INTERNATIONAL ORGANISATIONS (IMMUNITIES AND PRIVILEGES) ACT, 1950.

In pursuance of subsection (1) (c) of section 2 of the International Organisations (Immunities and Privileges) Act, 1950 (14 Geo. 6, Chapter 14), Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs hereby gives notice of the following amendments to the list published in the London Gazette of November 29, 1957, as amended by notices published on January 17, 1958, and February 21, 1958, of persons who are entitled to immunities and privileges conferred by the International Organisations (Immunities and Privileges of the North Atlantic Treaty Organisation) Order, 1954. EXTENSION TO THE FEDERATION OF RHODESIA AND NYASALAND OF THE UNITED KINGDOM DOUBLE TAXATION AGREEMENT WITH CANADA.

In an exchange of letters between the United Kingdom Government and the Canadian Government it has been agreed that the operation of the Agreement of the 5th June, 1946, between the Government of the United Kingdom and the Government of Canada for the Avoidance of Double Taxation and the Prevention of Fiscal Evasion with respect to taxes on Income (S.R. & O. 1946 No. 1885) shall extend to the Federation of Rhodesia and Nyasaland.

The date from which the extension will be effective in the Federation of Rhodesia and Nyasaland is 1st April, 1953. The taxes concerned in the constituent territories are the Income Tax, the Supertax, the Undistributed Profits Tax and the Territorial Surcharge.

In a separate exchange of letters between the United Kingdom Government and the Canadian Government it has been agreed that the extension of the Agreement to the Federation of Rhodesia and Nyasaland as a whole shall supersede the application of the Agreement to the territories of Nyasaland and Southern Rhodesia to which it was extended in 1951 and 1953 by Exchanges of Notes.
