Private HEWETT has served since April, 1955, as a District Intelligence Officer. Since July, 1956, he has been in many operations in the forest against armed Mau Mau terrorists. In these operations which were particularly hazardous he was conspicuously successful. Operations under his personal leadership resulted in the killing or capture of over thirty terrorists; in one particularly successful series of operations in May and June, 1956, which he planned and executed with great skill and daring the whole of a gang of twenty-five terrorists was captured.

He has over a long period shown a particular flair for intelligence work, and it is very largely due to his personal example cool courage and initiative that the district for which he was responsible has been entirely cleared of terrorists.
