PRESENT

The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WIFEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 29th day of May, 1957, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursurance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for altering the boundaries of the parishes of Laindon Hills and Laindon, both in the diocese of Chelmsford.

"Whereas it has been represented to us and appears to us to be desirable that the boundaries of the said parishes should be altered in the manner

of the said parishes should be altered in the manner hereinafter mentioned:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Church Commissioners with the consents of the Right Reverend Falkner, Bishop of Chelmsford (in witness whereof he has signed this Scheme), of the Pastoral Committee of the diocese of Chelmsford appointed pursuant to the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949 (signified by a Resolution of the said Pastoral Committee dated the 21st day of November, 1955), and of the Reverend Wilmot Thomas Hickson, incumbent of the benefice of Laindon Hilks and the Reverend of the Reverend Wilmot Thomas Hickson, incumbent of the benefice of Laindon Hills, and the Reverend William Arthur Winfield, incumbent of the benefice of Laindon (which consents have been given to us in writing); humbly recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme the boundaries of the said parishes of Laindon Hills and Laindon shall be altered so that all those parts of the extraparochial place known as Lee Chapel which are described in the Schedule hereto and delineated and coloured pink, green and blue on the map annexed hereto, shall be annexed thereto and form parts of the said parishes of Laindon Hills and Laindon.

"THE SCHEDULE.

"1. The territory to be annexed to the parish of Laindon Hills.

"(a) All that part (coloured pink on the map annexed hereto) of the extra-parochial area known as Lee Chapel which lies to the south of the middle of the London, Tilbury and Southend line of British Railways (Eastern Region) and to the west of Lee Chapel Lane.

"(b) All that detached part (coloured green on the map) of the aforementioned extra-parochial area bounded on the northeast by the parish of Fobbing and on the remaining sides by the parish of I Laindon Hills:

of Laindon Hills:"

"2. The territory to be annexed to the parish of Laindon. All that part (coloured blue on the map) of the aforementioned extra-parochial area not

annexed in accordance with the foregoing provisions of this schedule to the parish of Laindon Hills."

And whereas the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, the Union of Benefices Rules, 1926 and 1930, and the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme have been duly complied

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that it shall be and become effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette.

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 29th day of May, 1957, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, and the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which we have prepared with the consent of the Right Reverend Tom, Bishop of Hereford (in witness whereof he has signed this Scheme), for effecting the union of the benefice of Stretton Grandison with Ashperton and the benefice of Canon Frome, both situate in the diocese of Hereford. Hereford.

"SCHEME.

- "1. Union of Benefices. The benefice of Stretton Grandison with Ashperton and the benefice of Canon Frome shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Stretton Grandison and Ashperton with Canon Frome' but the parishes of the said benefices shall continue in all respects distinct.
- "2. Taking effect of union. Upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect.
- "3 Parsonage House. Upon the union taking effect the parsonage house at present belonging to the bene-fice of Stretton Grandison with Ashperton shall be the house of residence of the incumbent of the united benefice.
 - "4. Diversion of Endowment Income.
 - "(1) Subject as hereinafter provided any surplus, calculated by us for the twelve months ending on the 31st March in each year of the endowment
