INTERNATIONAL ORGANISATIONS (IMMUNITIES AND PRIVILEGES) ACT, 1950.

In pursuance of subsection (1) (c) of section 2 of the International Organisations (Immunities and Privileges) Act, 1950 (14 Geo. 6, Chapter 14), Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs hereby gives notice of the following further amendments to the list published in the London Gazette of the 22nd of March, 1957, of persons who are entitled to immunities and privileges conferred by the Diplomatic Privileges (International Civil Aviation Organisation) Order in Council, 1949 (hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Order in Council"), as amended by the Diplomatic Privileges (World Health Organisation and International Civil Aviation Organisation) (Amendment) Order in Council, 1949 and the International Organisations (Immunities and Privileges of the International Civil Aviation Organisation) (Amendment No. 2) Order, 1954.
