

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, have prepared and humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for constituting a new parish to be taken out of the parish of Sefton in the diocese of Liverpool.

"SCHEME.

"Whereas we, the Church Commissioners, are satisfied that the spiritual interests of the area defined in the Schedule hereto and delineated on the map hereto annexed would be best served by constituting it a new parish:

"And whereas we are satisfied that a suitable endowment therefor will be provided:

"And whereas we have not approved any consecrated church within the area as suitable to be the parish church of the new parish:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Clifford, Bishop of Liverpool (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and affixed his episcopal seal to this Scheme), we, the said Church Commissioners, do humbly recommend and propose as follows, that is to say:—

"1. *Constitution.*

"(a) As from the date of the licence thereto of a Minister the area defined in the Schedule hereto and delineated on the map hereto annexed shall be a separate district for spiritual purposes.

"(b) As from the date of the consecration of a church within the area approved by us, the said Church Commissioners, as suitable to be a parish church, or if the church is consecrated before such approval, the date of the approval, the said area shall become a new parish.

"(c) The name of the district (or parish as the case may be) shall be 'The District (or Parish) of Saint Oswald, Netherton'.

"2. *Archdeaconry and Rural Deanery.*

"The district (or parish) shall be in the Archdeaconry of Liverpool and in the rural deanery of Bootle.

"THE SCHEDULE.

"The area comprising:—

"All that part (coloured pink on the map hereto annexed) of the parish of Sefton which lies to the south-east of an imaginary line commencing at a point on the boundary which divides the parish of Sefton from the parish of Saint Philip, Litherland, in the middle of Gorsey Lane Bridge and proceeding thence north-eastwards to and along the middle of Gorsey Lane to a point in the middle of the junction of Gorsey Lane, Fleetwood's Lane and Edge Lane and continuing thence eastwards to and along the middle of Fleetwood's Lane to a point in the middle of Fleetwood's Bridge over the middle of the Leeds and Liverpool Canal and continuing thence north-eastwards along the middle of the said Canal to the boundary which divides the civil parish of Netherton from the civil parish of Sefton and continuing thence first north-eastwards then south-eastwards then north-eastwards along the said civil parish boundary to the boundary which divides the parish of Sefton from the parish of Saint Andrew Maghull."

And whereas the provisions of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme, have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Liverpool.

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 8th day of February,

1957, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for altering the boundaries of the parishes of Durrington; West Tarring; Findon; Saint Botolph, Heene; Broadwater and Holy Trinity, Worthing, all in the diocese of Chichester.

"SCHEME.

"Whereas we are satisfied that it is desirable that the boundaries of the said parishes should be altered in the manner hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the Right Reverend George, Bishop of Chichester, consents to the proposed arrangements (in testimony whereof he has executed this Scheme):

"Now, therefore, we, the said Church Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme the boundaries of the said parishes of Durrington; West Tarring; Findon; Saint Botolph, Heene; Broadwater and Holy Trinity, Worthing, shall be altered in the manner described in the Schedule and delineated on the map annexed to this Scheme.

"THE SCHEDULE.

"(1) The territory annexed to the parish of Durrington:—

"All that part (coloured pink on the map annexed hereto) of the parish of West Tarring which lies to the west of an imaginary line commencing at a point on the boundary which divides the last mentioned parish from the parish of Findon in the middle of the footpath which runs in a south-easterly direction from Bost Hill to Mill Lane along the eastern side of closes numbered 3608 and 6454 continuing thence south-eastwards along the middle of the aforementioned footpath to its end, and then generally southwards along the middle of Mill Lane, Crockhurst Hill, Halfmoon Lane, Salvington Road and Stone Lane to a point opposite the southern boundary of the house or premises known as number 59 Stone Lane and continuing thence westwards to and along the said boundary and along the rear boundaries of the houses situate on the northern side of Mardale Road to the western boundary of the maisonettes numbered 54, 56, 57 and 59 Mardale Road and continuing thence along the last mentioned boundary to its end and continuing thence westwards in a straight line to the middle of the northern end of Roedean Road and continuing thence generally southwards along the middle of Roedean Road to a point in the middle of Littlehampton Road and then westwards along the middle of Littlehampton Road to the boundary which divides the parish of West Tarring from the parish of Durrington.

"(2) The territory to be annexed to the parish of Findon:—

"(a) All that part (coloured green on the map annexed hereto) of the parish of West Tarring which lies to the east of the territory annexed to the parish of Durrington under clause (1) of this schedule, and to the north of the northern boundary of the Worthing Borough Cemetery.

"(b) All that part (coloured purple on the map annexed hereto) of the parish of Broadwater which lies to the west of an imaginary line commencing on the northern boundary which divides the parish of Broadwater from the parish of Findon at the northern end of the western boundary of close number 5456 and continuing thence generally southwards along the last mentioned boundary and along the western boundary of close numbered 7237 to the eastern end of the northern boundary of the house or premises known as 'Lyne House' and continuing westwards along the last mentioned boundary and thence southwards along the western boundary of the last mentioned house or premises to its end and continuing thence in the same direction along the middle of the footpath which runs along the rear boundaries of the properties situated on the west side of Links Road to a point opposite the north-eastern end of the western boundary of the house numbered 138 Warren Road and thence south-westwards along the last mentioned boundary to its end and thence in a straight line in the same direction to the western boundary of the parish of Broadwater.
