THE COUNTY BOROUGH OF READING (TRAFFIC REGULATION) (No. 1) ORDER, 1956, AMENDMENT ORDER, 1958.

ON the 2nd day of April, 1958, the Council of the County Borough of Reading made an Order under the Road Traffic Act, 1930, as amended, the effect of which is to amend as from the 19th May, 1958, the County Borough of Reading (Traffic Regulation) (No. 1) Order, 1956, so as to provide—
No waiting in—

(a) Minster Street between its junction with King Street and a point 8 yards west of its junction with Yield Hall Lane.

(b) Oxford Road, on the south side, between a point 56 yards west of its junction with Cork Street to a point 49 yards west of that point.

(c) Greyfriars Road, the east side, between its junction with Friar Street and a point 33 yards north of that junction and the west side between its junction with Friar Street and its junction with Sackville Street.

(d) Market Place (Saturdays only), south side; east side from its junction with High Street to a point 43 yards north of that junction and the west side from its junction with Butter Market to a point 49 yards north-east of that junction.

THE COUNTY OF WARWICK (MARKET STREET AND CHURCH STREET, ATHERSTONE) (PROHIBITION OF WAITING) ORDER.

NOTICE is hereby given that the Warwickshire County Council propose to make an Order under the Road Traffic Act, 1930, as amended, the effect of which will be to prohibit the waiting of vehicles on the undermentioned lengths of road:—

(1) Market Street, Atherstone, from its junction with Long Street to the Market Place, a distance of 52 yards;

(2) Church Street, Atherstone, from its junction with Long Street to the Market Place, a distance of 50 yards.

Exceptions are provided in the Order to enable a vehicle to wait for so long as may be necessary for a person to board or alight therefrom or for goods to be loaded or unloaded, and to enable, if necessary, a vehicle to be used in connection with any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of either of the said lengths of road, or the laying, erection, alteration or repair, in or near to either of the said lengths of road, of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity, or any telegraph line as defined in the Telegraph Act, 1878.

BOROUGH OF ROYAL TUNBRIDGE WELLS.**THE BOROUGH OF ROYAL TUNBRIDGE WELLS (HANOVER ROAD) (TRAFFIC REGULATION) ORDER, 1958.**
