At the Court at *Buckingham Palace*, the 27th day of November, 1957.

PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 22nd day of November, 1957, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, have prepared and humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for constituting a new parish to be taken out of the parish of Saint Andrew, Rowbarton, in the diocese of Bath and Wells.

SCHEME

“Whereas, we, the Church Commissioners, are satisfied that the spiritual interests of the area defined in the subjoined Schedule and delineated on the map hereto annexed would be best served by constituting it a new parish:

“And whereas we are satisfied that a suitable endowment therefor will be provided:

“And whereas there is within the said area a consecrated church known as Saint Peter, Lyngford, which has been approved by us, the said Church Commissioners, as suitable to be the parish church of the new parish and of which the patronage belongs to the Bishop of Bath and Wells by virtue of an agreement in writing dated the 28th August, 1957, and made pursuant to section 9 of the New Parishes Measure, 1943:

“Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend William, Bishop of Bath and Wells (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and affixed his episcopal seal to this Scheme), we, the said Church Commissioners, do humbly recommend and propose as follows, that is to say:—

1. Constitution.

(a) As from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council confirming this Scheme, the area defined in the subjoined Schedule and delineated on the map hereto annexed shall be a new parish.

(b) The Church of Saint Peter, Lyngford, aforesaid shall be the parish church of the parish.

(c) The name of the parish shall be ‘The Parish of Saint Peter, Lyngford’.

2. Archdeaconry and Rural Deanery.

“The parish shall be in the Archdeaconry of Taunton and in the rural deanery of Taunton (Taunton District).

THE SCHEDULE

“The area comprising:—

“All that part (coloured pink on the map annexed hereto) of the parish of Saint Andrew, Rowbarton, which lies to the east and north of a continuous imaginary line commencing on the boundary which divides the last mentioned parish from the parish of Cheddon Fitzpaine at a point in the middle of Cats

Lane and continuing thence generally southwards along the middle of the last mentioned lane and along the middle of Cheddon Road to a point opposite the western end of the wall or fence which forms the northern boundary of the house and premises known as 278 Cheddon Road and continuing thence eastwards along the said wall or fence and generally southwards along the walls or fences which form the rear boundaries of the last mentioned house and the houses on the eastern side of Cheddon Road to their junction with the walls or fences which form the rear boundaries of the houses and premises on the northern side of Eastwick Avenue (thereby crossing Pyrland Avenue, St. George's Avenue, Colin Road and Eastwick Road) and continuing thence eastwards along the last mentioned walls or fences to their end and thence southwestwards along the wall or fence which divides number 18 Eastwick Avenue from number 49 Lyngford Square and in the same direction to the western end of the wall or fence which forms the northern boundary of the house and premises known as 1 Eastwick Avenue and continuing thence eastwards and southeastwards along the said wall or fence and along the walls or fences which form the rear boundaries of the houses and premises on the southwestern side of Lyngford Square and along the wall or fence which divides 85 Wedlands from 1 Lyngford Square to its end and continuing thence in a straight line southeastwards to a point in the middle of the footpath serving numbers 4 to 24 Grange Road opposite to the western end of the wall or fence which forms the northern boundary of number 4 Grange Road and continuing thence eastwards to and along the last mentioned wall or fence and thence southeastwards along the walls or fences which form the rear boundaries of the houses and premises on the eastern side of the last mentioned road to their junction with the walls or fences which form the rear boundaries of the houses and premises on the western side of Lyngford Road and continuing thence northeastwards along the last mentioned walls or fences to the northwestern end of the wall or fence which forms the northeastern boundary of number 39 Lyngford Road and continuing thence southeastwards along the last mentioned wall or fence and in a straight line in continuation thereof to the middle of Lyngford Road and continuing thence southwestwards along the middle of the last mentioned road and northeastwards along the middle of Priors Wood Road to the boundary which divides the parish of Saint Andrew, Rowbarton from the parish of Cheddon Fitzpaine.”

And whereas the provisions of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme, have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual
