"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for altering the boundaries of the parishes of Saint Paul, Oldham, and Holy Trinity, Bardsley, both in the diocese of Manchester.

"SCHEME

"Whereas we are satisfied that it is desirable that the boundaries of the said parishes should be altered in the manner hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the Right Reverend William, Bishop of Manchester, consents to the proposed arrangements (in testimony whereof he has executed this Scheme):

"Now, therefore, we, the said Church Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme the boundaries of the said parishes of Saint Paul, Oldham, and Holy Trinity, Bardsley, shall be altered in the manner described in the Schedule and delineated on the map annexed to this Scheme.

"THE SCHEDULE

"The territory to be annexed to the parish of St. Paul, Oldham:—

"All that part (coloured pink on the map annexed hereto) of the parish of Holy Trinity, Bardsley, which lies to the north of an imaginary line commencing at a point on the boundary which divides the parish of Saint Paul, Oldham, from the parish of Holy Trinity, Bardsley, opposite the middle of the western end of Fir Tree Avenue and proceeding thence eastwards to and along the middle of Fir Tree Avenue to a point opposite the northwestern end of the wall or fence forming the southwestern boundary of the house and premises known as Number 2 Fir Tree Avenue and continuing thence southeastwards to and along the said wall or fence to its junction with the wall or fence forming the southern boundary of the houses and premises known as Numbers 2-12 (even) Fir Tree Avenue and continuing thence eastwards along the last mentioned wall or fence to its junction with the wall or fence forming the eastern boundary of the house and premises known as Number 12 Fir Tree Avenue and continuing thence northwards along the last mentioned wall or fence and in a straight line in continuation thereof to a point in the middle of Fir Tree Avenue and continuing thence eastwards along the middle of Fir Tree Avenue to a point opposite the middle of the western end of Park Lane and continuing thence first southeastwards to then generally eastwards along the middle of Park Lane to a point opposite the southwestern end of the wall or fence forming the southeastern boundary of the houses and premises known as Numbers 2-40 (even) New Barn Road and continuing thence in a straight line northeastwards to and along the last mentioned wall or fence to its end and continuing thence in a straight line northeastwards to and along the wall or fence which forms the northwestern boundary of closes numbered 5377, 6380 and 7386 and in a straight line in continuation thereof across the Oldham Ashton and Guide Bridge Junction railway line of British Railways (London Midland Region) to the boundary which divides the parish of Holy Trinity, Bardsley, from the parish of Leesfield."
