At any time within 28 days after the publication of this notice, an owner, lessee, or occupier of any land on which the provisional map shows a public path, or a road used as a public path, may apply for a declaration in accordance with section 31 (1) of the Act. Any such application must be addressed to the Clerk of the Peace, County Hall, Lewes, and be made in accordance with "The Public Rights of Way (Applications to Quarter Sessions) Regulations, 1952."

NOTICE is hereby given that the above Order was made on the 27th day of September, 1957, and is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation.

The Order relates to land situate in the following parish viz.: Upper Clatford.
