EXTINGUISHMENT OF PUBLIC RIGHTS OF WAY.

Borough of Reigate.

Notice is hereby given that the Minister of Housing
and Local Government, in exercise of powers
conferred upon him by section 23 of the Town
and Country Planning Act, 1944, as incorporated
with the Town and Country Planning Act, 1947,
has prepared in draft and proposes to make an
Order extinguishing the public rights of way over
part of a footpath which commences on the East
side of High Street, Redhill, at a point 40 yards
north of its junction with Chapel Road and continues
in a generally easterly direction for a distance
of 65 yards and is shown coloured blue on the map
hereinafter referred to.

A copy of the draft Order and of a map showing
the land over which the rights of way proposed
to be extinguished subsist may be inspected at the
Town Clerk's Office, Town Hall, Reigate, without
payment of fee during the usual office hours.

Any objection to this proposal must be made in
writing, and addressed to the Minister of Housing
and Local Government, Whitehall, London, S.W.1,
before the 10th day of April, 1958.

The Minister is not, in all cases, required to cause
a local inquiry to be held. It is important, therefore,
that an objection should include a full statement
in writing of the grounds on which the objection
is made, as the objector may have no further
opportunity to make such a statement.

**MINISTRY OF TRANSPORT AND
CIVIL AVIATION.**

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT, 1947.

The Minister of Transport and Civil Aviation

regulation made thereunder has not been complied
with in relation to the Order, may, within six weeks
of the 9th January, 1958, apply to the High Court
for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of
any provision contained therein.
