THE MILNROW URBAN DISTRICT COUNCIL (FIRGROVE PLAYING FIELDS) EXTINGUISHMENT ORDER, 1958.

NOTICE is hereby given that the above Order was made on the 15th day of January, 1958, and is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation.

The Order relates to land situate in the Belfield Ward of the Milnrow Urban District. The effect of the Order will be to extinguish the following public rights of way:—

1. The public footpath which crosses the Firgrove playing fields and which commences at a point in Halliwell Street, 66 yards west of the junction of that street with Uncouth Road and leads in a general northerly direction for a distance of 256 yards between the points C—B—E on the map annexed to the Order to end at a point south of Uncouth Bridge Mills, and

2. URBAN DISTRICT COUNCIL OF FAREHAM.

*Fareham Urban Council Albert Road Footpath Extinguishment Order.*

NOTICE is hereby given that on the 15th day of January, 1958, the Minister of Housing and Local Government confirmed the above Order.

The effect of the Order is to extinguish that part of the public footpath which runs from a point on the west side of Newgate Lane 200 feet or thereabouts north of the Newgate Lane—Albert Road—Peel Common junction, then westwards and southwards to a point in Albert Road 720 feet or thereabouts west of the Newgate Lane—Albert Road junction, but excepting from the Order the section of the path extinguished by The Stopping up of Highways (County of Southampton) (No. 10) Order, 1957, made by the Minister of Transport and Civil Aviation on the 25th October, 1957. The old path will be closed as from 1st February, 1958.

A certified copy of the Order and of the map contained in the Order as confirmed by the Minister has been deposited at "Merton", 5, Grove Road, Fareham, and will be open for inspection free of charge during the usual office hours.

The Order becomes operative as from the 24th day of January, 1958, but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act, 1949, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied
