WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 1st day of August, 1957, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, and the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which we have prepared with the consent of the Right Reverend Thomas, Bishop of Carlisle (in witness whereof he has signed this Scheme), for effecting the union of the benefice of Brougham and the benefice of Clifton, both situate in the diocese of Carlisle.

"SCHEME.

"1. *Union of Benefices.* The benefice of Brougham and the benefice of Clifton shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Brougham and Clifton' but the parishes of the said benefices shall continue in all respects distinct.

"2. *Taking effect of union.* Upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the Reverend Canon Charles Murray Lowther Bouch if he is then incumbent of the said benefices of Brougham and Clifton shall, with his consent (testified by his signature hereto), be the first incumbent of the united benefice and his admission thereto shall be without any form or fee of or for presentation or nomination and he shall not be required to pay any fees in respect of his collation, institution, licence or induction to the united benefice beyond such fees as he would have been liable to pay if his admission to the united benefice had been an admission solely to that one of the said two benefices for the holding of which in plurality with the other a Dispensation was heretofore granted to him.

"3. *Parsonage House.* Upon the union taking effect the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Clifton shall be the house of residence of the incumbent of the united benefice.

"4. *Patronage.* After the union has taken effect the right of presentation to the united benefice shall be exercised by the patrons of the two benefices alternately, the patron of the benefice of Clifton having the first presentation to the united benefice to be made after the union.

"5. *Archdeaconry and Rural Deanery.* The united benefice shall be in the archdeaconry of Carlisle and the rural deanery of Lowther."

And whereas the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, the Union of Benefices

Rules, 1926 and 1930, and the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that it shall be and become effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette.

"We, the Church Commissioners, in pursuance of the Church Patronage Act, 1870, and of the Acts therein mentioned, have prepared the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the interest herein-after mentioned in the ownership of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the church and cure (hereinafter called 'the said benefice') of Ripple in the County of Kent and in the diocese of Canterbury.

"SCHEME.

"Whereas we are satisfied that Eileen Moncrieff Birchenough formerly of Pontruffydd Hall, Bodfari, in the County of Flint and of Dunwood Manor in the County of Southampton, but now of Yr Hen Bersondy, Llanover, Abergavenny, in the County of Monmouth, married woman, is entitled to exercise an alternate right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice:

"And whereas the said Eileen Moncrieff Birchenough desires to transfer her said interest in the advowson of the said benefice to the Archbishop of Canterbury for the time being and is consenting to this Scheme (in testimony whereof she has executed the same):

"And whereas we are satisfied that the transfer will tend to make better provision for the cure of souls:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Geoffrey Francis, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury (in testimony whereof he has executed this Scheme), we, the said Church Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the said interest of the said Eileen Moncrieff Birchenough in the owner-

ship of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice shall be transferred to the said Geoffrey Francis, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, and his successors in the same Archbishopric and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the Archbishop of Canterbury for the time being."

And Whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, and the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which we have prepared with the consent of the Right Reverend William, Bishop of Salisbury (in witness whereof he has signed the Scheme), for effecting (1) the union of the benefice of West Lulworth and part of the benefice of East Lulworth with Coombe Keynes, and (2) the union of the benefice of Wool with East Burton and the remaining part of the benefice of East Lulworth with Coombe Keynes, all of which benefices are situate in the diocese of Salisbury.

"SCHEME

"1. *Union of the benefice of West Lulworth and part of the benefice of East Lulworth with Coombe Keynes.*

"(1) That part of the benefice of East Lulworth with Coombe Keynes which coincides with the area of the parish of East Lulworth shall be severed from the said benefice and the part so severed and the benefice of West Lulworth shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of West Lulworth and East Lulworth' but the parishes of West Lulworth and East Lulworth shall continue in all respects distinct.

"(2) *Taking effect of union.*

"(i) If upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette the said benefice of East Lulworth with Coombe Keynes shall be vacant the union shall take effect forthwith but if it shall then be full the union shall take effect immediately upon the next avoidance thereof.

"(ii) Upon the union taking effect the Reverend John Stone, if he is then the incumbent of the benefice of West Lulworth, shall, with his consent (which has been given to us in writing), be the first incumbent of the united benefice.

"(3) *Parsonage House.* Upon the union taking effect the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of West Lulworth shall be the house of residence of the incumbent of the united benefice and the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of East Lulworth with Coombe Keynes shall become a glebe house of the united benefice.

"(4) *Patronage.* After the union has taken effect the right of presentation to the united benefice of West Lulworth and East Lulworth shall be exercised alternately by the patron of the benefice of West Lulworth and by the patron of the benefice of East Lulworth with Coombe Keynes, the patron of the benefice of East Lulworth with Coombe Keynes having the first turn of presentation to be made to the united benefice after the union.

"2. *Union of the benefice of Wool with East Burton and part of the united benefice of East Lulworth with Coombe Keynes.*

"(1) Upon the taking effect of the union recommended and proposed in clause 1 of this Scheme, the remaining part, that is to say the part which coincides with the area of the parish of Coombe Keynes, of the benefice of East Lulworth with Coombe Keynes and the benefice of Wool with East Burton shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Wool, East Burton and Coombe Keynes' but the parish of Wool with East Burton and the parish of Coombe Keynes shall continue in all respects distinct, and the Reverend Frank Cedric Whitter, if he is then incumbent of the benefice of Wool with East Burton, shall, with his consent (which has been given to us in writing), be the first incumbent of the united benefice.

"(2) *Parsonage House.* Upon the union taking effect the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Wool with East Burton shall be the house of residence of the incumbent of the united benefice.

"(3) *Patronage.* After the union has taken effect, in every series of four successive turns of presentation or nomination to be made to the united benefice the patron of the benefice of Wool with East Burton shall have the first, second and fourth turns and the patron of the benefice of East Lulworth with Coombe Keynes shall have the third turn.

"3. *Distribution of Endowments.*

Upon the taking effect of the unions hereinbefore recommended and proposed the endowments and property belonging to the said benefice of East Lulworth with Coombe Keynes shall be divided and distributed as follows, that is to say, a capital sum sufficient to produce an annual income of £1352s. 8d., being part of a larger capital sum held by us for the said benefice shall be assigned and annexed to the united benefice of West Lulworth and East Lulworth and all other the endowments and property (except the hereinbefore mentioned parsonage house) belonging to the said benefice of East Lulworth with Coombe Keynes shall be assigned and annexed to the united benefice of Wool, East Burton and Coombe Keynes."

"2. *Taking effect of union.* Upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the Reverend John Fleetwood Boodle if he is then incumbent of the said benefice of Brandon Ferry with Wangford shall, with his consent (testified by his signature hereto), be the first incumbent of the united benefice.

"3. *Parsonage House.* Upon the union taking effect the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Brandon Ferry with Wangford shall be the house of residence of the incumbent of the united benefice.

"4. *Patronage.* In every series of four successive turns of presentation to be made to the united benefice after the union has taken effect the Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food (being one of the patrons of the benefice of Santon with Santon Downham) shall have the first turn, the patrons of the benefice of Brandon Ferry with Wangford shall have the second and fourth turns and the Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich for the time being (being the other patron of the benefice of Santon with Santon Downham) shall have the third turn.

"5. *Provision for a curate or other assistance.* Upon the union taking effect the incumbent shall, in order to assist him in performing the duties of the united benefice, employ a curate or such other clerical or lay assistance as the Bishop of the said diocese may from time to time direct."

(c) if not qualified under sub-paragraph (a) or sub-paragraph (b) of this paragraph, he must satisfy the Commissioners that he is so closely connected with a country or territory within the Commonwealth either by ancestry, upbringing or residence, or by reason of national service, that an exception may properly be made in his favour.

4. Qualifications.

All candidates must

(1) have passed the Final Examination of the Royal Institution of Chartered Surveyors, or of the Chartered Auctioneers' and Estate Agents' Institute, or of the Land Agents' Society, or hold a University Degree (e.g. B.A. (Estate Management) Cambridge or B.Sc. (Estate Management) London), which gives exemption from the examinations of any one of these bodies;

(2) have achieved Corporate Membership of one of these bodies.

Candidates who satisfy (1) but not (2) will be admitted to the competition but, if successful, will not have their appointments confirmed unless they attain Corporate Membership of one of the three bodies within their probation period.
