HOMICIDE ACT, 1957.

AN INQUISITION taken for our Sovereign Lady the QUEEN at Her Majesty's Prison, Winson Green, situate in the City of Birmingham, in the County of Warwick, this fourth day of December, in the Sixth year of the reign of our Sovereign Lady Elizabeth the Second, by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland QUEEN, Defender of the Faith, and in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and fifty seven (there having appeared to me to be reason for summoning a Jury) before me, George Billington, Esquire, Coroner of our said Sovereign Lady the QUEEN for the said City, on view (by me) of the body of Dennis Howard then and there lying dead upon the ca'h of the several Jurors whose names are hereunder subscribed, and seals affixed, being good and lawful men of the said City, duly chosen, who being then and there duly sworn and charged to inquire for our said Lady the QUEEN, when, where, how, and by what means the said Dennis Howard came to his death. Do upon their oaths present and say that the said Dennis Howard was a prisoner in the said prison, having been convicted of murder and sentenced to death for that offence at the last Assizes for the County of Worcestershire. And that the aforesaid Judgment of Death was on this fourth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and fifty seven and within the Prison aforesaid duly executed and carried into effect by the hanging of the said Dennis Howard by the neck until he died, and the Jurors aforesaid, upon their oaths aforesaid, do further say that this Inquest is duly held by the Coroner of the Jurisdiction to which the said Prison belongs within twenty
