*The London Road to Green Lane Footpath
Extinguishment Order, 1957.*

NOTICE is hereby given that on the 4th day of December, 1957, the Minister of Housing and Local Government confirmed, with modifications, the above Order.

The effect of the Order is to extinguish, as from the 19th day of December, 1957, that section of the public right of way No. 56 on the survey map prepared under the above Act, which commences 60 yards north of the junction of London Road with White Knowle Road and runs in a generally westerly direction across land owned by the Central Electricity Authority, to join the public right of way No. 55 on the survey map. The length of the section of path to be closed is approximately 55 yards.

A certified copy of the Order and of the map contained in the Order, as confirmed by the Minister, has been deposited at the Town Clerk's Office, Town Hall, Buxton, and will be open for inspection free of charge between the hours of 10 a.m. and 5 p.m. on weekdays (10 a.m. to 12 noon on Saturdays).

The Order becomes operative as from the 13th day of December, 1957, but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act, 1949, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act or any Regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the approval of the Order, he may, within six weeks from the date of publication of this notice, make application to the High Court.

*The Chesterton Rural District Council (Boxworth,
Footpath No. 9) Diversion Order, 1957.*

NOTICE is hereby given that the above Order was made on the 10th day of December, 1957, and is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation.

The Order relates to land situated in the Parish of Boxworth, the effect of the Order will be to divert the existing public right of way from a Stile Entrance at Thorofare Lane running in a north-westerly direction across the Field Ordnance Survey Parcel No. 202 (Ordnance Survey Sheet Cambridge-shire XXXIX, 5—1926 Edition) for a distance of approximately 318 yards to a point near a stile adjacent to a footbridge at the west boundary of the

field near the south boundary of Overhall Grove to a new path running from a point at Thorofare Lane approximately 265 yards north-west of the existing path running in a generally northerly direction along the west boundary of the Field Ordnance Survey Parcel No. 202 (Ordnance Survey Sheet Cambridge-shire XXXIX, 5—1926 Edition) for a distance of approximately 188 yards to join the existing path at a point near the stile adjacent to the footbridge near the south boundary of Overhall Grove.
