WIFEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 29th day of May, 1957, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursurance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for altering the boundaries of the parishes of Laindon Hills and Laindon, both in the diocese of Chelmsford.

"Whereas it has been represented to us and appears to us to be desirable that the boundaries of the said parishes should be altered in the manner

of the said parishes should be altered in the manner hereinafter mentioned:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Church Commissioners with the consents of the Right Reverend Falkner, Bishop of Chelmsford (in witness whereof he has signed this Scheme), of the Pastoral Committee of the diocese of Chelmsford appointed pursuant to the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949 (signified by a Resolution of the said Pastoral Committee dated the 21st day of November, 1955), and of the Reverend Wilmot Thomas Hickson, incumbent of the benefice of Laindon Hilks and the Reverend of the Reverend Wilmot Thomas Hickson, incumbent of the benefice of Laindon Hills, and the Reverend William Arthur Winfield, incumbent of the benefice of Laindon (which consents have been given to us in writing); humbly recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme the boundaries of the said parishes of Laindon Hills and Laindon shall be altered so that all those parts of the extraparochial place known as Lee Chapel which are described in the Schedule hereto and delineated and coloured pink, green and blue on the map annexed hereto, shall be annexed thereto and form parts of the said parishes of Laindon Hills and Laindon.

### "THE SCHEDULE.

"1. The territory to be annexed to the parish of Laindon Hills.

"(a) All that part (coloured pink on the map annexed hereto) of the extra-parochial area known as Lee Chapel which lies to the south of the middle of the London, Tilbury and Southend line of British Railways (Eastern Region) and to the west of Lee Chapel Lane.

"(b) All that detached part (coloured green on the map) of the aforementioned extra-parochial area bounded on the northeast by the parish of Fobbing and on the remaining sides by the parish of I Laindon Hills:

of Laindon Hills:"

"2. The territory to be annexed to the parish of Laindon. All that part (coloured blue on the map) of the aforementioned extra-parochial area not

annexed in accordance with the foregoing provisions of this schedule to the parish of Laindon Hills."

And whereas the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, the Union of Benefices Rules, 1926 and 1930, and the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme have been duly complied

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 29th day of May, 1957, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, and the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which we have prepared with the consent of the Right Reverend Tom, Bishop of Hereford (in witness whereof he has signed this Scheme), for effecting the union of the benefice of Stretton Grandison with Ashperton and the benefice of Canon Frome, both situate in the diocese of Hereford. Hereford.

## "SCHEME.

- "1. Union of Benefices. The benefice of Stretton Grandison with Ashperton and the benefice of Canon Frome shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Stretton Grandison and Ashperton with Canon Frome' but the parishes of the said benefices shall continue in all respects distinct.
- "2. Taking effect of union. Upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect.
- "3 Parsonage House. Upon the union taking effect the parsonage house at present belonging to the bene-fice of Stretton Grandison with Ashperton shall be the house of residence of the incumbent of the united benefice.
  - "4. Diversion of Endowment Income.
  - "(1) Subject as hereinafter provided any surplus, calculated by us for the twelve months ending on the 31st March in each year of the endowment

income (calculated in accordance with the schedule hereto) of the united benefice over and above an annual sum of £675 shall, with effect from the date upon which the union shall take effect, be paid to and be held by us, for the benefit of the diocesan stipends fund of the diocese of Hereford.

"(2) The said endowment income and the said surplus and the said annual sum of £675 shall be deemed to accrue from day to day and shall when we deem that circumstances so require be apportionable accordingly.

"(3) Any moneys due to us from the incumbent of the united benefice, or, during any vacancy in the united benefice, from the sequestrators thereof, as the case may be (hereinafter called 'the incumbent or sequestrators') upon the calculation of the said surplus shall be paid by the incumbent or sequestrators to us not later than the 30th June in each year and shall be recoverable as a debt due to us.

"(4) For the purpose of ascertaining the amounts of the said endowment income and of the "(4) For said surplus, we shall have power to require production by the incumbent or sequestrators of accounts and other documents in relation thereto, and the said accounts for the twelve months to allst March in each year (or where applicable for a part of the year ending on that date) shall be rendered annually to us within six weeks of that date in such form as we shall prescribe; and in the event of failure by the incumbent or seques-trators to produce such accounts or documents we shall have all legal remedies for enforcing production thereof.

### "SCHEDULE.

"For the purpose of this Scheme the endowment income of the united benefice shall without prejudice to the power of decision vested in us by virtue of Section 18 of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, if any question shall arise, be computed in accordance with our Central Register of Benefice Income, that is to say, by including:—

"(1) all gross secured income payable by us and

any other person or body, and

(2) all gross income received from ground rents, chief rents or other fixed charges, other glebe rents and any letting of the parsonage house or a formally divided portion thereof,

"and by deducting therefrom:-

"(1) the rates payable on the parsonage house if occupied by the incumbent,

"(2) the rent and rates payable on any house occupied by the incumbent other than the parsonage house,

- . "(3) the annual assessment charged upon the incumbent under the Ecclesiastical Dilapidations Measures, 1923 to 1951, in respect of the benefice,
  - "(4) the rates payable on the glebe,
  - "(5) the cost of collecting glebe rents,
- "(6) any tithe annuity, rentcharge or fee farm rent charged upon the glebe,
- "(7) any other outgoings in respect of the glebe, "(8) any charge upon the benefice income in favour of another benefice or any lay person,
- "(9) any payment to a curate or lay worker out of the benefice income,
- (10) the annual payments in respect of capital interest in respect of any mortgage of the benefice income,
- "(11) any part of the benefice income diverted to the diocesan stipends fund pursuant to an Order under Section 12 of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949."

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, have prepared and humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for (1) altering the boundaries of the parishes of Nevendon; Ramsden Crays; Pitsea; Bowers Gifford; Laindon; Little Burstead; Fobbing; Laindon Hills; Vange; Dunton; Billericay; and Great Burstead and (2) constituting a new parish to be taken out of the parishes of Laindon; Nevendon; Pitsea; Vange and Ramsden Crays, all of which parishes are situate in the diocese of Chelmsford.

"Whereas we, the Church Commissioners, are satisfied (1) that it is desirable that the boundaries of the parishes of Nevendon; Ramsden Crays; Pitsea; Bowers Gifford; Laindon; Little Burstead; Fobbing; Laindon Hills; Vange; Dunton; Billericay and Great Burstead, should be altered in the manner described in Part I of the subjoined Schedule and as delineated on the maps lettered A, B and C hereto annexed, and (2) that the spiritual interests of the area defined in Part II of the said Schedule and delineated on the said map lettered A would be best served by constituting it a new parish and that a suitable endowment tuting it a new parish and that a suitable endowment therefor will be provided:

"And whereas we have not approved any con-secrated church within the area described in Part II of the said Schedule as suitable to be the parish

church of the new parish:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right reverend Fakkner, Bishop of Chelmsford (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and affixed his episcopal seal to this Scheme), we the said Church Commissioners, do humbly recommend and propose as follows, that is to say:

"1. As from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council confirming this Scheme the boundaries of the said parishes of Nevendon; Ramsden Crays; Pitsea; Bowers Gifford; Laindon; Little Burstead; Fobbing; Laindon Hills; Vange; Dunton; Billericay and Great Burstead, shall be altered in the manner described in Part I of the said Schedule and as delineated on the said mans lettered A. B and C. as delineated on the said maps lettered A, B and C.

as defineated on the said maps lettered A, B and C.

"2. (a) As from the date of the licence thereto of a Minister the area defined in Part II of the said Schedule and delineated on the said map lettered A shall be a separate district for spiritual purposes.

"(b) As from the date of the consecration of a church within the area approved by us, the said Church Commissioners, as suitable to be a parish church, or if the church is consecrated before such approval, the date of the approval, the said area shall become a new parish.

"(c) The name of the district (or parish as the case may be) shall be 'The District (or Parish) of Saint 'Andrew, Basildon'.

3. Archdeaconry and Rural Deanery.

The parish shall be in the Archdeaconry of Southend and in the rural deanery of Basildon.

### "THE SCHEDULE.

### "PART I

"1. Territory to be annexed to the parish of Nevendon, comprising:-

"(a) All that pant (coloured green on the map marked A) of the parish of Ramsden Crays which lies to the east of the middle of Gardiner's Lane and north of the middle of the Southend Arterial

"(b) All that part (coloured purple on the map marked A) of the parish of Pitsea which lies to the north of the middle of Burntmills Road.

"2. The territory to be annexed to the parish of . Pitsea, comprising:

"All that detached part (coloured blue on the map marked A) of the parish of Bowers Gifford which is bounded on the north by the parish of North Benfleet and on the remaining sides by the parish of Pitsea.

"3. The tenritory to be annexed to the parish of Laindon, comprising:

"(a) All that part (coloured pink on the map marked B annexed hereto) of the parish of Little Burstead which hies to the south of the middle of the Southend Arterial Road.

"(b) All that part (coloured green on the map marked B) of the parish of Fobbing which lies to the east and north of a continuous imaginary line the east and north of a continuous imaginary line commencing on the boundary which divides the parish of Laindon from the parish of Pobbing at a point in the middle of Dry Street and continuing at thence first southwestwards along the middle of the last mentioned street then northwards along the middle of Wootton's Lane to a point opposite the eastern end of the northern boundary of close number 4576 and continuing thence generally southwestwards to and along the last mentioned boundary and along the northern boundary of close number 4580, along part of the northern and part of the western boundary of close number 4579, along the northern boundary of close number 4579, along the eastern, southern and western boundaries of close number 4615 to the boundary which divides the parish of Fobbing from the extra-

which divides the parish of Fobbing from the extra-parochial area of Lee Chapel.

"(c) Alk that part (coloured purple on the map marked B) of the parish of Laindon Hills which lies to the north of an imaginary line along the middle of the Fenchurch Street to Shoeburyness line of British Railways (Bastern Region).

4. The territory to be annexed to the parish of Vange, comprising:-

"All that part (coloured grey on the map marked B) of the parish of Laindon which is bounded on the south by the parish of Vange on the west by the parish of Fobbing and on the north by an imaginary line along the middle of the aforementioned railway line.

"5. Territory to be annexed to the parish of

Laindon Hills, comprising:-

"(a) All that part (coloured yellow on the map marked B) of the parish of Laindon which lies to the south of the middle of the aforementioned railway line not annexed in accordance with the preceding provisions of this schedule to the parish

of Vange.

"(b) All that part (coloured brown on the map marked B) of the parish of Dunton which lies to the south of the middle of the aforementioned railway and to the east of an imaginary line being a continuation northwards of Berry Lane.

"6. Territory to be annexed to the parish of

Dunton, comprising:-

- "All that part (coloured blue on the map marked "All that part (coloured blue on the map marked B) of the parish of Laindon Hills which lies to the west and north of an imaginary line commencing on the boundary which divides the parish of Laindon Hills from the parish of Dunton at a point in the middle of Berry Lane and continuing thence southwards along the middle of the last mentioned lane to its end and continuing thence in the same direction to and along the eastern boundaries of closes numbered '1412, 1413, 1414 and 260 and westwards along the southern boundaries and 260 and westwards along the southern boundaries of the last mentioned close and closes numbered 259 and 258 to the boundary which divides the parish of Dunton from the parish of Laindon Hills.
- "7. Territory to be annexed to the parish of Billericay:
  - "All that part (coloured pink on the map marked C) of the parish of Great Burstead which lies to the north of the middle of the Liverpool Street to Southend-on-Sea line of British Railways (Eastern Region).
- 8. Territory to be annexed to the parish of Little Burstead, comprising:
  - "All that part (coloured green on the map marked C) of the parish of Laindon which lies to the north of the middle of Wash Road and to the west of the western boundary of the civil parish of Laindon.
- "9. Territory to be annexed to the parish of Great Burstead, comprising:
  - "All that part (coloured blue on the map marked C) of the parish of Laindon which lies to the north of the middle of Wash Road and to the east of the road which runs from Whites Bridge to Harding's Elms not annexed in accordance with

the preceding provisions of this Schedule to the parish of Little Burstead.

### "THE SCHEDULE.

"1. The territory to be annexed to the parish of Whitnash:

"All that part (coloured red on the map annexed hereto) of the parish of Saint John the Baptist, South Learnington which lies to the northeast and south of an imaginary line commencing at a point on the boundary which divides the parish of Whitnash from the parish of Saint John the Baptist, South Learnington on the wall or fence at the rear of the house and premises known as number 167 Brunswick Street and proceeding thence north-wards along the last mentioned wall or fence and along the walks or fences at the rear of the houses and premises known as numbers 167 to 127 Brunswick Street and in the same straight line in con-tinuation thereof to the wall or fence at the rear of the house and premises known as number 4 Grosvenor Road and continuing thence eastwards along the last mentioned wall or fence and along the walls or fences at the rear of the houses and premises known as numbers 6 to 8 Grosvenor Road to their end and continuing thence in a straight line eastwards thereby crossing close numbered 5019 to a point on the boundary which divides the parish of Saint John the Baptist, South Learning-ton from the parish of Whitnash.

"(b) All those parts (together coloured green on the map annexed hereto) of the parishes of All Saints, Learnington Priors, Saint Nicholas, Warwick and New Milverton lying to the south and southwest of the middle of the Coventry to Learnington and Rugby to Learnington branch line of the British Railways (Midland Region), to the southeast of the northwestern bank of the River Learn and to the east and north of the boundary Learn and to the east and north of the boundary of the Municipal Borough of Learnington.

"3. The territory to be annexed to the parish of All Saints, Learnington Priors.

"(a) All that part (coloured purple on the map annexed hereto) of the parish of Saint Nicholas, Warwick, which lies to the northeast of the middle of the Coventry to Learnington branch line of the British Railways (Midland Region).

"(b) All that part (coloured blue on the map annexed hereto) of the parish of Saint Mary, Learnington Priors, which lies to the southwest of Willes Road and to the north of Learn Terrace.

"4. The tenritory to be annexed to the parish of Holy Trinity, Learnington Priors.

"(a) All that part (coloured yellow on the map annexed thereto) of the parish of All Saints, Learnington Priors, which lies to the north of Warwick Street.

"(b) All those parts (together verged red on the map annexed hereto) of the parishes of Lillington, New Milverton and Milverton which are bounded New Milverton and Milverton which are bounded generally upon the southwest and the northwest by the parish of New Milverton and upon the remaining sides by an imaginary line commencing at a point on the boundary which divides the parish of Lillington from the parish of New Milverton at the southeastern end of the wall or fence which forms the northeastern boundary of the house and premises known as number 70 Northumberland Road and proceeding thence northwestberland Road and proceeding thence northwest-wards along the last mentioned wall or fence to the southwestern end of the wall or fence forming the northwestern boundary of the house and

premises known as number 30 Woodcote Road and continuing thence northeastwards along the last mentioned wall or fence to its end at Woodcote Road and continuing thence northeastwards to and southeastwards along the middle of the last mentioned road to a point opposite the south-western end of the wall or fence which forms the rear of the house and premises known as number 76 Northumberland Road and continuing thence generally northeastwards along the last mentioned wall or fence and along the walls or fences at the rear of the houses and premises known as numbers 78 to 1.14 Northumberland Road to their end and continuing thence northwards along the wall or fence forming the eastern boundary of number 1.14 Northumberland Road to its end at Northumberland R berland Road and continuing thence first northwards to then westwards along the middle of the wards to then westwards along the miscure of the southern end of the wall or fence forming the western boundary of the preparatory school numbered 61 Kendworth Road and proceeding thence generally northwards to and along the last mentioned wall or fence to its end at the boundary of the Municipal Rosenach of Legmington and of the Municipal Borough of Learnington and proceeding thence generally eastwards along the last mentioned boundary to the point where it meets the wall or fence at the rear of the house and premises known as number 60 Kenilworth Road and continuing thence southwards along the last mentioned wall or fence and along the walls or fences at the rear of the houses and premises known as numbers 58 to 48 Kenilworth Road to their end at Cloister Crofts and continuing thence first southwards to and then eastwards along the middle of Cloister Crofts to a point opposite the morthern end of the wall or fence which forms the western boundary of the house and premises known as number 2 Choister Crofits and continuing thence southwards along the last mentioned wall or fence to the western end of the wall or fence which forms the northern boundary of close numbered 8508 and continuing thence generally eastwards and then southwards along the wall or fence forming the northern and eastern boundaries of the last mentioned close to the western end of the wall or fence forming the southern boundary of close numbered 9609 and continuing thence eastwards along the last mentioned wall or fence and along the wall or fence forming the southern boundary of close numbered 0208 to its end and in continuation thereof in the same straight line to the middle of Lillington Road and continuing thence southwest-wards along the middle of the last mentioned road to the junction of the boundaries which divide the parish of Lillington from the parishes of Holy Trinity, Learnington Priors and Saint Paul, Learnington Priors.

"5. The territory to be annexed to the parish of Saint Paul, Learnington Priors.
