PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 27th day of March, 1958, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, have prepared and humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for (1) altering the boundaries of the parishes of Saint Peter, Bentley and Arksey and (2) constituting a new parish to be taken out of the parishes of Saint Peter, Bentley and All Saints, Arksey; all in the diocese of Sheffield.

"SCHEME.

"Whereas we, the Church Commissioners, are satisfied that it is desirable (1) that the boundaries of the parishes of Saint Peter, Bentley and Arksey, should be altered in the manner described in Part I of the sub-joined Schedule and delineated on the map hereto annexed, and (2) that the spiritual interests of the area defined in Part II of the said Schedule and delineated on the said map would be best served by constituting it a new parish:

"And whereas we are satisfied that a suitable endowment therefor will be provided:

"And whereas there is no consecrated church within the area described in Part II of the said Schedule and the church of Saint Philip and Saint James, New Bentley, therein has been approved by us, the said Church Commissioners, as suitable to be the parish church of the new parish and is intended to be consecrated:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Leslie, Bishop of Sheffield (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and affixed his episcopal seal to this Scheme), we, the said Church Commissioners, do humbly recommend and propose as follows, that is to say:—

"1. As from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council confirming this Scheme, the boundaries of the said parishes of Saint Peter, Bentley and Arksey, shall be altered in the manner described in Part I of the sub-joined Schedule and delineated on the map hereto annexed.

"(2) (a) As from the date of the licence thereto of a Minister the area defined in the sub-joined Schedule and delineated on the map hereto annexed shall be a separate district for spiritual purposes until the consecration of the church of Saint Philip and Saint James, New Bentley, therein situated.

"(b) As from the date of the consecration of the said church the area shall become a new parish.

"(c) The name of the district (or parish as the case may be) shall be 'The District (or Parish) of Saint Philip and Saint James, New Bentley'.

"3. Archdeaconry and Rural Deanery.

"The said district and parish shall be in the Archdeaconry of Doncaster and in the rural deanery of Doncaster.

"THE SCHEDULE.

"Part I.

"The territory to be annexed to the parish of Arksey:—

"All that part (coloured green on the map hereto annexed) of the parish of Saint Peter, Bentley, which lies to the east of the Bentley Colliery Branch Line of British Railways (North Eastern Region) and the Gowdall and Braithwell Branch Line of British Railways (North Eastern Region).

"Part II.

"The area comprising:—

"All those contiguous parts (together coloured pink on the map annexed hereto) of the parishes of Saint Peter, Bentley, and Arksey which are bounded on the north by the parishes of Arksey and Owston, on the west by the parish of Adwick le Street and on the remaining sides by an imaginary line commencing at the point on the boundary between the parish of Saint Peter, Bentley, and the parish of Adwick le Street where the Adwick le Street and Saint Peter, Bentley, with Arksey urban district boundary turns south from the middle of Mill Dike and proceeding thence southeasterly along the middle of the last mentioned Dike to the middle of the High Street which crosses the said Mill Dike and continuing thence in a straight line northeasterly to the middle of the south western end of Arksey Lane and thence generally northeasterly along the middle of Arksey Lane (thereby following in part the boundary between the parishes of Saint Peter, Bentley, and Arksey) to the point in the middle of the bridge which carries Arksey Lane across the main line of British Railways (North Eastern Region) and thence northwards along the middle of the last mentioned railway line to the point where it meets the railway line which leads northwestwards and westwards to Bentley Colliery and thence northwestwards and westwards along the middle of the last mentioned railway line to its junction with Bentley Colliery Branch Line of British Railways (North Eastern Region) and thence generally northwards and northeasterly along the middle of the last mentioned railway line and the Gowdall and Braithwell Branch Line of British Railways (North Eastern Region) to the middle of the Smallholme and Tilts Drain and thence generally westwards along the middle of the last mentioned Drain to the boundary which divides the parish of Arksey from the parish of Saint Peter, Bentley."

"And whereas the provisions of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme, have been duly complied with:

"And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Sheffield.

#### PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 27th day of March, 1958, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, and the Diocesan Stipends Funds Measure, 1953, now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which we have prepared with the consent of the Right Reverend Tom, Bishop of Hereford (in witness whereof he has signed this Scheme), for effecting the union of the benefice of Bridstow and the benefice of Peterstow, both situate in the diocese of Hereford.

#### "SCHEME.

"1. *Union of Benefices.* The benefice of Bridstow and the benefice of Peterstow shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Bridstow with Peterstow', but the parishes of the said benefices shall continue in all respects distinct.

"2. *Taking effect of union.*

"(a) If upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette the benefices of Bridstow and Peterstow shall both be vacant, the union shall forthwith take effect.

"(b) If upon that day one only of the said two benefices shall be vacant, the union shall take effect immediately upon the next avoidance of the other of the said two benefices.

"(c) If upon that day neither of the said two benefices shall be vacant, the union shall take effect immediately upon the first avoidance of that one of the two benefices which shall last be avoided after that date.

"3. *Parsonage house.* Upon the union taking effect and pending the provision of a new house approved by us, the Church Commissioners, as suitable to be the house of residence for the incumbent of the united benefice the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Bridstow shall, if at that date it so belongs, be the house of residence of the incumbent of the united benefice.

"4. *Patronage.* In every series of three successive turns of presentation to be made to the united benefice after the union has taken effect, the patron of the benefice of Peterstow shall have the first turn and the patron of the benefice of Bridstow shall have the second and third turns.

"5. *Diversion of Endowment Income.*

"(1) Subject as hereinafter provided any surplus, calculated by us for the twelve months ending on the 31st March in each year of the endowment income (calculated in accordance with the Schedule hereto) of the united benefice over and above an annual sum of £700 shall, with effect from the date upon which the union shall take effect, be paid to and be held by us, for the benefit of the diocesan stipends fund of the diocese of Hereford.

"(2) The said endowment income and the said surplus and the said annual sum of £700 shall be deemed to accrue from day to day and shall when we deem that circumstances so require be apportionable accordingly.

"(3) Any moneys due to us from the incumbent of the united benefice, or, during any vacancy

in the united benefice, from the sequestrators thereof, as the case may be (hereinafter called 'the incumbent or sequestrators') upon the calculation of the said surplus shall be paid by the incumbent or sequestrators to us not later than the 30th June in each year and shall be recoverable as a debt due to us.

"(4) For the purpose of ascertaining the amounts of the said endowment income and of the said surplus, we shall have power to require production by the incumbent or sequestrators of accounts and other documents in relation thereto, and the said accounts for the twelve months to 31st March in each year (or where applicable for a part of the year ending on that date) shall be rendered annually to us within six weeks of that date in such form as we shall prescribe; and in the event of failure by the incumbent or sequestrators to produce such accounts or documents we shall have all legal remedies for enforcing production thereof.

#### "SCHEDULE.

"For the purpose of this Scheme the endowment income of the united benefice shall without prejudice to the power of decision vested in us by virtue of Section 18 of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, if any question shall arise, be computed in accordance with our Central Register of Benefice Income, that is to say, by including:—

"(1) all gross secured income payable by us and any other person or body,

"and (2) all gross income received from ground rents, chief rents or other fixed charges, other glebe rents and any letting of the parsonage house or a formally divided portion thereof,

"and by deducting therefrom:—

"(1) the rates payable on the parsonage house if occupied by the incumbent,

"(2) the rent and rates payable on any house occupied by the incumbent other than the parsonage house,

"(3) the annual assessment charged upon the incumbent under the Ecclesiastical Dilapidations Measures, 1923 to 1951, in respect of the benefice,

"(4) the rates payable on the glebe,

"(5) the cost of collecting glebe rents,

"(6) any tithe annuity, rentcharge or fee farm rent charged upon the glebe,

"(7) any other outgoings in respect of the glebe,

"(8) any charge upon the benefice income in favour of another benefice or any lay person,

"(9) any payment to a curate or lay worker out of the benefice income,

"(10) the annual payments in respect of capital and interest in respect of any mortgage of the benefice income,

"(11) any part of the benefice income diverted to the diocesan stipends fund pursuant to an Order under Section 12 of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949."

And Whereas the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, the Union of Benefices Rules, 1926 and 1930, and the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme have been duly complied with:

And Whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that it shall be and become effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette.

While H.M.S. LOCH LOMOND was steaming on 19th September, 1957, the hose to number three sprayer in number two boiler room burst. The fuel pressure was 220 lbs. per square inch and a large area was immediately sprayed with oil fuel at a temperature of 200° Fahrenheit.

At grave risk to his own safety Petty Officer Engineering Mechanic Barlow, who was in charge of the boiler room, backed his way through the spray and sheet of hot oil and, although extensively burned, succeeded in shutting off the sprayer valve. By his brave action he undoubtedly saved the boiler room personnel from serious injury and the ship from a major fire.

**REGULATIONS FOR THE RECRUITMENT OF ASSISTANT COMMISSIONERS IN THE NATIONAL SAVINGS COMMITTEE.**

1. Both men and women may compete.
2. *Age.*  
Candidates must be at least 21 years of age on 1st March, 1958.  
There is no upper age limit, but in appointing persons in a permanent capacity Departments expect regular and effective service for a reasonable period, and the Commissioners will take this requirement into account.
3. *Nationality.*  
To be eligible for appointment a candidate must be a British subject, a British protected person or a citizen of the Irish Republic and in addition satisfy one of the following conditions:—

(a) if he was a British subject, a British protected person or a citizen of the Irish Republic at birth—

(i) at least one of his parents must be, or have been at death, a British subject, a British protected person or a citizen of the Irish Republic, or

(ii) the candidate must have resided in a country or territory within the Commonwealth or in the Irish Republic or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown or partly have so resided and partly been so employed for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of his appointment:

(b) if he was not a British subject, a British protected person or a citizen of the Irish Republic at birth, he must have resided in a country or territory within the Commonwealth or in the Irish Republic or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown or partly have so resided and partly been so employed for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of his appointment:

(c) if not qualified under sub-paragraph (a) or sub-paragraph (b) of this paragraph, he must satisfy the Commissioners that he is so closely connected with a country or territory within the Commonwealth either by ancestry, upbringing or residence, or by reason of national service, that an exception may properly be made in his favour.

4. *Qualifications.*

Candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners that they have received a systematic education and have had experience that fits them for the post. A University education and a knowledge of economics are desirable. Experience of public speaking, the control of office staff, and the organisation of voluntary workers will be advantages.

5. *Competition.*

Those candidates who appear from their application forms to have the best qualifications will be invited to interview before a Selection Board. The Board will take into account each candidate's record of experience and education, his personal qualities as shown at interview, and any reports from persons named by him as having had direct knowledge of his work, and will recommend to the Commissioners the candidates considered most suitable for appointment.

6. *Health and Character.*

Successful candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners on health and character.

7. *Candidates trained as Teachers.*

Candidates who have been trained as teachers in Northern Ireland or in the Irish Republic, and upon whose training public money has been spent, cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate education authority has been notified to the Commissioners.

8. *Refund of Marriage Gratuity.*

Married women who have formerly been established civil servants and have drawn marriage gratuity (other than those who resigned compulsorily on marriage and whose resignation took effect before 15th October, 1946, or who are widowed or divorced, or who are separated from their husbands,

or whose husbands suffer without hope of recovery from total physical or mental incapacity) will not be eligible unless they undertake to refund on appointment the marriage gratuity paid. Provided that this undertaking will not be required if the break between the first period of service (including any period of unestablished service immediately following the period in respect of which the gratuity was paid) and the date of re-establishment is more than seven years.

9. *Canvassing.*

Any attempt on the part of candidates to enlist support for their applications through Members of Parliament or other influential persons (except as referees to be named by them in their application form) will disqualify them for appointment. The Selection Board will disregard recommendations from persons who are not personally acquainted with the candidate's work.

10. *Fee.*

A successful candidate will be required to pay a fee of £4 before the issue of a certificate of qualification for appointment.

**REGULATIONS FOR THE RECRUITMENT TO THE EXECUTIVE CLASS (GENERAL AND DEPARTMENTAL EXECUTIVE CLASSES AND GRADE 5 POSTS IN BRANCH B OF THE FOREIGN SERVICE) THROUGH THE GENERAL CERTIFICATE OF EDUCATION, 1958.**

1. The competition is open to men and women, but

(i) women will not ordinarily be appointed to posts in the Admiralty or War Office or to the Immigration Service of the Home Office;

(ii) married women are not eligible for appointment to Branch B of the Foreign Service, and the approval of the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs is required before a married man can take up appointment in this Service.

2. *Age.*

Candidates must be at least 17½ and under 19 years of age on 1st September, 1958.

3. *Nationality.*

(1) To be eligible for appointment (other than to a situation in the Foreign Service) a candidate must be a British subject, a British protected person or a citizen of the Irish Republic and in addition satisfy one of the following conditions:—

(a) if he was a British subject, a British protected person or a citizen of the Irish Republic at birth—

(i) at least one of his parents must be, or have been at death, a British subject, a British protected person or a citizen of the Irish Republic, or

(ii) the candidate must have resided in a country or territory within the Commonwealth or in the Irish Republic or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown or partly have so resided and partly been so employed for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of his appointment;

(b) if he was not a British subject, a British protected person or a citizen of the Irish Republic at birth, he must have resided in a country or territory within the Commonwealth or in the Irish Republic or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown or partly have so resided and partly been so employed for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of his appointment:

(c) if not qualified under sub-paragraph (a) or sub-paragraph (b) of this paragraph, he must satisfy the Commissioners that he is so closely connected with a country or territory within the Commonwealth either by ancestry, upbringing or residence, or by reason of national service, that an exception may properly be made in his favour.

(2) A candidate will not be eligible for appointment to a situation in the Foreign Service unless at all times since his birth he has been either a British subject or a citizen of the Irish Republic and was

born of parents each of whom is or was at death a British subject or a citizen of the Irish Republic and has or had been one or the other at all times since birth:

Provided that, notwithstanding that the aforesaid conditions are not satisfied, he may, by special permission of the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, be admitted to appointment if—

(i) he has at all times since his birth been either a British subject or a citizen of the Irish Republic, and

(ii) his father is or was at death a British subject or a citizen of the Irish Republic and has or had been one or the other at all times from birth, and

(iii) he satisfies the Secretary of State that he is so closely connected with a country or territory within the Commonwealth either by ancestry, upbringing or residence, or by reason of national service, that an exception may properly be made in his favour.

#### 4. Education.

(i) Candidates (except those taking Scottish or Northern Ireland examinations) must have obtained, in not more than two examinations for the General Certificate of Education, passes in English Language and in four other distinct subjects accepted by the Commissioners, two of these must be at the Advanced level and obtained in the same examination. Candidates who wish to be considered for a Foreign Service post must have a pass at Advanced level in a language (classical or modern) other than English.

(ii) Candidates taking Scottish examinations must have obtained, in not more than two examinations for the Scottish Leaving Certificate or Scottish Universities Preliminary Examination, passes in English on the higher grade and in four other subjects accepted by the Commissioners, including two on the higher grade. Candidates who wish to be considered for a Foreign Service post must have a pass on the higher grade in a language (classical or modern) other than English.

(iii) Candidates educated in Northern Ireland may offer appropriate passes obtained in not more than two examinations for the Grammar School Senior Certificate of the Ministry of Education for Northern Ireland.

(iv) The subjects that will be accepted are those included under the following headings: English, classical and modern languages, history, politics, economics, geography, religious knowledge, mathematics, science, and engineering; the same subject may not be counted at both Ordinary and Advanced level.

(v) Certificates issued by examining bodies other than those mentioned below can in no circumstances be accepted.

#### 5. Selection.

The Commissioners will invite to interview before a Selection Board those candidates who appear, on the basis of their academic records as amplified by confidential reports from their schools, to be best qualified.

In placing candidates in order of merit and deciding which of them are successful in the competition, the Board will be guided by the standard of each candidate's performance in examinations for the General Certificate of Education (including Scholarship papers, where these have been taken), and by the Headmaster's or Headmistress's report. The candidate's standard of attainment in subjects other than those by which he qualifies under Regulation 4 will also be taken into account, and regard will be paid, where relevant, to the policy of his school on the taking of subjects in the General Certificate of Education examination. These factors will be considered in conjunction with the candidate's performance before the interview Board.

Of those successful candidates who have expressed a preference for the Foreign Service, the Commissioners will select a number of those highest in order of merit for a further competitive interview for appointment to a Foreign Service post. Candidates who, at this second interview, are not recommended for a Foreign Service post will remain successful for the Home Civil Service.

Even if there are unfilled vacancies, no candidate will be declared successful for either the Home Civil Service or the Foreign Service who does not reach a standard satisfactory to the Commissioners.

#### 6. Health and Character.

Successful candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners on health and character.

#### 7. Candidates Trained as Teachers.

Candidates who have been trained as teachers in Northern Ireland or in the Irish Republic, and upon whose training public money has been spent, cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate education authority has been notified to the Commissioners.

#### 8. Canvassing.

Any attempt on the part of candidates to enlist support for their applications through Members of Parliament or other influential persons, except as referees to be named by them in their application forms, will disqualify them for appointment.

#### 9. Fee.

A successful candidate must pay a fee of 15s. before the issue of a Certificate of Qualification for appointment.

#### 10. Assignment.

The Commissioners will decide to which Service or Department each successful candidate is to be assigned.

The wishes expressed by successful candidates at interview, or on the preference form which they will be asked to fill up, will so far as possible be taken into account; but assignments must be made so as to fill the vacancies notified to the Commissioners in accordance with the needs of the public service. A candidate who declines to accept the post offered will have no claim to be assigned to another, and will be regarded as having declined appointment.

11. The Commissioners' decision will be final in all matters concerning this competition.

The Civil Service Commissioners further give notice that an Open Competition will be held during 1958 under the above Regulations.

**ALKALI, &c. WORKS ORDER, 1958.****REGISTRATION UNDER THE ALKALI, &c. WORKS  
REGULATION ACT, 1906.**

With effect from 1st June, 1958, the Alkali, &c. Works Order, 1958, extends the list of works scheduled under the Alkali, &c. Works Regulation Act, 1906, by the addition of among others the classes of works set out in the schedule hereto.

From 1st June, no work of a class named in the order may, by virtue of section 9 of the Act, be carried on unless certified to be registered by the Minister of Housing and Local Government.

The term "works" refers to the operations or processes specified in the schedule and not necessarily to the whole of the premises in which they are carried on.

Application for registration should be made forthwith by letter addressed to the Secretary, Ministry of Housing and Local Government, Whitehall, London, S.W.1, marked "Alkali Act Registration." The following particulars should be stated:—

- (a) Description of each work requiring registration (e.g. steel works—Bessemer furnaces);
- (b) (i) Name, if any, of the premises at which the work is or will be carried on;
- (ii) Full postal address of the premises;
- (c) (i) Name of owner (i.e. the person carrying on the work);
- (ii) Business address of owner, if different from (b) (ii);
- (d) Name of local authority in whose area the premises are situated;
- (e) Date on which each work was erected.

The application should be made by or on behalf of the company or person actually carrying on the work.

Cheques or Money Orders in payment of the registration fee (£6) should *not* be forwarded until requested.

**SCHEDULE**

**Iron Works and Steel Works, that is to say, works in which—**

- (a) iron or ferro-alloys are produced in a blast furnace and in which raw materials for use in blast furnaces are handled or prepared; or
- (b) iron ores for use in blast furnaces are calcined or sintered; or
- (c) iron or steel is melted in Air or Rotary furnaces, fired by coal or oil, or in cupolas employing a heated air blast, or in electric arc furnaces; or

- (b) aluminium or aluminium alloys are recovered from aluminium or aluminium alloy scrap fabricated metal, swarf or residues by melting; or
- (c) aluminium is recovered from slag.

**Electricity Works, that is to say, works in which—**

- (a) solid or liquid fuel is burned to raise steam for the generation of electricity for distribution to the general public or for purposes of public transport; or
- (b) boilers having an aggregate maximum continuous rating of not less than 450,000 lbs. of steam per hour and normally fired by solid or liquid fuel are used to produce steam for the generation of electricity for purposes other than those mentioned in the preceding paragraph.

**Producer Gas Works, that is to say, works in which producer gas is made from coal and in which raw producer gas is transmitted or used.**

**Gas and Coke Works, that is to say, works (not being producer gas works) in which—**

- (a) coal, oil or mixtures of coal or oil with other carbonaceous materials are handled or prepared for carbonisation or gasification and in which these

materials are subsequently carbonised or gasified; or

- (b) water gas is produced or purified; or
- (c) coke or semi-coke is produced and quenched, cut, crushed or graded; or
- (d) gas, produced by the carbonisation or gasification of coal, oil or mixtures of coal or oil with other carbonaceous materials, is subjected to purification processes.

**Ceramic Works, that is to say, works in which—**

- (a) pottery products (including domestic earthenware and china, sanitary ware, electrical porcelain, glazed tiles and teapots) are made in intermittent kilns fired by coal or oil and raw materials used for the manufacture of pottery products are handled and prepared; or
- (b) heavy clay or refractory goods are fired by coal or oil in
- (i) intermittent kilns; or
- (ii) continuous grate-fired kilns; or
- (iii) any kiln in which a reducing atmosphere is essential.

**Lime Works, that is to say, works in which calcium carbonate of calcium magnesium carbonate is burnt through the agency of coal.**

**Sulphate Reduction Works, that is to say, works in which metallic sulphates are reduced to the corresponding sulphides by heating with carbonaceous matter.**

**Caustic Soda Works, that is to say, works in which either concentrated solutions of caustic soda or fused caustic soda are produced in vessels heated by coal.**

**Chemical Incineration Works, that is to say, works for the destruction by burning of wastes produced in the course of organic chemical reactions which occur during the manufacture of materials for the fabrication of plastics and fibres.**

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Shoeburyness Military Tramways (Extension) Order, 1958, and the Shoeburyness Military Tramways Order, 1893(d), the Shoeburyness Military Tramways Order (1893) Amendment Order, 1896(e), the Shoeburyness Military Tramways Order, 1904(f), and this Order may be

cited together as the Shoeburyness Military Tramways Orders, 1893 to 1958.

(2) This Order shall be construed as one with the Shoeburyness Military Tramways Order, 1893.

(3) This Order shall come into operation on the date of its confirmation in the manner prescribed by the Military Tramways Act, 1887.

2. In this Order—

"the deposited plan" and "the deposited section" mean respectively the plan and section deposited in respect of this Order with the Ministry of Transport and Civil Aviation and signed by an Assistant Secretary of that Ministry; and

"the principal Order" means the Shoeburyness Military Tramways Order, 1893, as amended by the Shoeburyness Military Tramways Order (1893) Amendment Order, 1896, as those Orders now have effect in consequence of the transfer to the Minister of Supply under the Ministry of Supply (Transfer of Powers) (No. 1) Order, 1939, of the rights of the Secretary of State for War in connection with the establishment at Shoeburyness for the purposes of which those Orders were made.

3.—(1) Subject to the provisions of this Order and of the principal Order as applied by this Order, the Minister of Supply may construct at Shoeburyness in the County Borough of Southend-on-Sea, on land which belongs to him or which he has the right to use, occupy and control, and across Blackgate Road at Shoeburyness aforesaid, and in the line and according to the levels shown on the deposited plan and the deposited section, the tramway hereinafter described with all works necessary or suitable to the use or working thereof, and may maintain, work and use the same.

(2) The tramway authorised by this Order is a tramway 372 yards in length commencing at a point (marked "A" on the deposited plan) on the tramway already constructed under the principal Order and running thence in a north-easterly direction to a point (marked "B" on the deposited plan) where it joins a tramway now in existence there.

(3) The provisions of the principal Order shall apply in respect of the tramway authorised by this Order as if it were a tramway authorised by the principal Order.
