SUPPLIES AND SERVICES (DEFENCE PURPOSES)
ACT, 1951.

The Minister of Transport and Civil Aviation hereby gives notice of his intention to make an Order under section 2 (1) of the Supplies and Services (Defence Purposes) Act, 1951, the effect of which will be to authorise the stopping up of the following two lengths of road, and two lengths of bridle road within the Royal Air Force Station, Wethersfield, in the Parishes of Toppesfield, Sible Hedingham and Finchingfield, in the Rural Districts of Halstead and Braintree, in the County of Essex:—

(1) That length of the Toppesfield—Wethersfield road which extends from a point approximately 90 yards north-west of its junction with the road leading from Hawkes Hall to Welcome Slough in a north-westerly direction for a distance of approximately 90 yards;

(2) That length of the road leading from Welcome Slough to Hawkes Hall which extends from a point approximately 1,690 yards south-west of its junction with the road leading from Bar Hall to Morris Green in a south-westerly direction for a distance of approximately 120 yards;

(3) That length of the bridle road leading from the Finchingfield—Toppesfield road to Gray's Lane which extends from a point approximately 1,050

yards south-east of its junction with the Finchingfield—Toppesfield road at Ost End in a south-easterly direction for a distance of approximately 120 yards;

(4) That length of the bridle road known as Gray's Lane which extends from a point approximately 1,510 yards north-west of its junction with the road from Wethersfield to Almshouses Green in a north-westerly direction for a distance of approximately 480 yards.

The Order will be made not less than 21 days after the publication of this notice, i.e., not before 25th March, 1958.

DESTRUCTIVE INSECTS AND PESTS ACTS.
1877 to 1927.

THE IMPORTATION OF NEW POTATOES AND RAW
VEGETABLES ORDER, 1958.

Notice is hereby given that the Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food has made an Order under the Destructive Insects and Pests Acts, 1877 to 1927, entitled the Importation of New Potatoes and Raw Vegetables Order, 1958.

The Order provides Colorado beetle safeguards alternative to those prescribed in Article 7 of the Importation of Plants Order, 1955 for the importation into England and Wales of new potatoes from France, Portugal, Spain and the Latium region of Italy, and certain raw vegetables from Belgium, France, Italy and the Netherlands during specified periods in 1958.
