WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 26th day of February, 1958, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for altering the boundaries of the parishes of Rawmarsh and Saint Thomas, Kilnhurst, both in the diocese of Sheffield.

"SCHEME.

"Whereas we are satisfied that it is desirable that the boundaries of the said parishes should be altered in the manner hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the Right Reverend Leslie, Bishop of Sheffield, consents to the proposed arrangements (in testimony whereof he has executed this Scheme):

"Now, therefore, we, the said Church Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme the boundaries of the said parishes of Rawmarsh and Saint Thomas, Kilnhurst, shall be altered in the manner described in the Schedule and delineated on the map annexed to this Scheme.

"THE SCHEDULE.

"The territory to be annexed to the parish of Rawmarsh:—

"All that part of the parish of Saint Thomas, Kilnhurst (coloured pink on the map annexed hereto), which is bounded upon the west and south by the parish of Rawmarsh and upon the remaining sides by an imaginary line commencing at a point on the boundary which divides the parish of Rawmarsh from the parish of Saint Thomas, Kilnhurst, in the middle of the railway line of British Railways, London Midland Region, and proceeding thence northeastwards along the middle of the said railway line to a point opposite the southeastern corner of close numbered 190 and continuing thence northwestwards across close numbered 184a to and along the southwestern boundaries of closes numbered 190 and 206 to the southern side of Kilnhurst Road and continuing thence northwestwards across Kilnhurst Road to the southwestern corner of close numbered 214 and continuing thence first northwestwards then northeastwards along the southwestern and northwestern boundaries of the last mentioned close to a point on the southwestern side of Warren Vale Colliery Tramway and continuing thence northeastwards across the said Tramway to and along the northwestern boundary of close numbered 228 and in a straight line in continuation thereof to a point in the middle of Collier Brook and continuing thence generally northwestwards along the middle of Collier Brook to the boundary which divides the parish of Saint Thomas, Kilnhurst, from the parish of Rawmarsh."

And whereas the provisions of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme, have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Sheffield.

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 17th day of December, 1957, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We, the Church Commissioners acting in pursuance of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, and the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which we have prepared with the consent of the Right Reverend William, Bishop of Manchester (in witness whereof he has signed the Scheme), for effecting the union of the benefice of Saint Philip, Bradford Road, Manchester, the benefice of Saint Mark, Holland Street, Newton Heath, and the benefice of Saint Jude, Ancoats, Manchester, all situate in the diocese of Manchester.

"SCHEME.

"1. *Union of Benefices.* The benefice of Saint Philip, Bradford Road, Manchester, the benefice of Saint Mark, Holland Street, Newton Heath, and the benefice of Saint Jude, Ancoats, Manchester, shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Saint Philip with Saint Mark, Manchester', and the parishes of the said benefices shall also be united into one parish for ecclesiastical purposes.

"2. *Taking effect of union.* Upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette the Union shall forthwith take effect and the Reverend James Barnes if he is then incumbent of the said benefice of Saint Philip, Bradford Road, Manchester, shall with his consent (which has been given to us in writing), be the first incumbent of the united benefice.

"3. *Parish Church.* The parish church of the parish of Saint Philip, Bradford Road, Manchester, shall be the parish church of the united parish.

"4. *Registers.* The marriage registers current at the churches of Saint Jude, Ancoats, Manchester, and Saint Mark, Holland Street, Newton Heath, shall be dealt with in accordance with Section 62 of the Marriage Act, 1949, and the register books of baptisms and burials (if any) and other the records and muniments deposited in the said churches shall be transferred to the Church of Saint Philip, Bradford Road, Manchester.

"5. *Parsonage House.* Upon the union taking effect the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Saint Philip, Bradford Road, Manchester, shall be the house of residence of the incumbent of the united benefice, and the parsonage houses belonging to the benefices of Saint Mark, Holland Street, Newton Heath, and Saint Jude, Ancoats, Manchester, and the sites and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall, as soon as conveniently may be, be sold and disposed of by us, at such time or times in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and the net proceeds of such sale or sales shall be placed to the credit of the Expenses Fund of the diocese of Manchester established pursuant to the said Union of Benefices Measures.

"6.—(1) *Taking down of church.* As soon as conveniently may be after the union has taken effect the Church of Saint Jude, Ancoats, Manchester, shall be taken down and the materials and site thereof together with any ground annexed thereto shall be sold by us, the said Church Commissioners.

"(2) The furnishings of the said church of Saint Jude, Ancoats, Manchester, or so much of them as the Bishop of Manchester shall select, shall be removed to such other churches or chapels within

the said diocese as the said Bishop may direct and any such furnishings not so transferred may, with the exception of the font communion table and plate used for the purposes of the Holy Communion, be sold and in such case the proceeds shall be placed to the credit of the said Expenses Fund of the diocese of Manchester.

"7. *Patronage.* With the consents (which have been given to us in writing) of:—

"(a) The Right Reverend William, Bishop of Manchester (who is hereinafter referred to as 'the Bishop' which expression shall include the Bishop of Manchester for the time being in his corporate capacity) being the patron of the said benefice of Saint Mark, Holland Street, Newton Heath,

"(b) The said Bishop and the Reverend Canon Howard Frank Woolnough being the patrons of the said benefice of Saint Jude, Ancoats, Manchester, and

"(c) Robert Bythell Barclay, Peter William Gaddum, Colin Marshall Skinner, the Honourable Sir Lancelot William Joynson-Hicks, Baronet, and Phyllis Joan Gaddum, Spinster, being the present patrons of the benefice of Saint Philip, Bradford Road, Manchester (who are hereinafter referred to as 'the Trustees' which expression shall include the persons who are for the time being appointed trustees in pursuance of the Order in Council dated the 9th day of March, 1850, relating to the said benefice of Saint Philip, Bradford Road, Manchester)

the patronage of the said benefice of Saint Jude, Ancoats, Manchester shall be surrendered to the Bishop as the patron of the benefice of Saint Mark, Holland Street, Newton Heath, and the Trustees and thereafter the patronage of the united benefice shall be exercised jointly by the Bishop and the Trustees."

And whereas the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, the Union of Benefices Rules, 1926 and 1930, and the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme have been duly complied with:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of her said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that it shall be and become effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette.

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, and the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which we have prepared with the consent of the Right Reverend Falkner, Bishop of Chelmsford (in witness whereof he has signed this Scheme), for effecting the union of the benefice of Belchamp Otten and the benefice of Bulmer with Belchamp Walter, both situate in the diocese of Chelmsford.

"SCHEME

"1. *Union of Benefices.* The benefice of Belchamp Otten and the benefice of Bulmer with Belchamp Walter shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Belchamp Otten with Belchamp Walter and Bulmer' but the parishes of the said benefices shall continue in all respects distinct.

"2. *Taking effect of union.* Upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the Reverend Gordon Thomas Beale, if he is then incumbent of the said benefices of Belchamp Otten and Bulmer with

Belchamp Walter shall, with his consent (testified by his signature hereto) be the first incumbent of the united benefice and his admission thereto shall be without any form of, or fee for, presentation or nomination and he shall not be required to pay any fees in respect of his collation, institution, licence or induction to the united benefice beyond such fees as he would have been liable to pay if his admission to the united benefice had been an admission solely to the benefice of Belchamp Otten.

"3. *Parsonage House.* Upon the union taking effect and pending the provision of a new house approved by us as suitable to be the house of residence for the incumbent of the united benefice the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Belchamp Otten shall be the house of residence of the incumbent of the united benefice.

"4. *Patronage.* In every series of three successive turns of presentation to be made to the united benefice after the union has taken effect, the patron of the benefice of Bulmer with Belchamp Walter shall have the first and third turns and the patron of the benefice of Belchamp Otten shall have the second turn."

"And whereas it has been represented to us and it appears to us that the name of the parish of Saint Antholin, Nunhead, should be altered as hereinafter recommended and proposed:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Church Commissioners; with the consent of the Right Reverend Bertram, Bishop of Southwark, (in testimony whereof he has executed this Scheme) and with the consent of the parochial church council of the said parish (in testimony whereof this Scheme is signed by the Chairman of and two other members present at a meeting of the same council duly convened for the purpose of giving such consent) humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty in Council that as from the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme the name of the said parish shall be altered to 'The Parish of Saint Antony, Nunhead.'"

(c) if not qualified under sub-paragraph (a) or sub-paragraph (b) of this paragraph, he must satisfy the Commissioners that he is so closely connected with a country or territory within the Commonwealth either by ancestry, upbringing or residence, or by reason of national service, that an exception may properly be made in his favour.

4. *Qualifications.*

Candidates must have served an apprenticeship or have had equivalent training with a reputable firm of automobile engineers, or a public transport authority. They must also have had a minimum of three years' practical experience in similar work as skilled motor mechanics. Equivalent training and experience in the Armed Forces will be accepted for consideration. Candidates should have good practical experience of the construction and repair of chassis and bodies of both goods and public service vehicles, and have experience in driving such vehicles. They should have a comprehensive and detailed knowledge of the Highway Code. REGULATIONS FOR RECRUITMENT TO BASIC GRADES OF MECHANICAL AND ELECTRICAL ENGINEERS, GENERAL SERVICE CLASS AND DEPARTMENTAL VARIANT CLASSES.

1. Both men and women may compete under these regulations except that women will not be eligible for appointments under the Admiralty, the War Department, or the Post Office.

2. Age.

(i) For General Service Class posts. Candidates must be at least 25 and under 35 years of age on 1st March, 1958.

(ii) For the Post Office Departmental posts. Candidates must be at least 21 and under 35 years of age on 1st March, 1958.

(iii) For the Ministry of Supply and Ministry of Transport and Civil Aviation (Civil Aviation Organisation) Departmental posts. Candidates must be at least 23 and under 35 years of age on 1st March, 1958.

But for all posts

(1) a candidate who has served or is serving on a regular (including a regular short-service) engagement in H.M. Forces or in H.M. Overseas Civil Service may deduct from his actual age the period of such service rendered before 1st March, 1958;

(2) candidates who have served in any established post to which they were admitted with the Certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners, or who have served on established conditions except for sick leave and pension in a post to which such a certificate would normally apply, may deduct from their actual age any time not exceeding two years which they have spent in such service before 1st March, 1958.

(c) if not qualified under sub-paragraph (a) or sub-paragraph (b) of this paragraph, he must satisfy the Commissioners that he is so closely connected with a country or territory within the Commonwealth either by ancestry, upbringing or residence, or by reason of national service, that an exception may properly be made in his favour.

(2) A candidate will not be eligible for appointment to a situation in the Admiralty, War Department, or Ministry of Supply unless (i) at all times since his birth he has been either a British subject or a citizen of the Irish Republic and (ii) he was born in a country or territory which is (or then was) within the Commonwealth or in the Irish Republic and (iii) each of his parents was born in a country or territory which is (or then was) within the Commonwealth or in the Irish Republic and is or was at death a British subject or a citizen of the Irish Republic and has or had been one or the other at all times from birth:

Provided that, notwithstanding that the aforesaid conditions are not satisfied, he may, if the conditions specified in paragraph (1) of this Regulation are satisfied, be admitted to appointment by special permission of the First Lord of the Admiralty, the Secretary of State for War or the Minister of Supply.

(3) A candidate will not be eligible for appointment to a situation in the Government Communications Headquarters unless at all times since his birth he has been either a British subject or a citizen of the Irish Republic and was born of parents each of whom is or was at death a British subject or a citizen of the Irish Republic and has or had been one or the other at all times since birth:

Provided that, notwithstanding that the aforesaid conditions are not satisfied, he may, by special permission of the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, be admitted to appointment if he satisfies the requirement of (1) above.

4. Qualifications.

Candidates who expect to qualify under this Regulation in the first half of 1958, but do not know their results when they apply, will be admitted to the Competition but will not be appointed unless they satisfy the Regulation within that period.

All candidates should possess professional ability. (ii) In addition candidates must have had adequate practical training and experience in work related to that of the Department(s) for which they are applying. Normally candidates are required to have served a regular apprenticeship or period of post-graduate training and in addition to have had at least two years' practical experience with an engineering concern of sufficient size and scope for them to have gained experience both of mechanical and electrical engineering together with more specialised knowledge in some particular branch (each candidate's record will be considered on its merits in relation to the vacancies available).

Training under (A) (i) must normally include an engineering apprenticeship or pupillage with a minimum period of two years in the workshops of an establishment of good standing, including preferably some training in management, but full apprenticeship will not be insisted upon where a candidate has already achieved Corporate Membership of one of the approved Institutions or Associate Fellowship of the Royal Aeronautical Society.

(ii) Ministry of Transport and Civil Aviation—
(Civil Aviation Organisation).

(a) Every candidate must

(i) have achieved Corporate Membership of the Institution of Electrical Engineers or Associate Fellowship of the Royal Aeronautical Society; or

(ii) have passed either Parts I, II and III of the Associate Membership examination of the Institution of Electrical Engineers or Parts I and II of the Associate Fellowship examination of the Royal Aeronautical Society, or examinations recognised by one of these institutions as giving exemption from their examinations; provided that Corporate Membership or Associate Fellowship is attained within the period of probation (or the corresponding period of trial), but exception may be made in special circumstances provided for in Regulation 4 (A) (i) (b) above; or

(iii) hold a first or second class honours degree in Physics or Engineering.

(b) In addition all candidates must produce evidence that both the examination subjects included in their qualifications and their practical experience justify their employment on civil aviation telecommunications duties.

(c) Exceptionally the Commissioners may, at their discretion, admit candidates otherwise qualified by evidence of very high professional attainment.

(iii) Post Office.

Candidates must normally possess a degree in Mechanical or Electrical Engineering or in Physics, or Diploma of Technology, but exceptionally the Commissioners may accept any other candidate qualified under Regulation 4 (A) above.

5. Competition.

Those candidates who on the evidence of their application forms, and any further information which

the Commissioners think necessary to obtain, are found to be *prima facie* eligible, will be summoned to a Selection Board. The Commissioners may, if they see fit, summon only those candidates who by reason of their experience and qualifications appear to be most suitable for appointment. The same Selection Board may consider a candidate at one interview for one or more of the classes. The Selection Board will take into consideration the candidates' record of experience and training, any recommendation from persons named by the candidates as having direct knowledge of their work in the past, and the personal qualities of the candidates as shown at the interview.
