

southwest by the parish of Yardley and upon the remaining sides by an imaginary line commencing at a point on the boundary which divides the parish of Yardley from the parish of Castle Bromwich in the middle of Cole Hall Lane opposite to the middle of the River Cole and proceeding thence first generally northwards along the middle of Cole Hall Lane and Buckland End and then eastwards along the middle of Heath Way to a point opposite to the middle of the southwestern end of Cat Lane and continuing thence first generally northeastwards to and along the middle of the last mentioned Lane and then northwards along the middle of School Lane to a point opposite to the northwestern end of the southwestern boundary of the property known as Number 18 School Lane, and continuing thence southeastwards to and along the last mentioned boundary and northeastwards along the southeastern boundary of the last mentioned property and in continuation thereof to the City of Birmingham boundary and continuing thence eastwards along

the last mentioned boundary to the boundary which divides the parish of Castle Bromwich from the parish of Saint Barnabas, Kingshurst."

And whereas the provisions of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme, have been duly complied with:

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 7th day of March, 1958, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Church Commissioners, in pursuance of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners (Exchange of Patronage) Act, 1853, and of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners Act, 1860, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for effecting an exchange of a one-third interest in the patronage of the benefice of Stoke Ferry with Wretton and the alternate right of the patronage of the benefice of Offord D'Arcy with Offord Cluny (now vested in the Bishop of Ely in right of his See) for the alternate rights of the patronage of the benefices of Fincham, Saint Mary and All Saints, Barton Bendish and Saint Andrew, Barton and Saint Mary, Beechamwell with Saint John, Beechamwell and All Saints Beechamwell with Shingham (now vested in Your Majesty, Your Heirs and Successors, and exercised on behalf of Your Majesty by the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain for the time being) all of which said benefices

are situated in the diocese of Ely and we do hereby certify that we have made due inquiry into the respective circumstances and present values of the said benefices and that they are as set forth in the Schedule to the said Scheme.

"SCHEME.

"With the consent of the Right Reverend Noel, Bishop of Ely, and of the Right Honourable David Patrick Maxwell, Viscount Kilmuir, now Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain (in testimony whereof they have executed this Scheme) the said one-third interest in the right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Stoke Ferry with Wretton and the said alternate right of patronage and presentation to the said benefice of Offord D'Arcy with Offord Cluny shall be transferred to Your Majesty, Your Heirs and Successors and be exercisable by the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain for the time being on behalf of Your Majesty and in exchange for the same the said alternate rights of patronage of and presentation to the said benefices of Fincham, Saint Mary and All Saints, Barton Bendish and Saint Andrew, Barton and Saint Mary, Beechamwell with Saint John, Beechamwell and All Saints, Beechamwell with Shingham shall be transferred to and be exercisable by the said Noel as Bishop of Ely, and his successors in the same See.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England on Friday, the 18th April, 1958, at 1 p.m. for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the National Loans Act, 1939, to the amount of £240,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000 or £100,000. They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Monday the 21st April, 1958, to Saturday, the 26th April, 1958, inclusive, and will be due 91 days after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000 and must specify the date on which
