## UNIVERSITIES OF OXFORD AND CAMBRIDGE ACT, 1923.

A Statute made by The Queen's College, in the University of Oxford, on the 10th May, 1958, has been submitted for the approval of Her Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923.

This day the Lords being met, a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons, by the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them that *The Lords authorised by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by Her Majesty, for declaring Her Royal Assent to the Acts agreed upon by both Houses to desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read, and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to:—*

- Land Drainage (Scotland) Act, 1958.
- Christmas Island Act, 1958.
- House of Commons (Redistribution of Seats) Act, 1958.
- Corporation of the Sons of the Clergy Charities Scheme Confirmation Act, 1958.
- Reading Almshouse and Municipal Charities Scheme Confirmation Act, 1958.
- Royal Institution of Great Britain Charity Scheme Confirmation Act, 1958.
- St. James's Dwellings Charity Scheme Confirmation Act, 1958.
- Port of London (Superannuation) Act, 1958.
- University of Leicester Act, 1958.
- Brazilian Traction Subsidiaries Act, 1958.
- Cammell Laird and Company Act, 1958.

### TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England on Friday, the 23rd May, 1958, at 1 p.m. for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the National Loans Act, 1939, to the amount of £260,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000 or £100,000. They will be dated

at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Tuesday, the 27th May, 1958, to Saturday, the 31st May, 1958, inclusive, and will be due 91 days after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000 and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. Notification will be sent by post on the same day as Tenders are received, to the persons whose Tenders are accepted in whole or in part, and payment in full of the amounts due in respect of such accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. (Saturday, 11.30 a.m.) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.
