RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL OF HEPTON.

Rural District Council of Hepton (Middle Nook Farm, Wadsworth) Diversion Order, 1956.

NOTICE is hereby given that on the 13th day of September, 1957, the Minister of Town and Country Planning confirmed with modifications the above Order.

The effect of the Order is to divert the public right of way running from a point commencing on the West side of Nook Lane at a point approximately forty feet North West of the junction of that lane with Dike Lane (and marked "A" on the map annexed hereto) and leading across field O.S. No. 75 in a general westerly direction for a distance of approximately 365 feet to the West corner of that field at the point marked "B" on the map annexed hereto to a line running from a point commencing on the West side of Nook Lane at a point approximately 250 feet North West of the junction of that lane with Dike Lane (and marked "C" on the map annexed hereto) and leading across field O.S. No. 84 in a South Westerly direction for a distance of approximately 324 feet to its junction with the existing path at the point marked "B" on the map annexed hereto. The path has a width of three feet. The old footpath will be closed as from 4th October, 1957.

A certified copy of the Order and of the map contained in the Order as confirmed by the Minister has been deposited at District Bank Chambers, Hebden Bridge, and will be open for inspection free of charge between the hours of 9.30 a.m. and 5 p.m. on any weekday.

The Order becomes operative as from the 4th day of October, 1957, but if any person aggrieved by the Order decides to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act, 1949, or on the grounds that any requirement of the Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the approval of the Order he may within six weeks from the date of publication of this notice make application to the High Court.

BOROUGH OF PONTEFRACT.

The Pontefract (Churchbalk Lane—Carleton Road Footpath) Diversion Order, 1957.
