PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 7th day of June, 1957, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for altering the boundaries of the parishes of Saint John the Evangelist, Hedge End; Saint Mary, Scholing; and Saint James, West End, all in the diocese of Winchester.

“SCHEME.

“Whereas we are satisfied that it is desirable that the boundaries of the said parishes should be altered in the manner hereinafter mentioned:

“And whereas the Right Reverend Alwyn, Bishop of Winchester, consents to the proposed arrangements (in testimony whereof he has executed this Scheme):

“Now, therefore, we, the said Church Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme the boundaries of the said parishes of Saint John the Evangelist, Hedge End; Saint Mary, Scholing; and Saint James, West End, shall be altered in the manner described in the Schedule and delineated on the map annexed to this Scheme.

“THE SCHEDULE.

“1. The territory to be annexed to the parish of Saint James, West End:—

“All that part (coloured pink on the map annexed hereto) of the parish of Saint Mary, Scholing, which lies to the southeast of the middle of Deacon Road and to the northeast of the middle of Bursledon Road and to the northwest of the northwestern boundaries of closes numbered 11 and 13A and to the north of the northern boundary of close numbered 13B.

“2. The territory to be annexed to the parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Hedge End:—

“Those two contiguous parts (coloured green on the aforesaid map) of the parishes of Saint James, West End, and Saint Mary, Scholing, which are bounded on the south by the parish of Hound and on the east partly by the parish of Bursledon and partly by the parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Hedge End, and on the remaining sides by a continuous imaginary line which commences at the point on the boundary between the parishes of Saint James, West End, and Saint John the Evangelist, Hedge End, in the middle of Kanes Hill and opposite the northeastern end of the northern boundary of close number 826 and continues southwestwards along the last mentioned boundary to its

end and continues southeastwards along the north-eastern boundaries of closes numbered 825, 833, 577 and 582 and thence southwestwards along the south-eastern boundary of the last mentioned close and continues first southwestwards and then southeastwards along the northwestern and southwestern boundaries of close number 586 to the southern corner of the last mentioned close and thence in a straight line due southwards to the boundary between the parishes of Saint James, West End, and Saint Mary, Scholing, and continues in a straight line southeastwards for a distance of 24 chains or thereabouts to the southeastern corner of close number 13 and in a straight line in continuation thereof to the boundary between the parishes of Saint Mary, Scholing, and Hound.”

And Whereas the provisions of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme, have been duly complied with:

And Whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Winchester.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 12th July, 1957, at 1 p.m. for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the National Loans Act, 1939, to the amount of £250,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000 or £100,000. They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 15th July, 1957, to Saturday, the 20th July, 1957, inclusive, and will be due 91 days after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000 and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.
