The Lords' Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that they have made an Order under sections 1 and 2 of, and paragraph 1 of the Sixth Schedule to, the Import Duties Aot, 1958, viz.:-

The Import Duties (General) Order, 1958, which sets out a classification of goods for Customs purposes. The classification, which will apply from 1st January, 1959, is based on the internationally agreed Brussels Nomenclature prescribed by the Brussels Convention on Nomenclature for the Classification of Goods in Customs Tariffs condluded on 15th December, 1950 (Cmd. 8220) and the Protocol of Amendment to that Convention concluded on 1st July, 1955 (Cmd. 127).

The Order also imposes protective duties under

The Order also imposes protective duties under the Import Duties Act, 1958. With some exceptions these duties are the same as the duties imposed on similar goods under the pre-war enactments repealed by the Import Duties Act, 1958.

The Order does not impose revenue duties which will continue to be changeable under Finance Act provisions, or any duties changeable under the Customs Duties (Dumping and Subsidies) Act, 1957. Such duties do not, therefore, appear in the Schedule to this Order.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England on Friday, the 27th June, 1958, at 1 p.m. for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the National Loans Act, 1939, to the amount of £250,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000 or £100,000. They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 30th June, 1958, to Saturday, the 5th July, 1958, inclusive, and will be due 91 days after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000 and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates. dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. Notification will be sent by post on the same day as Tenders are received, to the persons whose Tenders are accepted in whole or in part, and payment in full of the amounts due in respect of such accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. (Saturday, 11.30 a.m.) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.
