1947, as applied by s. 2 (6) of the Supplies and Services (Defence Purposes) Act, 1951, or that any requirement of the said Act of 1947 as so applied or of any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may, within 6 weeks from the 4th October, 1957, apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein.
