The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of H.M. Treasury, viz.:

REGULATIONS FOR THE RECRUITMENT OF BOYS AND GIRLS TO GRADE 6 POSTS IN BRANCH B OF THE FOREIGN SERVICE.

1. The competition is open to boys and girls. Married women are not eligible, and the approval of the Secretary of State is required before a married man takes up appointment.

2. Age.

Candidates must be at least 16 and under 18 years of age on 1st September, 1957.

But candidates who have served in any established post to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners, or who have served on established conditions except for sick leave and pension in a post to which such a certificate would normally apply, may deduct from their actual age any time not exceeding two years which they may have spent in such service before 1st September, 1957.

3. Nationality.

A candidate will not be eligible for appointment unless at all times since his birth he has been either a British subject or a citizen of the Irish Republic

and was born of parents each of whom is or was at death a British subject or a citizen of the Irish Republic and has or had been one or the other at all times since birth:

Provided that, notwithstanding that the aforesaid conditions are not satisfied, he may, by special permission of the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, be admitted to appointment if

(i) he has at all times since his birth been either a British subject or a citizen of the Irish Republic, and

(ii) his father is or was at death a British subject or a citizen of the Irish Republic and has or had been one or the other at all times from birth, and

(iii) he satisfies the Secretary of State that he is so closely connected with a country or territory within the Commonwealth either by ancestry, upbringing or residence, or by reason of national service, that an exception may properly be made in his favour.

4. Health and Character.

Successful candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners on their health and character.

5. Examination.

The subjects of examination and the marks they will carry are as follows:—

(5) One of the following languages:— French, German, Spanish, Latin, Greek, Welsh	200

Candidates must take one of the languages in the list given under head (5); they may also take two other optional subjects. Not more than two languages in all may be chosen from the list under head (5).

Candidates will be arranged in order of merit on their total marks in the examination, but before any candidate can be appointed he or she will be required to establish, in a Foreign Office interview, that he or she is in other respects suitable for appointment to the Foreign Service. Even if there are unfilled vacancies, no candidate will be appointed who does not reach a standard which satisfies the Civil Service Commissioners. The Commissioners' decision will be final.

6. Candidates Trained as Teachers

Candidates who have been trained as teachers elsewhere than in England and Wales, and upon whose training public money has been spent, cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate central education authority (e.g. the Scottish Education Department, the Ministry of Education for Northern Ireland) has been notified to the Commissioners.

7. Fee.

No fee is required.

The Civil Service Commissioners further give notice that an Open Competition will be held under the above Regulations, the written examination commencing on 3rd September, 1957.

REGULATIONS FOR THE RECRUITMENT OF BOYS AND GIRLS TO THE CLERICAL CLASS OF THE HOME CIVIL SERVICE.

1. Both boys and girls are eligible.

2. AGE.

Candidates must be at least 16 and under 18 years of age on 1st September, 1957.
