces, and of the former Armed Forces of India or Burma, or of the Armed Forces of the Commonwealth or a Colony, provided that such service would be reckonable as qualifying service under Army or Royal Air Force regulations; except broken periods each of less than six months' duration.

"(b) While a permanent regular officer, periods in appointments not remunerated from Naval Funds, in respect of which the conditions of Clause 29 are satisfied.

"(c) Periods before 1st August, 1938, on unemphed pay, or on half-pay not following the sentence of a Court Martial or the expiration of full pay sick leave, will reckon as service in full up to a maximum of six months in any one period or two years in all. Any such service not reckoning in full under the above rule will reckon as a third, subject to a maximum of six years such service reckoning as two years.

"(d) Loss of seniority or time forfeited by sentence of Court Martial or Disciplinary Court will not involve loss of service for retired pay or gratuity.

"(e) (i) *In full*: Service as Branch Officer; or Acting Sub-Lieutenant; or Second Lieutenant, Royal Marines (not below the age of 20); and in higher ranks.

(ii) *In half*: Service (not below the age of 18) as Midshipman or Cadet; or as Second Lieutenant, Royal Marines under the age of 20.

"(f) Service below commissioned rank which would be admissible as service for pension under clauses 8 to 12 of Schedule III, to the following extent:—

"(i) *In full*: Service which would earn rank element of pension in the rank of Regimental Sergeant Major, Royal Marines, or of Warrant Officer, Class I, in the Army or the Royal Air Force.

"(ii) *In half*: other service.

"28. Service preceding a five year interval in service shall not be included unless specially allowed by the Admiralty, and eligibility to reckon such previous service will normally be determined at the time of resumption of service. Where, during a break in service the officer has been a member of the Royal Naval Reserve, the Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve, or other reserve of any of the Forces, undertaking or liable for periodical training, the period of such membership will not be considered an interval in service for the purpose of deciding whether the previous service is admissible.

"29. The appointments not remunerated from Naval Funds, referred to in Clause 27 (b) above, which may be allowed as qualifying service are those which it may be decided by the Admiralty can reasonably be regarded as part of an officer's career as such. They shall be appointments to which the officer brings his naval knowledge, and from which he acquires additional experience, and which have been officially offered to him as part of his Naval service.

"Reckonable Service for Retired Pay.

"30. The reckonable service for retired pay shall be so much of an officer's qualifying service as was given after attaining age 21 years provided that if he served on the lower deck or in the ranks of the Royal Marines before he was commissioned, his qualifying service as a rating or an other rank, given before age 21, may be included, subject to the total service so reckoned being not greater than would have been reckonable had he been commissioned at age 21.

"Counting of Previous Service for which a non-effective Award has been Received.

"31. (a) In the case of previous service in respect of which the officer received a service gratuity, or in any case of previous service other than in the Royal Navy, the Royal Marines, the Army, or the Royal Air Force, it may be stipulated as a condition for allowing such service to reckon for retired pay,

that the officer shall make a payment to Naval Funds, either in a lump sum or otherwise. In default of such payment as may have been stipulated, the previous service will not be allowed.

"(b) If an officer has continued to draw concurrently with full pay the retired pay or other analogous award payable in respect of previous service, the further service will normally not confer eligibility for improved benefits on final termination of employment.

" SECTION VI.

" Regular Seamen and Royal Marines granted Temporary Special Duties or Branch (formerly Warrant) rank and eligible for retired pay under Section IV of Order in Council of 28th July, 1949.

" 32. For officers retiring on or after 1st January, 1956, the basic rates and rank elements will be as follows with effect from 1st April, 1956:—

" 33. Terminal grants will be payable on the same basis as laid down in Section III for permanent officers.

" 34. Pension and terminal grant on the ratings' scales set out in Schedule III may be granted in lieu of awards calculated in accordance with Clauses 32 and 33 above.

" 35. Regular seamen and Royal Marines promoted to Temporary Special Duties or Branch rank on or after 1st December, 1951, are eligible only for awards on the ratings' scales laid down in Schedule III.

" SECTION VII.

" Gratuities in respect of Short Service Commissions.

" 36. An officer holding a Short Service Commission in the Royal Navy under terms which provide for the payment of gratuity may, if the full period of Active List service he has undertaken is satisfactorily completed on or after 1st January, 1956, be granted a gratuity at the following rates:—

" (a) *Pilots and Observers.*

" (i) Officers serving on an eight-year commission ...	£1,500
" (ii) Officers serving on a four-year commission ...	£680
(Subject to deduction of £5 for every month of excess training due to back-classing)	

except that officers whose flying training began before 1st May, 1954, will only be awarded a gratuity calculated at the rate of £175 a year from date of transfer or from date of qualifying for flying badge, if later, the resultant amount being increased by one-third.

" (iii) Former Short Service or Extended Service Commission or Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve officers serving on a commission of four or more years but less than eight years

duration who, before undertaking this further period of service, were already qualified as pilot or observer £175 for each year of further service.

" (iv) Commissioned Pilots (Branch List)/Sub-Lieutenants (Special Duties) and Lieutenants promoted therefrom—

Aircrew service after age 18 as rating and Commissioned Pilot/Sub-Lieutenant (Special Duties) £67 10s. a year
Time as rating to count as single time, and time as officer to count as double time except that the first two years of aircrew service will count as single time only.
Service as Lieutenant ... £175 a year.

" (b) *Medical Officers.*
£200 for each year of service.

" (c) *Dental Officers.*
£170 for each year of service.

" (d) *Chaplains.*
£100 for each year of service.

" (e) *Air Traffic Control Officers.*
£135 for each year of service except that service below the rank of Acting Sub-Lieutenant will reckon only at the rate of £95 a year.

" (f) *Other Officers.*
£135 for each year of service.

" 37. Should the officer fail to complete the full period of Active List service which he has undertaken, an award may nevertheless be made as follows:—

" (a) If his service is terminated on account of disability not due to causes within his own control, he will be granted a gratuity proportionate to the length of Active List Service he has actually completed.

" (b) If his service is terminated for non-employment, or for incapacity, unsuitability or inefficiency not due to causes within his own control, or if he is permitted voluntarily to terminate his service within six months of the completion of the full period of Active List service he has undertaken, he may be awarded either a gratuity proportionate to the length of Active List service he has actually completed or a reduced gratuity at such rate as the Admiralty may determine.

" (c) In other circumstances, no gratuity will in any event be payable to a Pilot or Observer unless he has completed at least eighteen months' satisfactory service and is in possession of the flying badge, nor to an officer of any other Branch unless he has completed at least one year's satisfactory service. If his service is thereafter terminated owing to disability due to causes within his own control, or to inefficiency or other cause within his own control but not amounting to misconduct, or if he is permitted voluntarily to terminate his service more than six months before the conclusion of the period he had undertaken, he may be allowed, at Admiralty discretion, such gratuity as may be determined, but not in any event exceeding three quarters of the amount proportionate to the length of his actual service on the Active List.

" (d) If his service is terminated on account of misconduct, the special payment of a compassionate gratuity shall be within the discretion of the Admiralty according to the circumstances of his case, but the award will not in any event exceed 90 per cent. of the gratuity which would have been admissible had he left voluntarily.

" 38. No part of a short service gratuity will be payable to the officer's estate or otherwise, in the event of his death before completion of the period of Active List service he had undertaken.

" 39. If an officer serving on a short service commission continues on full pay beyond the period of Active List service which he had undertaken, payment of the gratuity will be deferred until the end of such further service. Similarly, in the event of an officer leaving the Royal Navy to undertake a commission in the Army or Royal Air Force, any gratuity due in respect of his naval service will be withheld until his further service terminates.

" 40. A short service commission officer who is granted a permanent commission will not be eligible for any gratuity in respect of his service on a short

service commission, but his service on that commission may count towards an ultimate award of retired pay or gratuity as a permanent officer. If, after receipt of a gratuity in respect of short service an officer is granted a permanent commission, his previous service will not be reckonable towards an ultimate award of retired pay or gratuity as a permanent officer, unless satisfactory arrangements are made for the refund of the short service gratuity.

"41. Service on a short service commission in the medical, dental or education branches of the Royal Navy may, in certain circumstances, be treated as contributory service under the National Health Service (Superannuation) Regulations or under the Teachers' (Superannuation) Acts, as appropriate. Where service is so treated, both the employer's and the officer's contributions will be advanced by the Admiralty, and the total amount so advanced will be deducted from the gratuity for which the officer is eligible under the provisions of this Section. When contributions have been so advanced but, as a result of being transferred to the permanent list, the officer does not qualify for gratuity under this Section, no refund of contributions will be required from the officer, but service which counts for service retired pay or gratuity may not also count as reckonable service for purposes of pension under the appropriate civil superannuation scheme.

"SECTION VIII.

"Retired Officers of the Royal Navy and Royal Marines.

"Re-employment in Peace-time.

"42. Except as provided in Section IX, an officer who is on retired pay may, while re-employed in or for training or on any authorised naval duty for periods not exceeding six consecutive months or aggregating six months or less in any twelve months, continue to draw his retired pay concurrently with any pay to which he is entitled; but payment of retired pay may be suspended when there is doubt about the duration of the period of re-employment. No retired pay will be payable when the period of re-employment exceeds six months, and where the retired officer has commuted any part of the retired pay which would have been liable to suspension had he not commuted, a deduction equivalent to the amount commuted will be made from his pay.

"43. An officer whose service retired pay has been suspended under Clause 42 and who, having been placed on the Retired List before 1st January, 1956, is re-employed on or after that date without an actual break in service: will be eligible on reversion to the Retired List for awards of retired pay and terminal grant under the provisions in Schedule I as appropriate for officers retiring on or after 1st January, 1956, assessed on the basis of former service added to re-employed service.

"44. An officer whose service retired pay has been suspended under Clause 42 and who, having had a break in service not exceeding five years, is in re-employment on or after 1st January, 1956, may receive on reversion to the Retired List an award of retired pay assessed on the basis of former service added to re-employed service as follows:—

"(a) Under the provisions in Schedule I as appropriate for officers retiring on or after 1st January, 1956, provided that the period of re-employment is not less than three years, or that the officer originally retired on or after that date; but

"(b) If the officer originally retired before 1st January, 1956, and the period of re-employment is less than three years, normally under the provisions of Order in Council dated 30th January, 1952, as appropriate for officers retiring on or after 1st September, 1950: except that, if the officer's previous rate of retired pay was awarded under an earlier

Order in Council, assessment will instead be made in accordance with the provisions of such earlier Order in Council.

"If, during the period of re-employment, an officer has carried out duties clearly appropriate to a higher rank than the substantive rank which he last held on the Active List and has received the pay and allowances appropriate to such higher rank, this service may be allowed to reckon for assessment of a revised rate of retired pay on a similar basis to that laid down for an Active List officer in Clause 26.

"If the officer had originally retired at his own request, re-assessed retired pay under either (a) or (b) above will be on the basis of voluntary retirement, unless he is invalided from re-employment.

"45. An officer whose retired pay has been suspended under Clause 42 may receive, on reversion to the Retired List on or after 1st January, 1956, terminal grant or additional terminal grant for each complete year of the period of re-employed service (with a maximum of ten years) at the rate of one-tenth of the difference between three times the annual amount of retired pay awarded on termination of re-employment and the terminal grant (if any) previously awarded.

"46. An officer who originally retired at his own request with a gratuity only, may receive an additional gratuity of £135 for each completed year of re-employed service.

"SECTION IX.

"Retired Officers of the Royal Navy and Royal Marines: Re-employment in Emergency.

"47. On recall for service at a time of imminent national danger or of great emergency, or when re-employed with the armed forces on general mobilisation, one-half of the retired pay of a retired officer will remain in issue concurrently with the pay and allowances appropriate to his rank on re-employment. Any portion of the retired pay that has been commuted will be recovered from the retired pay remaining in issue, or, when this is insufficient to meet the liability, from his pay to the extent of the deficiency.

"48. For the purpose of applying the provisions of Clause 47 to a retired officer compulsorily recalled at a time of national emergency when general mobilisation has not been announced, the operative period will be determined by the Admiralty in consultation with the Lords Commissioners of H.M. Treasury.

"SCHEDULE II.

"Permanent Regular Officers of the Women's Royal Naval Service and Members of Queen Alexandra's Royal Naval Nursing Service.

"Officers.

(Note.—For the general purposes of the regulations in this Section the term 'Officer' shall include a member of Queen Alexandra's Royal Naval Nursing Service.)

"1. Except as otherwise provided in this Section, officers of the Women's Royal Naval Service and members of Queen Alexandra's Royal Naval Nursing Service holding appointments in the Permanent Service who retire from the Active List on or after 1st January, 1956, shall be granted retired pay or gratuities under the general conditions applicable to officers of the Royal Navy holding permanent regular commissions as prescribed in Schedule I, Section II.

"Service Retired Pay.

"2. If the officer's reckonable service is not less than the standard service period for her rank for retired pay purposes, she will be granted retired pay at the standard rate for that rank as follows, subject to fulfilment of the relevant conditions laid down in Clauses 7, 8 and 9:—

"3. Eligibility for retired pay will be dependent on the completion of the following minimum periods of qualifying service reckonable in accordance with Clause 14 below.

On retirement for any cause other than invaliding	20 years
On invaliding	10 years

"4. Where the officer's reckonable service is less than the standard period for her rank for retired pay purposes the award of retired pay will be at the standard rate for that rank reduced by one deduction, in accordance with the scale given in Clause 6 of Schedule I, for each quarter of a year, or part of a quarter, of the deficiency.

"5. Where, in the interests of the Service, an officer was granted a permanent regular commission at an age later than that of the normal entrant, and has in consequence of her late entry not completed 20 years' qualifying service at the time of her compulsory retirement for age or non-employment, retired pay as provided in Clauses 2, 4 and 7, may nevertheless be granted at the discretion of the Admiralty provided she has completed at least 15 years' qualifying service.

"6. An officer who was promoted to a permanent commission while serving on a normal regular engagement may be granted retired pay as provided in Clauses, 2, 4, and 7, notwithstanding that she may have less than 20 years' reckonable service, provided that she has at least 15 years' reckonable service and at least 22 years' service reckonable for the purpose of rating's pension calculated as in Clause 3 of Schedule IV.

"7. *Conditions necessary for the award of Standard Rates of Retired Pay.*

"(a) Subject to the conditions regarding length of service and service in the rank, retired pay at the standard rate is payable to an officer either

"(i) compulsorily retired on reaching the age limit for service in the rank, or

"(ii) compulsorily retired before reaching the age limit by reason of it having been decided that she will not be further employed or promoted.

"(b) An officer who retires for any cause other than invaliding must have completed two years' full pay service in the substantive rank to qualify for retired pay appropriate to the rank. If an officer has less than the qualifying period of service in the rank, her retired pay will be based on the highest rank for which she is so qualified.

"(c) To qualify for the full standard rate, an officer must have completed the appropriate period of service from age 21 specified in Clause 2 reckonable in accordance with Clause 14.

"8. *Voluntary Retirement.*

"(a) Officers who are allowed to retire at their own request, including those retiring on marriage, within two years before the date on which they attain the compulsory retiring age for their rank, will receive the rate of retired pay for which they are eligible by rank and length of service that would have been payable on compulsory retirement.

"(b) The rate of retired pay payable to an officer who is permitted to retire at her own request, including retirement on marriage (except as provided in sub-paragraph (a) above), will be at the rate which she would have received on compulsory retirement at the age limit for service in her rank reduced by one deduction on the scale shown in Schedule I, Clause 6, for each quarter of a year or part of a quarter by which her age falls short by more than two years of that age limit, with a further deduction of 10 per cent. of the resultant figure.

"9. *Invaliding.*

An officer invalided with a minimum of 10 years' qualifying service will be granted retired pay as follows:—

"(a) if she has 20 or more years' qualifying service, she will receive the rate of retired pay for which she would be eligible by rank and service had she been compulsorily retired;

"(b) if she has less than 20 but more than 10 years' qualifying service, she will receive retired pay on the following basis. From the retired pay for which she would have been eligible under (a) above had she completed 20 years' qualifying service and retired in the rank of First Officer, or Superintending

Sister (or Matron), or her substantive rank, if higher; a deduction will be made of twice the amount referred to in Schedule I, Clause 6 for each quarter of a year or part of a quarter by which her qualifying service falls short of 20 years.

"10. *Terminal Grants.*

Officers of the W.R.N.S. and members of the Q.A.R.N.N.S. will be eligible for Terminal Grants in addition to retired pay under the same general conditions as officers of the Royal Navy (see Schedule I, Section III).

"11. *Gratuities for Permanent Officers.*

"(a) *On Voluntary Retirement.* Gratuities at the following rates will be payable to officers who are allowed to retire voluntarily or are compulsorily retired otherwise than for unsuitability, incapacity or misconduct, but have insufficient service to qualify for retired pay.

A gratuity will not be payable on voluntary retirement unless the officer has held a permanent commission for five years, as well as having performed 10 years' qualifying service.

"(b) *On Invaliding.* Gratuity at the rate of £100 for each year of qualifying service, subject to a maximum of £900, will be payable to officers who are invalided with less than the 10 years' service required to qualify them for retired pay.

"(c) *Third Officers W.R.N.S.* who are compulsorily retired on completion of five years' service will be eligible for a gratuity of £450.

"12. *Gratuities for Short Service Officers.*

An officer of the Women's Royal Naval Service holding a short service commission or a member of Queen Alexandra's Royal Naval Nursing Service entered for short service may, if her service terminates on or after 1st January, 1956, be granted a gratuity as follows:—

"(a) *W.R.N.S.* Officers granted a Short Service Commission will be eligible, on the satisfactory completion of five years' such service, for a gratuity at the rate of £90 for each year of such service.

"(b) *Q.A.R.N.N.S.* Nursing Sisters entered for Short Service will, on the satisfactory completion of the period of service undertaken, receive a gratuity at the rate of £90 for each year of Short Service.

Should an officer or nursing sister fail to complete the full period of service she has undertaken, an award may nevertheless be made, subject to the general conditions laid down for officers of the Royal Navy in Schedule I, Section VII, except that a nursing sister whose service is terminated on marriage will be regarded as having withdrawn from the service at her own request.

"13. Service as a Nursing Sister may be treated as contributory service under the National Health Service (Superannuation) Regulations and, if so treated, similar conditions to those laid down for male officers in Schedule I, Clause 41, will apply.

"14. *Reckoning of Service.*

(a) *In full:* Full-pay service as Commissioned Officer W.R.N.S. or as a member of the Q.A.R.N.N.S. or Q.A.R.N.N.S. Reserve; or service reckonable as qualifying service under Army or Royal Air Force regulations.

(b) *In half:* Service as a rating (not below age 18); or service so reckonable under Army or Royal Air Force regulations.

"15. *Reckoning of Service—General Rules.*

"The general rules for reckoning of service will be as laid down for officers of the Royal Navy and Royal Marines in Clauses 25 to 29 of Schedule I.

"SCHEDULE III.

"SECTION I.

"R.N. Ratings and Royal Marines.
Service Pensions.

"1. The provisions of this Section relate (except where otherwise stated) to R.N. ratings and Royal Marines, who render pensionable service after 31st December, 1955 (cease pay date), other than re-employed service pensioners and those who elect

to receive pension while still serving. They do not apply to R.N. Locally Entered ratings. The rates of pension are effective from 1st April, 1956, but all ratings and other ranks first discharged to pension after 31st December, 1955, will receive the new rates of pension as from 1st April, 1956.

"2. Service pensions granted under this Section will consist of the sum of elements for service and for rank and will be assessed at the following rates:—

"Where commissioned service is reckonable towards a rating's service pension, for each year of service in the rank of:—

"3. A service pension assessed as in Clause 2 may be granted to:—

"(a) A R.N. rating or Royal Marine discharged otherwise than for misconduct or for inefficiency due to causes within his own control, if he has completed at least 22 years' reckonable service.

"(b) A Royal Marine who having re-engaged before 1st May, 1947, to complete 21 years' service, and who is released on or after the termination of his re-engagement, if he has completed at least 21 years' service.

"(c) A R.N. rating or Royal Marine who is invalided after having undertaken a re-engagement to complete 21 or 22 years' service (whether or not he has entered into his re-engagement prior to his discharge) or having re-entered for a period which would complete 22 years' service, provided he has completed at least 12 years' reckonable service.

"(d) A Maltese R.N. rating who while serving on a non-continuous service engagement is invalided and who has completed at least 12 years' reckonable service.

"4. A R.N. rating or Royal Marine who is discharged for inefficiency within his own control and who has completed at least 22 years' reckonable service, may be granted such portion of the service pension assessed under Clause 2 as the Admiralty may determine, having regard to the circumstances of the case.

"5. A R.N. rating or Royal Marine who is discharged for misconduct, or with ignominy, and who has completed at least 22 years' reckonable service, may be granted such pension as the Admiralty may determine, having regard to the circumstances of the case, but not in any event exceeding 90 per cent. of the award which would have been admissible had he been discharged on other grounds.

"6. In assessing rank element of pension all paid rank will be taken into account.

"7. The provisions of Order in Council of 9th October, 1956, and previous Pensions Increase Orders in Council, will not apply to pensions awarded under the foregoing provisions of this Section.

"Reckonable Service.

"8. Reckonable service for the purpose of determining entitlement to pension and the rates of pension will be as follows:—

"(a) Unforfeited full pay service given, otherwise than as a commissioned officer, after attaining the age of 18 years, in the Royal Navy, the Royal Marines, the Army, the Royal Air Force, or the former Armed Forces of India or Burma, or the Armed Forces of the British Commonwealth or Colonies.

"(b) Service as a commissioned officer which would reckon as qualifying service under Clause 27 of Schedule I.

"(c) Periods on full pay for the purpose of training, while a member of the Auxiliary and Reserve Forces, except broken periods individually of less than six months' duration.

"(d) While a regular R.N. rating or Royal Marine, periods in appointments not remunerated from Navy Funds in respect of which the conditions of Clause 10 are satisfied.

"9. Normally service preceding a five years interval in service will not be reckonable unless specially so allowed by the Admiralty and eligibility to reckon such service will be determined at the time of resumption of service. When, however, during a break in service, the man

"(a) has been a member of a Reserve Force undertaking or liable for periodical training, the period of such membership will not be considered an interval of service for this purpose;

"(b) although not a member of a recognised reserve, remained liable to recall, the period during which he remained so liable will not be regarded as an interval of service, provided that his period of service included a period of War Service; 'war service' for this purpose being defined as full pay service between 3rd September, 1939, and 15th August, 1946.

"10. The appointments not remunerated from Navy Funds, referred to in Clause 8 (d) which may be allowed as reckonable service, are those which the Admiralty may decide can reasonably be regarded

as part of the Naval rating's or Royal Marine's career as such. They will be appointments to which the Naval rating or Royal Marine brings his Naval or Royal Marine knowledge, and from which he acquires additional experience, and which have been offered to him as part of his Naval or Royal Marine service.

"11. In the case of previous service in respect of which the Naval rating or Royal Marine received a Service gratuity it shall be a condition of allowing such service as reckonable service under Clauses 8 and 9 that the Naval rating or Royal Marine shall make a payment to Naval Funds either in a lump sum or otherwise. In default of such payment the previous service will not be reckonable service.

"12. The following periods of service shall not be reckonable service:—

"(a) periods of imprisonment or detention, whether awarded summarily or by sentence of court martial; or confinement in cells;

"(b) time forfeited through conviction by the Civil Power, or consequent upon an order under the Probation of Offenders Act;

"(c) time spent in desertion and, unless the service is restored by the Admiralty, any service preceding desertion;

"(d) service rendered by any person who shall have re-entered after having been dismissed from the service with disgrace or with ignominy.

"SECTION II.

"TERMINAL GRANTS IN ADDITION TO SERVICE PENSION.

"13. Ratings and Royal Marines discharged to pension after 31st December, 1955 (cease pay date), will be awarded on discharge a terminal grant at the following rates:—

"(a) Basic Grant (after 22 years' reckonable service):—

"14. Twenty-two years' reckonable service will normally be necessary for the basic rate. Men going to Service pension with less than 22 years' service will be awarded one twenty-second of the basic grant for each year of reckonable service, subject to a minimum grant of £125. Where, however, a Royal Marine has at least 21 years' reckonable service and is pensioned under Clause 3 (b) of this Schedule, a terminal grant at the rate of 22 years' reckonable service may be given.

"15. The terminal grant to a R.N. rating or Royal Marine who is discharged for inefficiency within his own control, or for misconduct, or with ignominy, and is awarded a pension under Clauses 4 and 5 of this Schedule shall be of such amount as the Admiralty may determine having regard to the circumstances of the case; but where the discharge is for misconduct or with ignominy, the amount shall not in any event exceed 90 per cent. of the award which would have been admissible had the man been discharged on other grounds.

"16. Save in exceptional circumstances at the discretion of the Admiralty additions for further service beyond 22 years will not be given in respect of service on any engagement, re-engagement, or

period of continuance, which is prematurely terminated at the R.N. rating's or Royal Marine's request.

"17. Rank for assessing the grant will be the highest paid rank held for a period of two years or more during the five years preceding discharge.

"18. The grant will be free of income tax.

"SECTION III.

"R.N. RATINGS AND ROYAL MARINES— SERVICE GRATUITIES.

"19. The provisions of this Section relate (except where otherwise stated) to R.N. ratings and Royal Marines who are transferred to the Reserve, or discharged without entitlement to service pension, after the 31st December, 1955 (cease pay date). They do not apply to R.N. Locally Entered ratings.

"20. Subject to the following provisions a R.N. rating or Royal Marine who has twelve or more years' reckonable service preceding his discharge or transfer to the Reserve will be granted a service gratuity as follows:—

"After 12 years' reckonable service £100

"For each year of such service in excess of 12 and up to 14 an addition at the rate of £25 a year

"For each year of such service in excess of 14 and up to 17 an addition at the rate of £35 a year

"For each year of such service in excess of 17 an addition at the rate of £40 a year

"21. A R.N. rating or Royal Marine who is invalided from a regular engagement after the 31st December, 1955 (cease pay date), with insufficient service to qualify for a service pension and who on discharge has not less than three years' reckonable service, will be awarded a service gratuity assessed as follows:—

"For reckonable service of from three to five years £30

"For each year of such service in excess of 5 and up to 8 an addition at the rate of £10 a year

"For each year of such service in excess of 8 and up to 10 an addition at the rate of £20 a year

"For service in excess of 10 years until normal gratuity scale is reached £100

"22. In the case of a naval rating or a Royal Marine who is discharged for inefficiency due to causes within his own control, or for misconduct, or with disgrace or with ignominy, the grant of a service gratuity and its amount, will be discretionary.

"23. *Reckonable service* for the purpose of determining entitlement to service gratuity will be the same as for service pension as given in Clauses 8 to 12 of this Schedule. When, however, the award of gratuity is made under Clause 21 above, service below age 18 may also be allowed to reckon towards the qualifying period and rate of gratuity, subject to a maximum gratuity entitlement of £100 when such service is allowed to count.

"24. A service gratuity will not be payable on re-engagement or on appointment to a commission or on discharge for the purpose of giving further full pay service in the Armed Forces.

"25. The Admiralty may stipulate in respect of any R.N. rating or Royal Marine eligible for Service gratuity under this Section that the award of the gratuity be conditional on the Naval rating or Royal Marine undertaking further service in the Royal Fleet Reserve or other Auxiliary Force, and, if he refuses to undertake such service, then the gratuity, or such portion thereof as may be determined, will not be payable.

"26. If a Naval rating or Royal Marine dies while serving no gratuity will be payable under this Section.

"27. *Reserved Rights.* Any R.N. rating or Royal Marine who is serving on an engagement which carries entitlement to a Service gratuity after 10 years' reckonable service will be eligible for the appropriate gratuity under Clause 87 of Order in Council of 28th July, 1949, if he is discharged from the service with more than 10 but less than 12 years' reckonable service.

"SECTION IV.

*"Special Provision for Aircrew Categories.***"28. Pensions.**

"(a) R.N. ratings completing not less than 22 years' pensionable service and who have rendered aircrew service will be eligible for the full rate of Long Service Pension and Terminal Grant on the normal scale, plus an addition at the following rates for the period or periods of qualifying service actually performed on aircrew duties:—

"(b) If invalidated with entitlement to service pension after not less than 12 years' service, a proportionate pension will be payable on the normal scale plus the appropriate addition in respect of aircrew service.

"29. Gratuities.

"(a) Gratuities as follows will be payable to R.N. ratings who render or have rendered aircrew service who are discharged without entitlement to service pension:—

"30. These special gratuities are in lieu of the ordinary rates of gratuity under Clauses 20 and 21 of this Schedule which are payable to other ratings, and are subject to the conditions given in Clauses 22 to 27 of this Schedule for the payment of such gratuities.

"31. Ratings who have rendered both aircrew and other service will be awarded either a gratuity calculated at the special rates based on the limited period during which they have rendered aircrew service or a gratuity at the ordinary rates based on the whole of their reckonable service, whichever is the more to their advantage.

"32. Should a rating be invalidated while on aircrew service the minimum requirement of three years' service under Clause 21 of this Schedule will not apply and the special gratuity appropriate to the length of the aircrew service will be awarded.

SECTION V.

"Service Pensioners Re-employed in Peace Time.

"33. R.N. ratings and Royal Marines who were in re-employment on a pensionable basis on or after 1st January, 1956, will qualify for reassessed service pensions and terminal grants in accordance with the following conditions; provided that the break in service does not exceed five years.

"34. Pensions.

"(a) If the period of continuous pensionable re-employment (including any re-employed service before 1st January, 1956) is three years or more, or if invalidated with less than three years' such service, the pension originally awarded will be re-assessed on total pensionable service in accordance with the rates given in Clause 2 of this Schedule.

"(b) Where, however, the period of continuous pensionable re-employment (including any re-employed service before 1st January, 1956) is less than three years, the additional service rendered will reckon only for increase of the pension previously granted at the rates laid down in the Order-in-Council under which that award was made.

"35. Terminal Grants.

"(a) If the period of continuous pensionable re-employment (including any re-employed service before 1st January, 1956) is three years or more, or if invalidated with less than three years' such service,

the terminal grant will be assessed on total pensionable service at the rates shown in Clause 13 of this Schedule, less any terminal grant previously awarded; but, if more favourable, an additional terminal grant in respect of the re-employed service only may instead be awarded at the rates shown in Clause 13 (b) of this Schedule.

"(b) Where, however, the period of continuous pensionable re-employment is less than three years, a terminal grant in respect only of the additional re-employed service will be awarded at the rates shown in Clause 13 (b) of this Schedule.

"36. *Pensioners Re-employed after a break of over five years in Service.* Where a pensioner is re-employed on a pensionable basis after a break of more than five years in service and if the period of continuous re-employment is three years or more (including any re-employed service before 1st January, 1956), or if he is invalidated with less than three years' such service, the pension previously awarded will not be re-assessed and no terminal grant will be payable. The pension previously awarded will, however, be increased by additions in respect of the re-employed service at the rates shown in Clause 2.

Where the period of such pensionable re-employment is less than three years (except in the case of invaliding), the additional service rendered will reckon only for increase of the pension previously granted at the rates laid down in the Order in Council under which the grant was made. No Terminal Grant will be payable.

"37. *Pensionable Re-employment—Definition.* For the purpose of this Section re-employment on a pensionable basis shall be any period of re-employed naval service during which a long service pensioner has given up payment of his pension in order that such additional service may be reckonable for increase of pension on final discharge.

"38. The provisions of this Section do not apply to R.N. Locally Entered pensioner ratings.

"SECTION VI.

"Future Emergency Re-Employment of Service Pensioners.

"39. This Section relates to:—

"(a) Naval and Royal Marine pensioners recalled for service, during a period of general recall.

"(b) Other service pensioners who give further service (otherwise than on normal or non-continuous service engagements) during a period of general recall to service on account of an emergency, or who are specially re-employed on full pay in anticipation of an imminent general recall.

It does not relate to R.N. Locally Entered pensioner ratings.

"40. The provisions of this Section may be brought into operation for such pensioners on such occasions and for such periods as the Admiralty may, in consultation with the Lords Commissioners of the Treasury, determine.

"41. A service pensioner will, during periods of further service to which these provisions apply, continue to receive his service pension subject to the conditions normally attached thereto.

"42. On discharge or release from such service a service pensioner, provided his service has been satisfactory and of at least six months' duration, may receive an addition to his pension of half the difference between:—

"(a) the pension for which his previous service qualified him, or would have qualified him on the scale set out in Clause 2 of this Schedule, and

"(b) the pension for which he would be eligible under the scale set out in Clause 2 of this Schedule, if his further service were added to his previous service.

"43. No terminal grant or additional terminal grant will be payable in respect of the re-employment.

"44. An addition under Clause 42 of this Section may be granted although the existing pension was assessed under regulations in force before 1st January, 1956. The addition so granted will not be increaseable under the provisions of Order in Council of 9th October, 1956, or previous Orders in Council authorising Pensions Increase.

"45. If service pensioners are employed with the Armed Forces of the British Commonwealth or Colonies, the provisions of this Section may be applied to them at Admiralty discretion as if their further service had been with the Royal Navy or the Royal Marines.

"SECTION VII.

"Naval Ratings or Royal Marines Serving on Regular Engagements Continuing in Service During a Future Emergency.

"46. The following Clause will be brought into operation on such occasions, being periods of general recall to service on account of emergency as the Admiralty may, in consultation with the Lords Commissioners of H.M. Treasury, determine and in respect of each such occasion may fix a date from which it will come into operation and after which it will cease to apply.

"47. A Naval rating or Royal Marine serving on a normal regular engagement while this Clause is in operation, who completes 22 years' service reckonable for pension under Section I of this Schedule, may be allowed, with effect from the date of completion of 22 years' service, to receive an immediate award of service pension and terminal grant, calculated on 22 years' service. If he elects to receive pension while serving, he will thereafter be regarded for pension purposes as a re-employed pensioner under Section VI of this Schedule.

"SCHEDULE IV.

"Women's Royal Naval Service—Ratings.

"SECTION I.

1. *Pensions.* The provisions of this Section relate to ratings of the Women's Royal Naval Service who render pensionable service after the 31st December, 1955 (cease pay date). The rates of pension are effective from 1st April, 1956, but all ratings first discharged to pension after 31st December, 1955, will receive the new rates of pension as from 1st April, 1956.

"2. Service pensions will consist of elements for service and for rank, and will be assessed at the following rates:—

"3. The minimum period of service normally required to qualify ratings of the Women's Royal Naval Service for service pensions is, as for men, 22 years' reckonable service from age 18, and the conditions as to reckonable service correspond to those for men.

"4. For women invalided from the Service, 12 years' service from age 18 will be required to qualify for a service pension. In addition to having rendered the minimum period of service, women must have undertaken an engagement to complete 22 years' qualifying service for pension.

"SECTION II.

"5. *Terminal Grants.* W.R.N.S. ratings discharged to pension after 31st December, 1955 (cease pay date), will be awarded on discharge a terminal grant, in addition to service pension, at the following rates:—

"7. The conditions of award will correspond to those for men, except that the minimum grant for women going to service pension with less than 22 years' service will be £85.

"SECTION III.

"8. *Service Gratuities.* Women discharged on completion of engagement after 31st December, 1955 (cease pay date), without entitlement to service pension and who have twelve or more years' reckonable service immediately preceding discharge, will be granted a service gratuity assessed as follows:—

"After 12 years' reckonable service	£70.
"For each year of such service in excess of 12 and up to 14 an addition at the rate of	£17 10s. a year.
"For the 15th year of such service an addition at the rate of	£20 a year.
"For each year of such service in excess of 15 and up to 17 an addition at the rate of	£25 a year.

"9. A W.R.N.S. rating who is invalided from a regular engagement after 31st December, 1955 (cease pay date), with insufficient service to qualify for a service pension and who has not less than three years' reckonable service immediately preceding her discharge, may be awarded a service gratuity assessed as follows:—

"For reckonable service of from 3 to 5 years	£20.
"For service of more than 5 years and up to 6 an addition at the rate of	£10 a year.
"For each year of service in excess of 6 and up to 8 an addition at the rate of	£5 a year.
"For each year of service in excess of 8 and up to 10 an addition at the rate of	£15 a year.
"For service in excess of 10 years until normal gratuity scale is reached	£70.

"10. The conditions of award will correspond to those for men. When the award of gratuity is made under Clause 9 above, service below age 18 may be allowed to reckon towards the qualifying period and rate of gratuity subject to a maximum gratuity entitlement of £70 when such service is allowed to count.

"SCHEDULE V.

"Abatement from Service Retired Pay and Service Pension in Relation to Retirement Pension under the National Insurance Act.

"1. The provisions of this Schedule relate to Officers of the Royal Navy, Royal Marines, Women's Royal Naval Service and Queen Alexandra's Royal Naval Nursing Service; ratings of the Royal Navy and Women's Royal Naval Service and other ranks of the Royal Marines, who

"(a) enter the service on or after 1st July, 1949; or

"(b) re-enter the service, after a break in service on or after the 1st July, 1949; except those who re-enter within twelve months of being invalided or those who have already been granted service retired pay or service pension before re-entry.

"Any rating or other rank the regular part of whose engagement terminated before 1st July, 1949, but who continued to serve on the reserve portion of that regular engagement shall, if he rejoined the service on a regular engagement before the termination of the reserve portion of his previous regular engagement, be regarded as having continuous regular service for the purposes of this Clause.

"2. The Admiralty may exempt from the provisions of this Schedule any officer, rating or other rank who entered or re-entered the Royal Navy after 30th June, 1949, if satisfied that such entry or re-entry was in fulfilment of an undertaking or commitment entered into before 1st July, 1949.

"3. Except as provided in Clause 4 of this Schedule, service retired pay or service pension granted to a retired officer or pensioned rating or other rank shall be reduced by an abatement of 4d. a week for each complete year of reckonable service, subject to a maximum of 16s. a week, on becoming eligible for a National Retirement Pension on attaining the age of 65, in the case of men, or on attaining the age of 60 in the case of women.

"4. No abatement, however, shall be made in the case of a person permanently resident outside the United Kingdom, unless that person is in receipt of retirement pension under the National Insurance Act, 1946, or of a corresponding award payable under reciprocal arrangements with the country of a domicile."

Her Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of H.M. Treasury, viz.:—

REGULATIONS FOR THE RECRUITMENT OF EXPERIMENTAL OFFICERS AND ASSISTANT EXPERIMENTAL OFFICERS IN VARIOUS GOVERNMENT DEPARTMENTS.

1. Both men and women may compete.

2. Age.

For the Experimental Officer grade candidates must be at least 26 years and under 31 years of age on 31st December, 1957, i.e., they must have been born on or after 1st January, 1927, and on or before 31st December, 1931.

Candidates for the Assistant Experimental Officer grade must be at least 18 years and under 28 years of age on 31st December, 1957, i.e., they must have been born on or after 1st January, 1930, and on or before 31st December, 1939. But

(i) For each grade a candidate who has served or is serving on a regular (including a regular short-service) engagement in H.M. Forces may for this purpose deduct from his actual age the period of such service rendered before 31st December, 1957. Service in H.M. Forces on a Duration of Emergency engagement or under the National Service Acts cannot be reckoned for this purpose.

(ii) The Commissioners may exceptionally, at their discretion, waive the maximum age limit for the Experimental Officer grade in favour of a candidate who has special qualifications or experience.

3. Refund of Marriage Gratuity.

Married women who have formerly been established civil servants and have drawn marriage gratuity (other than those who resigned compulsorily on marriage and whose resignation took effect before 15th October, 1946, or who are widows or divorced, or who are separated from their husbands, or whose husbands suffer without hope of recovery from total physical or mental incapacity) will not be eligible unless they undertake to refund on appointment the marriage gratuity paid. Provided that this undertaking will not be required if the break between the first period of service (including any period of unestablished service immediately following the period in respect of which the gratuity was paid) and the date of re-establishment is more than seven years.

4. Nationality.

(1) To be eligible for appointment (other than to a situation in the Admiralty, War Office, Air Ministry or Ministry of Supply) a candidate must be a British subject, a British protected person or a citizen of the Irish Republic and in addition satisfy one of the following conditions:—

(a) if he was a British subject, a British protected person or a citizen of the Irish Republic at birth—

(i) at least one of his parents must be, or have been at death, a British subject, a British protected citizen or a citizen of the Irish Republic, or

(ii) the candidate must have resided in a country or territory within the Commonwealth or in the Irish Republic or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown or partly have so resided and partly been so employed for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of his appointment:

(b) if he was not a British subject, a British protected person or a citizen of the Irish Republic at birth, he must have resided in a country or territory within the Commonwealth or in the Irish Republic or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown or partly have so resided and partly been so employed for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of his appointment:

(c) if not qualified under sub-paragraph (a) or sub-paragraph (b) of this paragraph, he must satisfy the Commissioners that he is so closely connected with a country or territory within the Commonwealth either by ancestry, upbringing or residence, or by reason of national service, that an exception may properly be made in his favour.

(2) A candidate will not be eligible for appointment to a situation in the Admiralty, War Office, Air Ministry or Ministry of Supply unless (i) at all times since his birth he has been either a British

(iii) passes in three Mathematical subjects at Advanced level and in one Science subject* and in one other subject; or

(iv) a statement from the Ministry of Education for Northern Ireland showing that they have attained a standard equivalent to that required by (a) or (b) above; or

(e) A university degree in a scientific or engineering subject or in Mathematics; or

(e) The Ordinary National Certificate. (The Commissioners may admit as eligible under this paragraph candidates who have satisfactorily completed the second year (s 2) of the Senior Course.) or
