Pursuant to section 275 (5) of the Customs and Excise Act, 1952 and paragraph 1 of the 7th Schedule thereto, the Commissioners of Customs and Excise hereby give you notice that by virtue of the powers contained in the customs and excise Acts and enactments amending those Acts, certain goods, to wit—twelve drums, marked Type "N", H-L, London, containing dehydrated tomato flakes imported in m.v.
