The QUEEN has been graciously pleased to approve the award of the British Empire Medal (Military Division) in recognition of brave conduct,

23475993 Gunner Terence WILLIAMS, Royal Regiment of Artillery.

On 1st June, 1957, at Studeley Green, a 3 ton-vehicle caught fire.

Gunner WILLIAMS, who happened to be on the spot, without being ordered to do so entered the rear part of the vehicle and passed out the valuable stores which it contained thereby considerably reducing the damage done by the fire. He worked in dense smoke and heat and well knew that among the stores were several jerricans of petrol which were likely to explode at any moment. He removed these jerricans, played a fire extinguisher on the interior of the burning vehicle and only withdrew when forced to do so. By this time the most valuable stores contained in the vehicle were in safety.

By his actions, which were in keeping with the traditions of the Royal Regiment of Artillery, Gunner WILLIAMS not only saved valuable stores but brought the fire under control thereby saving the vehicle from certain destruction.
