"Whereas we are satisfied that it is desirable that the boundaries of the said parishes should be altered in the manner hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the Right Reverend Thomas, Bishop of Carlisle, consents to the proposed arrangements (in testimony whereof he has executed this Scheme):

"Now, therefore, we, the said Church Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme the boundaries of the said parishes of Barton, Brougham and Clifton shall be altered in the manner described in the Schedule and delineated on the map annexed to this Scheme.

"THE SCHEDULE.

"1. Territory to be annexed to the parish of Brougham:

"(a) All that part (coloured pink on the map annexed hereto) of the parish of Barton which lies to the east of an imaginary line commencing on the boundary which divides the parish of Barton from the parish of Penrith at a point in the middle of the River Eamont opposite the northwestern end of the wall or fence which forms the southwestern boundary of close numbered 44 (on the map) and proceeding thence southeastwards to and along the last mentioned wall or fence to its end and continuing thence northeastwards along the wall or fence which forms the southeastern boundary of the last mentioned close to a point opposite the northern end of the wall or fence which divides close numbered 34 from close numbered 98 and continuing thence first southwards across Hayeswater Aqueduct then generally southeastwards along the last mentioned wall or fence and along the wall or fence which divides close numbered 109 from closes numbered 98 and 108 to the wall or fence which forms the southeastern boundary of close numbered 109 and continuing thence generally northeastwards along the last mentioned wall or fence and along the walls or fences which divide closes numbered 109, 116, 117 and 122 from closes numbered 115, 118 and 121 and in continuation thereof in the same straight line to the boundary which divides the parish of Barton from the parish of Clifton.
