"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, and the Diocesan Stipends Funds Measure, 1953, now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which we have prepared with the consent of the Right Reverend Robert, Bishop of Peterborough (in witness whereof he has signed this Scheme), for effecting the union of (1) the benefice of Arthingworth, the benefice of Kelmarsh and part of the benefice of Loddington with Harrington and of the benefice of Loddington with Harrington and (2) the benefice of Cransley and the remaining part of the benefice of Loddington with Harrington, all of which benefices are situate in the diocese of Peterborough.

"SCHEME.

"1. Union of the benefice of Arthingworth, the benefice of Kelmarsh and part of the benefice of Loddington with Harrington.

"(a) That part of the benefice of Loddington with Harrington which coincides with the area of the parish of Harrington shall be severed from the said benefice, and the part so severed and the benefice of Arthingworth and the benefice of Victoria hall be responsible united together and Kelmarsh shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the

style of 'The United Benefice of Arthingworth with Kelmarsh and Harrington', but the parishes of Arthingworth, Kelmarsh and Harrington shall continue in all respects distinct.

"(b) With the consent (testified by his signature hereto) of the Reverend George Dolman, now incumbent of the benefice of Loddington with Harrington, upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette the union shall footbyith take effect. forthwith take effect.

"(c) In every series of three successive turns of presentation or nomination to be made to the united benefice after the union has taken effect the patron of the benefice of Kelmarsh shall have the first turn, the patron of the benefice of Loddington with Harrington who was patron of the former benefice of Harrington immediately prior to its union with the former benefice of Loddington shall have the second turn, and the patron of the benefice of Arthingworth shall have the third turn.

"(d) Upon the union taking effect the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Arthingworth shall be the house of residence of the incumbent of the united benefice.

"2. Union of the benefice of Cransley and the remaining part of the benefice of Loddington with

"(a) The remaining part of the benefice of Loddington with Harrington, namely that part which coincides with the area of the parish of Loddington, and the benefice of Cransley shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Loddington with Cransley', but the parishes of Loddington and Cransley shall continue parishes of Loddington and Cransley shall continue in all respects distinct.

"(b) Upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the said Reverend George Dolman if he is then incumbent of the benefice of Loddington with Harrington shall, with his consent (testified as aforesaid), be the incumbent of the united benefice of Loddington with Cransley.

'(c) After the union has taken effect the right "(c) After the union has taken effect the right of presentation to the united benefice shall be exercised alternately by the patron of the benefice of Loddington with Harrington who was patron of the former benefice of Loddington immediately prior to its union with the former benefice of Harrington and by the patron of the benefice of Cransley, the first mentioned patron having the first presentation to the united benefice to be made after the union.

"(d) Upon the union taking effect the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Loddington with Harrington shall be the house of residence of the incumbent of the united beneor residence or the incumbent of the united benefice and the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Cransley together with the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall, as soon as conveniently may be, be sold and disposed of by us at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and the net proceeds of such sale or sales shall be placed. net proceeds of such sale or sales shall be placed to the credit of the Expenses Fund of the said diocese established pursuant to the 32nd section of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

"3. Endowments.
"Upon the taking effect of the unions herein-before recommended and proposed, all that part of the glebe land at present belonging to the benefice of Loddington with Harrington which is situate in the parish of Harrington shall be annexed to the benefice of Harrington and shall become part of the endowments and property of the united benefice of Arthingworth, Kelmarsh and Harrington, and all the the endowments and property of the benefice other the endowments and property of the benefice of Loddington with Harrington shall be annexed to the benefice of Loddington and shall become part of the endowments and property of the united benefice of Loddington with Cransley.

"4. Diversion of Endowment Income.

"(a) Subject as hereinafter provided, any surplus, calculated by us for the twelve months ending on the 31st March in each year, of the endowment income (calculated in accordance with the Schedule hereto) of the united benefice of Arthingworth with Kelmarsh and Harrington over and above an annual

sum of £850 and any surplus, calculated as aforesaid, of the endowment income of the united benesaid, of the endowment income of the united benefice of Loddington with Cransley over and above an annual sum of £750 shall, with effect from the date upon which the union shall take effect, be paid to and be held by us for the benefit of the diocesan stipends fund of the said diocese.

"(b) The said endowment incomes and the said uproblems and the said control to the said control to

surpluses and the said annual sums of £850 and £750 shall be deemed to accrue from day to day and shall when we deem that circumstances so require be apportionable accordingly.

"(c) Any moneys due to us from the incumbent of either of the said united benefices, or, during any vacancy in either of the said united benefices, from the sequestrators thereof, as the case may be (hereinafter called 'the incumbent or sequestrators') upon the calculation of the surplus of the endow-ment income of that united benefice shall be paid by the incumbent or sequestrators to us not later than the 30th June in each year and shall be recoverable as a debt due to us.

"(d) For the purpose of ascertaining the amounts of the said endowment incomes and of the said

surpluses, we shall have power to require production by the incumbents or sequestrators of accounts and other documents in relation thereto, and the and other declinings in relation meters, and the said accounts for the twelve months to 31st March in each year (or where applicable for a part of the year ending on that date) shall be rendered annually to us within six weeks of that date in such form as we shall prescribe; and in the event of failure by the incumbents or sequestrators to produce such accounts or documents we shall have all legal remedies for enforcing production thereof.

" SCHEDULE.

"For the purpose of this Scheme the endowment income of each of the united benefices shall, without prejudice to the power of decision vested in us by virtue of Section 18 of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, if any question shall arise, be computed in accordance with our Central Register of Benefice Income, that is to say, by including:

"(1) all gross secured income payable by us and

any other person or body, and
"(2) all gross income received from ground rents,
chief rents or other fixed charges, other glebe
rents and any letting of the parsonage house or a
formally divided portion thereof, and by " deducting therefrom:

- "(1) the rates payable on the parsonage house if occupied by the incumbent,
- "(2) the rent and rates payable on any house occupied by the incumbent other than the parsonage
- "(3) the annual assessment charged upon the incumbent under the Ecclesiastical Dilapidations Measures, 1923 to 1951, in respect of the benefice,
 - "(4) the rates payable on the glebe,
 - "(5) the cost of collecting glebe rents,
- "(6) any tithe annuity, rentcharge or fee farm rent charged upon the glebe,
 - "(7) any other outgoings in respect of the glebe,
- "(8) any charge upon the benefice income in favour of another benefice or any lay person,
- "(9) any payment to a curate or lay worker out of the benefice income,
- "(10) the annual payments in respect of capital and interest in respect of any mortgage of the benefice income,
- "(11) any part of the benefice income diverted to the diocesan stipends fund pursuant to an Order under Section 12 of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949."





A widow resident abroad when benefit rates were increased in 1951, 1952 or 1955 is under the existing regulations precluded from obtaining by virtue of her husband's insurance the increased rate of retirement pension then enacted unless she subsequently becomes resident in Great Britain. (3) Cattle may not be loaded into any ship or aircraft unless a veterinary inspector has certified that he has examined the cattle and found them to be fit to be shipped.

(4) If the master of a vessel anticipates adverse weather conditions during the voyage of a vessel, cattle are not to be carried on the voyage.

(ii) to permit vehicles to wait—to pick up and set down passengers, to carry out essential services, or while in use by local authorities in an emergency;

(iii) to permit vehicles to wait for the purpose of loading or unloading goods in all the above restricted streets except in the lengths of street specified in Part II of the First Schedule).

II. to institute one-way traffic working in the streets named in the first column of the Third Schedule hereto, in the direction specified in the second column of that Schedule.
