REGULATIONS FOR THE RECRUITMENT OF CARTO-GRAPPICAL DRAUGHTSMAN OR SURVEYOR IN THE ORDINANCE SURVEY.

1. Both men and women are eligible, but the number of vacancies available for women may be restricted.

2. Age.

Category A.

Candidates must be at least 16 and under 21. years of age on the governing date.

Candidates must be at least 21 and under 26 years of age on the governing date. But a candidate who has served in H.M. Forces may deduct from his actual age the period of such service rendered before the governing date.

For a competition held in the first six months of any year the governing date for age will be 1st March of that year; for a competition held in the last six months of any year it will be 1st September of that year.

3. Refund of Marriage Gratuity.

Married women who have formerly been established civil servants and have drawn marriage gratuity (other than those who resigned compulsorily on marriage and whose resignation took effect before the 15th October, 1946, or who are widowed or divorced, or who are separated from their husbands, or whose husbands suffer without hope of recovery from total physical or mental incapacity) will not be eligible unless they undertake to refund on appointment the marriage gratuity paid.
