

Civil Service Commission, 31st January, 1958.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that, with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of H.M. Treasury, the following amendment has been made in the Regulations for the recruitment of Postal and Telegraph Officers in the Post Office dated 7th January, 1958, and published in the London Gazette of the same date, viz:—

Coventry has been added to the list of Head Post Office areas for which candidates must be at least 16 and under 25 years of age on the governing date.

Clause 2 of the regulations governing the competitions has been amended accordingly and now reads as follows:—

2. Age.

Candidates must be at least 16 and under 18 years of age on a governing date defined below, except that for competitions for appointments in the London Postal Region (Inner and Outer Areas) and in the Head Post Office areas of Basildon, Berkhamsted, Birmingham, Brentwood, Cambridge, Chelmsford, Chesham and Amersham, Coventry, Dorking, Harlow, High Wycombe, Luton, Maidenhead, Maidstone, Slough, Tonbridge, Ware, and Windsor candidates must be at least 16 and under 25 years of age on the governing date.

The governing date is defined as follows:—

For competitions held in January to April in each year, the date is the 1st May immediately following.

For competitions held in May to August in each year, the date is the 1st September immediately following.

For competitions held in September to December in each year, the date is the 1st January immediately following.

EXTINGUISHMENT OF A PUBLIC RIGHT OF WAY.

County Borough of Grimsby.

Notice is hereby given that the Minister of Housing and Local Government, in exercise of powers conferred upon him by section 23 of the Town and Country Planning Act, 1944, as incorporated in the Town and Country Planning Act, 1947, has prepared in draft and proposes to make an Order extinguishing the public rights of way over parts of Lower Burgess Street, Cressey Street, Fotherby Street and a footpath to the east of King Edward Street, Grimsby.

The Minister is not, in all cases, required to cause a local inquiry to be held. It is important, therefore, that an objection should include a full statement in writing of the grounds on which the objection is made, as the objector may have no further opportunity to make such a statement.
