

TRADING WITH THE ENEMY ACT, 1939, AND EMERGENCY LAWS (MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS) ACT, 1953, AND IN THE MATTER OF NIPPON YUSEN KABUSHIKI KAISYA.

An Order has been made by the Board of Trade releasing Mr. Duncan McKellar as Controller under the Order made on the 7th April, 1952, as varied by an Order dated 7th March, 1955, for the winding-up of Nippon Yusen Kabushiki Kaisya.

EXEMPTION FROM KEY INDUSTRY DUTY.

The Treasury have made an Order under section 10 (5) of the Finance Act, 1926, exempting the following articles from Key Industry Duty until 18th August, 1958:—

Scientific glassware, the following:—

Tubing of neutral glass, not being (1) glass with a content of more than 85 per cent. of silica and boric oxide together nor (2) glass of fused silica or fused quartz, in straight lengths having an external diameter of not less than 8 millimetres and not more than 35 millimetres and a wall thickness of not less than 0.3 millimetres and not more than 1.5 millimetres, and being capable of passing a test corresponding with the test for limit of alkalinity of glass prescribed by British Pharmacopoeia 1953.

Synthetic organic chemicals, analytical re-agents, other fine chemicals and chemicals manufactured by fermentation processes, the following:—

p-Aminobenzoic acid.
Androst-5-en-3 β -ol-17-one acetate.
mono-Chloroacetone.
OO-Dimethyl methylcarbamoylmethyl phosphorodithioate (a methyl ester).
p-Dioxan-2:3-dithiol di-*OO*-diethyl phosphorodithioate (an ethyl ester).
Diphenyl *o*-phthalate (a hydroxybenzene ester).
n-Dodecane-1-thiol.
Formamide.
Manganese ethylenebisdithiocarbamate (a salt of a substituted dithiocarbamic acid).
Methylhydroxyethylcellulose of which not less than 90 per cent. by weight passes a sieve having a nominal mesh number of 30 and of which not more than 20 per cent. by weight passes a sieve having a nominal mesh number of 72, both of which conform to British Standard 410:1943.
6-Methyl- α -ionone.
1:5-Pentamethylenetetrazole.
Sodium fluoride, which does not contain impurities equivalent to more than 5×10^{-3} grammes of U_3O_8 per gramme, and of which 1 gramme does not contain impurities capable of depressing the estimation of U_3O_8 by more than 1×10^{-3} grammes, when determined fluorimetrically.
Tolylene-2:5-diamine sulphate (a tolylene diamine salt).

The Order, which comes into operation on 7th May, 1958, is entitled the Safeguarding of Industries (Exemption) (No. 3) Order, 1958, and is published as Statutory Instruments, 1958, No. 734.
