Casal, Jane 2. N. S. The Duke of Vendosme arrived here the 31st past from the French Camp in the Breteian, having in his way hisher viewed the Fortifications of several Towns in the Milancze and Monntferrate. It is Said, That he intends to continue here till the French Forces in these Parts are all arrived at Fortanella, the Place of their Rendezvour, and then to put himself at the head of them and march to Turin, and lay Siege to that Place; and after having given the receisary Orders for carrying it on, to leave the Direction thereof to the Duke de la Feuillade, and return into the Brescian, in order to command that Army which is to make head against Prince Eugene. The Fortifications of Venceil being entircity demolished, the Cannon which was in that Town is brought hither, and planted upon our Walls. The French are creating a great Magezine at Iviea, for the Security of which the Count d'Estain is posted with a Body of 4000 Men at a simil ditance beyond that Place, as Monneur Albergotti is on this side of it with another Body of French Troops.

Vanice, June 6. The Abbot of Pompone arrived here two days ago with the Courtacter of Ambailador from the French King, and is preparing for his publick Entry and Audience. The Electres of Bavaria went lately from hence as far as the Borders of Carinthia, intending to have returned to Munich; but the Court or Vienna not judging it adviseable to suffer her to come into Bavaria, there being Apprehensions at that time of an Insurection in favour of the Elector, she came back the 31st past to Maestro, a Village about 5 Leagues diffant from hence; and is since gone to Padaa, where she demands to continue some time. The Germans who were in Ganton at Minandola, and became Prisoners of War upon the Surrender of that Place, being about 400 Men, have larely been exchanged for a like number of French and Spanish Prisoners.
